



Takes Light Foot Traffic



Ajuga 'Chocolate Chip'
Bugleweed (Code: 4468)

Bright blue flower spikes top miniature chocolate colored foliage in spring. This marvelously-dense, vigorous, spreading groundcover is excellent in containers or rock gardens. (3" x 18") Zn4.



Ajuga reptans 'Burgundy Glow'
Bugleweed (Code: 2032)

In spring, blue flower spikes rise above a colorful low mat of burgundy-rose, white and green-variegated foliage. An eye-catching selection! (6" x 24") Zn4.



Anacyclus depressus 'Silver Kisses'
Mt. Atlas Daisy (Code: 2076)

Gray, filigreed leaves form a prostrate mat. Pretty white daisies with maroon reverse sides appear in abundance May to August. An excellent groundcover or rockery specimen. (4" x 8-10") Zn6.



Chamaemelum nobile
Roman Chamomile (Code: 8043)

Yellow-centered white daisies adorn creeping stems of evergreen foliage, making it an aromatic groundcover. Mow before seeds set to maintain as a lawn. Also used as a medicinal tea or yellow dye. (2-8" x 18-24") Zn4.



Chamaemelum nobile 'Treneague'
Roman Chamomile (Code: 3786)

Dense green foliage on this non-flowering chamomile makes a nice lawn, path or carpeting around garden seats. Aromatic when walked upon. (2-8" x 18-24") Zn4.



Laurentia fluviatilis
Blue Star Creeper (Code: 3007)

This popular groundcover is covered with tiny blue, star-shaped flowers May to September. It handles foot traffic well and is excellent between pavers or as a lawn substitute. (12" x 16") Zn5.



Leptinella squalida
Brass Buttons (Code: 2450)

Small, bronze-green, feathery foliage is great between stepping stones. This very tight, low-growing evergreen groundcover is exceptional! (1" x 24") Zn6.



Ajuga reptans 'Black Scallop'
Bugleweed (Code: 3940)

Very attractive jet-black scalloped leaves are covered with deep violet-blue flower spikes in spring. The foliage color intensifies in cold and full sun. (3-6" x 30-36") Zn3. PPI15815 Propagation Prohibited.



Ajuga reptans 'Catlin's Giant'
Bugleweed (Code: 5166)

Unusual large-growing Ajuga with dramatic thick foliage and tall blue flower spikes. The leaves grow even larger with rich soil. It's stunning planted en masse, as border edging, or over bulbs. (9" x 36") Zn3.



Carex subfuscata
Rusty Sedge (Code: 7419)

This native western US sedge is found everywhere from the sea to the desert. Low growing with narrow, upright, dark green leaves, it spreads to form a low maintenance lawn or groundcover. Easy to grow in almost any situation. (4-10" x 18-36") Zn5.




Chamaemelum nobile 'Flore Pleno'
Double-Flowered Roman Chamomile (Code: 8044)

Aromatic white, double, flowering herb makes a long-blooming groundcover. Mow while flowers are fresh to maintain as a lawn. Blooms can be used for teas. (2-8" x 18-24") Zn4.



Cymbalaria aequitriloba
Kenilworth Ivy (Code: 3035)

Pretty soft blue snapdragon-like flowers cover this dainty groundcover in spring and summer. It forms a completely prostrate mat that makes a nice addition to any shady woodland garden. (1" x 6") Zn6.



Leptinella sutheyi
Brass Buttons (Code: 6759)

The green fern-like leaves are larger than other Leptinella species. Some of the leaves may also be bronze or have a bronze edge. A good choice for the rock garden, alpine trough, or between flagstones. (1-3" x 6-8") Zn7.



Leptinella squalida 'Platt's Black'
Brass Buttons (Code: 4562)

This groundcover features tiny, nearly-black, "fernny" leaves. Versatile and tough, it can be used between pavers, in the rockery or as a lawn substitute. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (1" x 24") Zn5.

Lysimachia nummularia
Creeping Jenny (Code: 3085)

Ruffled, round green leaves and bright yellow flowers adorn this trailing plant. Great for hanging baskets, containers or groundcover. It prefers moist soil. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Lysimachia nummularia 'Aurea'
Creeping Jenny (Code: 3084)

Brilliant golden leaves and bright yellow flowers adorn this trailing plant. Great for hanging baskets, containers or as a groundcover. It prefers moist soil. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Mazus radicans 'Albiflorus'
Swamp Musk (Code: 5346)

This groundcover forms a dense, flat carpet of bright green. White flowers with a creamy-yellow throat, give brightness and color in spring and summer. (2-4" x 24-36") Zn5.



Mazus reptans
Creeping Mazus (Code: 5523)

Lavender flowers speckled with yellow top a bright green foliage mat. An excellent accent for the rockery, between pavers, or borders. Spreads quickly. (2" x 24") Zn5.



Mentha pulegium
Dwarf Pennyroyal (Code: 8150)

Fresh green foliage forms a dense, weed-proof mat. Highly recommended as a groundcover in large, shady areas where mowing is difficult. It is also a natural mosquito and flea repellent. (Restricted in some areas) (6-12" x 18") Zn7.



Mentha requienii
Corsican Mint (Code: 8122)

Tiny bright green leaves tightly hug the ground, and bear light foot traffic well. Leaves emit a fresh, minty fragrance when crushed, making it perfect between pavers. (Restricted in some areas) (12" x 12") Zn6.



Pratia angulata 'Treadwellii'
White Star Creeper (Code: 4375)

Large white, starry flowers top this very flat creeper. Dark green, spreading foliage forms a dense mat that is excellent between pavers. (2" x 12") Zn7.



Pratia pedunculata 'Celestial Spice'
Blue Star Creeper (Code: 4755)

Deepest violet-blue, starry flowers cover a dark green, spreading foliage mat, June to August. It takes some foot traffic and looks great between stepping stones. (3" x 12") Zn7.



Pratia pedunculata 'County Park'
Blue Star Creeper (Code: 6772)

Vivid azure-blue flowers cover a dark green, spreading mat of foliage. It's excellent used around stepping stones and pavers, or as edging. (3-4" x 12") Zn7.



Sagina subulata
Irish Moss (Code: 2985)

The moss-like, dense green mat of foliage is occasionally covered with tiny white flowers. Excellent for use between pavers, in rockeries or as an evergreen groundcover. It needs regular moisture and good drainage. (1-2" x 12") Zn4.



Sagina subulata 'Aurea'
Scotch Moss (Code: 3463)

The moss-like, evergreen, golden mat of foliage is occasionally covered with tiny white flowers. Excellent between pavers, in rockeries and the shade garden. It needs regular moisture and good drainage. (1-2" x 12") Zn4.



Soleirolia soleirolii
Baby Tears (Code: 3563)

Tiny bright green leaves and white flowers make this an excellent groundcover. Use between pavers and in shady areas. Tender, but if often comes back from the roots. (1" x 12") Zn8.



Thymus 'Gold Transparent'
Creeping Thyme (Code: 3603)

Shimmering gold and green foliage grows low and fast for a sun-loving, hardy, evergreen groundcover. Lilac blooms appear late summer. (3" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus doerfleri 'Bressingham'
Creeping Thyme (Code: 5943)

A carpet of fuzzy gray-green, evergreen leaves and soft pink flowers makes it a dainty accent for the rockery, between pavers, or at borders edge. Best in full sun with good drainage. (4" x 18") Zn4.

Thymus praecox 'Albus'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3614)

Starry white flowers top tiny bright green leaves. It forms a fragrant, tightly-matted groundcover underfoot; perfect along pathways or between pavers. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Coccineus'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3612)

Dainty rose-red flowers completely cover this creeping thyme in summer. The evergreen foliage turns somewhat red in winter. (2-3" x 18") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Hartington Silver'

Silver Creeping Thyme (Code: 4709)

Creeping English thyme with beautiful, aromatic, tiny green leaves edged in gold. It makes an excellent mat-forming, evergreen groundcover or use between pavers. (2-3" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Minus'

Miniature Creeping Thyme (Code: 3615)

Tiny, overlapping, gray-green, evergreen leaves form a low mat. Small pink flowers appear midsummer. Nice for planting between pavers. (1" x 10") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Nutmeg'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 8256)

A profusion of deep purple-carmine blooms cover this tight, deep green, evergreen groundcover in summer. It is drought tolerant and sun loving. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Pink Chintz'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3609)

Soft, hairy, gray-green, evergreen foliage is topped by pale pink flowers in summer. It's drought tolerant and sun loving. (1-3" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Reiter's Red'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 4449)

Rich olive-green, evergreen foliage grows thick and tough, making it an ideal groundcover or alternative for grass. Lavender-pink flowers add to its appeal mid-summer. (2-3" x 18") Zn5.



Thymus pseudolanuginosus

Woolly Thyme (Code: 3606)

Soft, completely prostrate, silvery-green, evergreen foliage has pink flowers in summer. It handles foot traffic well and is excellent for use between pavers. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus x 'Pink Ripple'

Pink Ripple Thyme (Code: 5430)

Light green, lemon-scented foliage creates a spreading evergreen carpet topped by pink flowers in summer. An excellent choice for pathways, between pavers, or in the rockery. (6" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Doone Valley'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 5173)

Green foliage has irregular golden patches, which become red-tinted in winter. Fragrant lavender flowers appear from August through September. (4" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Lemon Frost'

Lemon Thyme (Code: 4160)

This excellent selection exudes the sweet and pure fragrance of lemons when walked upon. Profuse white flowers provide the "frost" in June and July. An excellent choice for an evergreen groundcover or between pavers. (4" x 12") Zn6.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Spicy Orange'

Citrus-Scented Thyme (Code: 6896)

This prostrate, needle-leaved thyme makes an excellent evergreen groundcover. Releasing a refreshing scent of oranges when crushed, it is perfect between pavers. (4" x 24") Zn5.



Veronica liwanensis

Turkish Speedwell (Code: 3671)

Clusters of bright blue flowers top tiny, round, glossy, evergreen leaves in summer. An excellent prostrate Veronica well suited to gardens in the Rocky Mountains and west coast. (1-3" x 24") Zn5.



Veronica peduncularis 'Georgia Blue'

Speedwell (Code: 6082)

This low-spreading, evergreen mound is smothered by round blue flowers with white eyes. This repeat bloomer is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6" x 18") Zn4.

Veronica repens
Speedwell (Code: 4425)

Dainty flowers of palest blue last all spring. It forms a deep green, spreading evergreen mat. An excellent lawn substitute; it fills in fast and suppresses weeds. (1" x 18") Zn5.



Vinca minor 'Illumination'
Periwinkle (Code: 7364)

In spring, periwinkle-blue flowers provide bold contrast to brilliant gold leaves edged in green. Use it as trailing foliage in mixed containers or as an evergreen groundcover. (4" x 18") Zn4. PP12132 Propagation Prohibited.



Vinca minor 'Bowle's Variety'
Periwinkle (Code: 3790)

Large, deep periwinkle-blue flowers top shiny green foliage in spring. This attractive, trouble-free, spreading evergreen groundcover can handle a variety of soils and conditions. (4-6" x 18-24") Zn4.



Vinca minor 'Ralph Shugert'
Periwinkle (Code: 6455)

Dark green foliage is edged with distinctive cream margins that set off bright blue flowers in spring. This is a marvelous evergreen groundcover. (4-6" x 18-24") Zn4. PP6960 Propagation Prohibited.
