



Acorus gramineus 'Ogon'

Sweet Flag (Code: 4254)

The tufting, golden, evergreen foliage makes a striking border or accent plant. It even tolerates standing water. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 12")















Agapanthus 'Storm Cloud'

Lily of the Nile (Code: 7117)

Spectacular deep blue-violet flower heads stand high above grassy green foliage, followed by decorative seed pods. A terrific container plant that overwinters well indoors in colder climates. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2-3' x 2-3') Zn7.






Asarum europaeum

European Wild Ginger (Code: 2174)

This evergreen groundcover forms a lush carpet of glossy green leaves. Unusual purplish-green flowers appear hidden beneath the foliage in late spring. It grows best in rich, moist soil in part shade. A "Great Plant Pick" for the

Calico Aster (Code: 6384)

Tiny, rosy-eyed white daisies top dense deep purple foliage. An absolutely stunning combination! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (2' x 2') Zn4.





Aster x frikartii 'Monch'

Frikart's Aster (Code: 2205)

Lovely large, single, lavender-blue flowers bloom for an extraordinarily long time - from summer through fall. This "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest makes





Athyrium felix-femina 'Frizelliae'

Tatting Fern (Code: 7688)

This distinctive fern has deep green fronds that resemble necklaces. Delicate looking, but adaptable as any lady fern. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-18" x 12-18") Zn3.















Athyrium niponicum 'Pictum'

Japanese Painted Fern (Code: 6968)

Silvery-gray, metallic-appearing fronds have garnet veins extending to the tips. Long-lived and reliable in moist, humus-rich soil. 2004 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year and a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-18" x 18-24") Zn3.



Azara microphylla

Boxleaf Azara, Chinchin (Code: 6477)

This small tree has dark, glossy evergreen foliage similar to boxwood. Tiny yellow flowers scented of white chocolate appear in late winter, followed by tiny blood-red fruit. It prefers well-drained soil. (15' x 6') Zn7.













Blechnum spicant

Deer Fern (Code: 7488)

This NW native, tufted fern has compact, symmetrical, lustrous evergreen fronds. A " Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest, it is an essential ingredient for the natural woodland garden, as either an accent plant or groundcover. (16" x 24") Zn5.



Brunnera macrophylla 'Jack Frost'

Siberian Bugloss (Code: 7389)

The leaves have frosty-silver overlay and light green veining. Tiny clusters of pretty forget-me-not flowers appear in spring. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest that is perfect for the woodland garden! (12-15" x 15") Zn3. PP13859 Propagation Prohibited.









Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2280)

Spectacular 1" bell-shaped violet flowers cover this perennial for many months. It vigorously spreads to form a small groundcover. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (6" x 10") Zn5.













Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Karl Foerster'

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 5160)

Upright soft green leaves are topped by tall, vertical, rose-colored plumes that mature to a golden-wheat color. This 2001 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5' x 2') Zn4.





Campanula garganica 'Dickson's Gold'

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 5937)

Starry lavender-blue flowers top brilliant golden foliage. An eye-catching, compact charmer, it brightens partial shade even when not in flower. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 6-12") Zn5.





Campanula poscharskyana

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2306)

A lovely, vigorous perennial with blue starry flowers that bloom for months. Drought tolerant and very adaptable, it's a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (6-9" x 14") Zn4.





Carex elata 'Bowle's Golden'

Golden Sedge (Code: 6285)

This incandescent, golden grass makes a gorgeous foliage accent for the mixed border or pond perimeter. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (24-36" x 24-36")





Carex morrowii 'Ice Dance'

Variegated Sedge (Code: 6653)

Dark green leaves with white edges form arching mounds of evergreen foliage. It will spread to form a groundcover that's easy to control. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn5.





Caryopteris x clandonensis 'Dark Knight'

Bluebeard (Code: 2349)

Compact and showy deciduous shrub with profuse clusters of the deepest blue flowers late in the season. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2-3' x 2-3')





Ceratostigma plumbaginoides

Plumbago (Code: 2370)

Electric-blue flowers provide a dramatic contrast with the garnet- red autumn foliage. This wonderful groundcover is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! It breaks dormancy late in the spring, but it's worth the wait. (8-12" x 24") Zn6.





Tatarian Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6474)

Reddish-purple winter stems and white-margined green leaves make this plant perfect for year-round interest in the garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6-9' x 4-6') Zn4.





Campanula portenschlagiana

Bellflower (Code: 5476)

This vigorous evergreen creeper bears large clusters of open, violet-blue, bell-shaped flowers that bloom for months. Drought tolerant, it's a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. It will re-seed and naturalize to form a small colony. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Campanula poscharskyana 'Blue Gown'

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2254)

Star-like true-blue flowers are larger than the species and cover this low-growing variety for many months. Excellent in rock gardens or spilling over walls and container edges. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn3.



Carex morrowii 'Aureovariegata'

Variegated Sedge (Code: 2329)

This easy-to-grow evergreen grass forms a mounding clump of butter-yellow-striped leaves with green edges. A truly beautiful sedge, useful as an accent, in groups as a groundcover, or as a container subject. (12" x 15") Zn5.



Caryopteris incana 'Sunshine Blue'™

Bluebeard (Code: 3262)

Bright golden foliage is accented by stunning deep blue flowers, late summer through fall. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3' x 3') Zn6. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.





Ceanothus 'Victoria'

California Lilac (Code: 6712)

Masses of vivid dark blue flowers appear mid-spring. It grows into a lovely medium sized shrub with glossy evergreen leaves. Tough and trouble-free, it is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6' x 6') Zn7.















Cistus x corbariensis

White Rockrose (Code: 5680)

Deep green foliage sets off red buds in spring, followed by pure white flowers. One of the hardiest Cistus cultivars, this evergreen shrub tolerates poor soil and maritime conditions. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (18-30" x 48") Zn7.

Cornus sericea 'Hedgerow's Gold' Redosier Dogwood (Code: 6858)

Bright golden-yellow and green-variegated leaves contrast vividly against deep red stems. Eye-catching every season of the year. This Northwest native cultivar is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-10' x 5') Zn4.





















Crocosmia 'Lucifer' Montbretia (Code: 2455)

Dramatic, deep red flowers line tall stately stems, with a strong upright, clumping habit. This late-blooming hummingbird favorite is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (36" x 24") Zn6.













Dryopteris erythrosora

Autumn Fern (Code: 5341)

New growth is orange-bronze to copper and gradually fades to deep green by summer. The evergreen fronds remain erect in winter. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (36" x 18") Zn5.













Echinacea purpurea 'White Swan'

Coneflower (Code: 2599)

Large white flowers with chartreuse cones are wonderful for bouquets. A beautiful selection and perfect for the mixed border. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (36" x 20") Zn3.















Epimedium x rubrum

Bishop's Hat (Code: 7342)

Deep reddish-pink and white, 1/2" flowers float on wiry stems above red-rimmed new foliage in spring. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 15") Zn5.













Eupatorium purpureum subsp. maculatum 'Gateway'

Joe Pye Weed (Code: 4056)

Sturdy, upright black stems carry terminal heads of rich pink flowers late summer through fall. This tall, moisture loving perenial is best used as an architectural plant with color highlights in fall. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5-6' x 3') Zn4.













Euphorbia characias ssp. wulfenii

Mediterranean Spurge (Code: 2658)

Large clusters of showy chartreuse bracts adorn this largegrowing evergreen form from March to June. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3' x 3') Zn6.

















Geranium 'Ann Folkard'

Hardy Geranium (Code: 5521)

Brilliant magenta flowers with dark eyes contrast nicely with gold-chartreuse foliage. It has an excellent weaving growth habit and a very long bloom period. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (7-24" x 27-35") Zn5.











Cynara cardunculus

Cardoon (Code: 5108)

Large silver-green, deeply-divided, spiny leaves are topped by 4-5" glowing blue-violet flowers in summer. Use as an unusual architectural plant specimen. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5' x 4') Zn7.











Echinacea purpurea 'Magnus'

Coneflower (Code: 2600)

Large, bright rose-pink daisies have prominent orange cones. Excellent for cutting and a butterfly magnet! 1998 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (36" x 20") Zn3.















Bishop's Hat (Code: 5955)

Red mottled foliage is topped by sprays of dainty butteryellow flowers in spring and spreads 6-8" a year. A charming evergreen addition to the woodland garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 16") Zn5.



Eucomis comosa 'Sparkling Burgundy'

Purple Pineapple Lily (Code: 4302)

An unusual perennial with strappy burgundy foliage. In late summer a miniature purple pineapple-shaped blossom emerges. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (24-30" x 24") Zn6.
























Geranium cinereum 'Lawrence Flatman'

Grayleaf Geranium (Code: 2694)

Magenta-veined, dark lavender flowers top small, divided, wedge-shaped leaves in spring and summer. An excellent choice for the rock garden, it is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (10" x 18") Zn5.











Geranium macrorrhizum 'Album'

Bigroot Geranium (Code: 5697)

Clusters of scented white flowers rise above spreading, deer resistant, evergreen foliage that grows to form a groundcover. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (15" x 20") Zn4.









Geranium macrorrhizum 'Variegatum'

Bigroot Geranium (Code: 4329)

Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Biokovo'

Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Karmina'

Hardy Geranium (Code: 6343)

Masses of raspberry-pink flowers blanket this low and spreading, semi-evergreen variety in late spring. Great for creating a groundcover in either full sun or part shade! A 'Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 18")















Geranium x riversleaianum 'Mavis Simpson'

Cranesbill (Code: 5256)

Silky, silvery leaves and soft pink flowers weave nicely through adjacent plants. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 24") Zn4.





Hakonechloa macra 'Albostriata'

Japanese Forest Grass (Code: 4540)

Creamy-yellow striped blades in spring fade to white in late summer. It forms a nicely-rounded mound. This vigorous grower is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (18" x 30") Zn5.













Geranium endressii x psilostemon 'Patricia'

Hardy Geranium (Code: 4501)

Dark-eyed magenta flowers adorn this long-blooming and large-growing, hardy geranium. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (24-30" x 48") Zn5.









Geranium macrorrhizum 'Ingwerson's Variety'

Bigroot Hardy Geranium (Code: 5728)

Light pink flowers appear in late spring. Lush aromatic, spreading foliage will form a groundcover. This variety is drought and shade tolerant, making it a good evergreen choice for under trees. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn3.













Geranium procurrens x lambertii 'Salome

Hardy Geranium (Code: 4796)

Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Cambridge Blue'

Cranesbill, Hardy Geranium (Code: 5949)

Single lavender-pink flowers top deep green, lobed leaves in late spring. This restrained and well-behaved cultivar makes a fantastic semi-evergreen groundcover when planted en masse. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 18") Zn4.













Geranium x cantabrigiense 'St. Ola'

Hardy Geranium (Code: 4519)

Sparkling pure white flowers shine among fragrant semi-evergreen leaves in summer. A beautiful restrained selection perfect for the mixed border. Insect and disease resistant with good fall color. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8-12" x 18") Zn4.











Hakonechloa macra

Japanese Forest Grass (Code: 4327)

Delicate bamboo-like foliage graces this slow-spreading, non-invasive grass. The foliage takes on a reddish-pink cast in fall, turning to bronze in winter. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-24" x 16") Zn5.













Hakonechloa macra 'All Gold'

Japanese Forest Grass (Code: 5220)

Beautiful lime-green and bright gold blades form a delicate soft mound. A stunning grass that moves in the slightest breeze. It grows best in moderately moist soil and full sun. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (10" x 24") Zn6.















Hakonechloa macra 'Aureola'

Helenium x hybrida 'Moerheim Beauty'

Helen's Flower (Code: 2780)

Beautiful flowers in velvety, coppery-red hues, glow in the mixed border. It adds beautiful color and interest to any garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3-4' x 3') Zn4.







Helictotrichon sempervirens 'Sapphire'

Blue Oat Grass (Code: 4324)




