

Interesting Fruit or Bark



Amelanchier alnifolia
Saskatoon Serviceberry (Code: 8240)
 This native North American deciduous shrub features an abundance of white flowers in spring, turning to small edible fruits that taste something like a blueberry. The leaves turn crimson-red in fall. Wonderful for attracting wildlife! (12-20' x 8-12') Zn3.



Amelanchier alnifolia 'Smokey'
Saskatoon, Serviceberry (Code: 7465)
 This multi-stemmed deciduous shrub has an upright spreading habit and smooth silver-gray bark. The dark green oval leaves turn bright yellow in the fall. Stunning clusters of white flowers appear before the leaves emerge in early spring. Blue berries are abundant in late spring and are excellent eaten fresh or for making jams and jellies. Self-pollinating. (8-12' x 8-12') Zn3.



Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Massachusetts'
Kinnikinnick, Bearberry (Code: 5674)
 This popular native evergreen groundcover is very cold and drought tolerant. Small pink flowers bloom in early spring and are followed by bright red berries in fall. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.



Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Vancouver Jade'
Kinnikinnick (Code: 6383)
 Small pink flowers in spring turn into scarlet-red fruit in summer and fall. This drought tolerant, glossy-leaved, evergreen groundcover is deservedly popular. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.



Arum italicum
Italian Arum (Code: 2136)
 Glossy-green, spear-shaped leaves are marbled with silver and appear in late winter. Flowers are not showy, but are followed by upright stalks of bright orange-red berries in summer. The foliage may go dormant in summer. (12" x 24-36") Zn7.



Azara microphylla
Boxleaf Azara, Chinchin (Code: 6477)
 This small tree has dark, glossy evergreen foliage similar to boxwood. Tiny yellow flowers scented of white chocolate appear in late winter, followed by tiny blood-red fruit. It prefers well-drained soil. (15' x 6') Zn7.



Callicarpa dichotoma 'Early Amethyst'
Beautyberry (Code: 6119)
 Clusters of stunning purple berries line bare branches of this standout deciduous shrub in fall. Berries appear earlier than other varieties. Pale lavender flowers appear in summer. (3-4' x 3-4') Zn5.



Cornus alba 'Elegantissima'
Tatarian Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6474)
 Reddish-purple winter stems and white-margined green leaves make this plant perfect for year-round interest in the garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6-9' x 4-6') Zn4.



Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire'
Bloodtwig Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6972)
 Unbelievable color for the winter landscape with stems in flickering shades of yellow, orange and red. It makes an impressive mass planting. Useful in cut and dried flower arrangements. (5-10' x 5') Zn4.



Cornus sericea 'Cardinal'
Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 4906)
 The vibrant stem color changes from coral in fall to a deep cherry-red in winter. It is truly an outstanding and choice cultivar for the winter landscape. (8-10' x 6') Zn4.



Cornus sericea 'Hedgerow's Gold'
Redosier Dogwood (Code: 6858)
 Bright golden-yellow and green-variegated leaves contrast vividly against deep red stems. Eye-catching every season of the year. This Northwest native cultivar is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-10' x 5') Zn4.



Disporopsis pernyi 'Bill Baker Form'
Evergreen Solomon's Seal (Code: 7104)
 A collector's plant for the woodland shade garden, it has fragrant white flowers that dangle from arching stems below glossy green leaves. Blue-black berries appear later in the season. (12-18" x 12") Zn6.



Dorycnium hirsutum
Hairy Canary Clover (Code: 5178)
 Pink-tinged white flowers adorn this fuzzy silver-leaf sub-shrub in late summer and fall. The flowers are followed by reddish fruit pods. It needs a sunny, well-drained site. (12-20" x 18-24") Zn8.



Fragaria 'Lipstick'
Strawberry (Code: 6270)
 Beautiful deep rose flowers top this glossy-leaved evergreen groundcover, in late spring to early summer. (4" x 24") Zn2.





Fragaria chiloensis
Beach Strawberry (Code: 5005)
 This NW native, glossy-leaved, prostrate strawberry makes an excellent evergreen groundcover that is tolerant of many different conditions. Simple white flowers in spring are followed by edible red berries. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Fragaria virginiana
Virginia Strawberry (Code: 7269)
 North American native strawberry with white flowers in late spring and summer. Sweet red berries are about 1.2" across in summer. Often seen in open woods or moist meadows throughout North America. (2-4" x 18-24") Zn3.



Gaultheria procumbens
Wintergreen (Code: 2690)
 Elegant, North American native, evergreen groundcover for moist, well-drained, shaded areas. Tiny white bell-shaped flowers in spring produce red berries in fall with the taste of wintergreen. (2-3" x 24") Zn3.



Lonicera involucrata
Black Twinberry (Code: 7268)
 Pairs of small, yellow, pendulous, tubular flowers are surrounded by green bracts in late spring and summer. After the flowers fade, pairs of showy black berries form, each surrounded by the bracts that have now turned bright red. The flowers of this handsome shrub are enjoyed by hummingbirds, while other birds and wildlife will eat the berries. A Pacific Northwest native. (8-10' x 6-8') Zn4.



Lonicera pileata
Privet Honeysuckle (Code: 4696)
 Horizontally-branched, semi-evergreen shrub for large scale underplanting or groundcover. Small creamy flowers are followed by clusters of translucent violet berries. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5' x 4') Zn5.



Maianthemum kamschaticum
May Lily (Code: 6348)
 In spring, creamy-white flowers adorn this pretty spreading, native North American groundcover, followed by small red berries in summer. Easy to grow and useful for colonizing shady places. (12" x 24") Zn4.



Muehlenbeckia axillaris
Creeping Wire Vine (Code: 6848)
 Low-growing New Zealand native has dark wiry stems that contort, curl and bend. Small attractive green leaflets and fruit is a translucent white with black seeds. Great for topiary. (4-10" x 12-18") Zn3.



Parthenocissus henryana
Silvervein Creeper (Code: 6735)
 Palmately-compound leaves with silver veins turn a brilliant red in fall. Insignificant green flowers in summer are followed by dark blue berries in fall. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-20' x 8-12') Zn6.



Parthenocissus quinquefolia
Virginia Creeper (Code: 6499)
 A vigorous vine to cover trellises, fences or buildings. Also a good groundcover on slopes, and to control erosion. Five-lobed leaves turn brilliant orange-to-crimson in fall. (25' x 6-10') Zn4.



Polygonatum biflorum 'Prince Charming'
Solomon's Seal (Code: 7260)
 Arching stems of blue-green leaves no taller than 12" start the spring with many pairs of creamy white flowers. In fall purple berries are followed by golden yellow fall color. Can tolerate full sun with moist, well-drained soil but prefers part shade. (8-12" x 24-36") Zn3. PPAF



Rubus pentalobus 'Formosan Carpet'
Creeping Raspberry (Code: 5423)
 This groundcover is ideal for covering large areas, to control erosion, or for trailing over walls. White flowers in summer are followed by golden berries in fall. Fast-spreading and low maintenance, it is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 12") Zn7.



Smilacina racemosa
False Solomon's Seal (Code: 5650)
 Clusters of white flowers at the ends of arching stalks distinguishes this plant from the "true" Solomon's seal. Red berries follow the flowers later in the season. It will spread to form a colony. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (36" x 12") Zn3.



Viburnum propinquum
Chinese Viburnum (Code: 6479)
 Elegant compact shrub with evergreen, glossy dark green foliage. White summer flowers bloom on red stems and turn to metallic-blue berries in fall. (10-12' x 6') Zn7.
