

Prostrate or vining growth habit



Achillea 'Brass Buttons'

Yarrow (Code: 5338)

Fresh green, ferny foliage forms a low mat. Small cream-colored buds open to golden-yellow flowers in the spring. Although delicate-looking, it is tough and durable. (3" x 12") Zn4.



Aegopodium podagraria 'Variegatum'

Bishop's Weed (Code: 2040)

This vigorous, carefree groundcover has attractive cream and green-variegated leaves. It looks best when grown in partial shade in moist soil, but it will tolerate almost any growing condition. (6-10" x 12") Zn3.



Ajuga reptans 'Black Scallop'

Bugleweed (Code: 3940)

Very attractive jet-black scalloped leaves are covered with deep violet-blue flower spikes in spring. The foliage color intensifies in cold and full sun. (3-6" x 30-36") Zn3. PP15815 Propagation Prohibited.



Ajuga reptans 'Catlin's Giant'

Bugleweed (Code: 5166)

Unusual large-growing Ajuga with dramatic thick foliage and tall blue flower spikes. The leaves grow even larger with rich soil. It's stunning planted en masse, as border edging, or over bulbs. (9" x 36") Zn3.



Arabis caucasica 'Snowcap'

Rock Cress (Code: 2140)

This low-growing perennial is great for rock gardens or cascading over walls. Beautiful pure white flowers sparkle in spring. (4" x 12") Zn3.



Arabis ferdinandi-coburgi 'Old Gold'

Rock Cress (Code: 5720)

This vigorous low spreader has great evergreen leaves with wide chartreuse margins. White flowers appear in May. (4" x 18") Zn4.



Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Massachusetts'

Kinnikinnick, Bearberry (Code: 5674)

This popular native evergreen groundcover is very cold and drought tolerant. Small pink flowers bloom in early spring and are followed by bright red berries in fall. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.



Achillea tomentosa 'Lemon' (aka 'Lemon Yellow Form')

Yarrow (Code: 2020)

Lovely lemon yellow flowers are set off by ferny, evergreen foliage. Excellent in rock gardens or as a groundcover. (3-4" x 16") Zn4.



Ajuga 'Chocolate Chip'

Bugleweed (Code: 4468)

Bright blue flower spikes top miniature chocolate colored foliage in spring. This marvelously-dense, vigorous, spreading groundcover is excellent in containers or rock gardens. (3" x 18") Zn4.



Ajuga reptans 'Burgundy Glow'

Bugleweed (Code: 2032)

In spring, blue flower spikes rise above a colorful low mat of burgundy-rose, white and green-variegated foliage. An eye-catching selection! (6" x 24") Zn6.



Ajuga reptans 'Sparkler'

Bugleweed (Code: 7436)

The dark green, shiny foliage is covered in creamy-white splashes that turn pink in winter. The most vigorous, variegated Ajuga, it's awesome as an accent in containers, or as a ground-cover. Lovely blue flowers appear late spring. (3-4" x 12-18") Zn6. PPAF



Arabis caucasica 'Variegata'

Rock Cress (Code: 5356)

Striking emerald and cream, felted evergreen leaves are topped with pure white flowers in spring. The late season foliage is very attractive. A collector's plant. (8" x 24") Zn3.



Arabis x arendsii 'La Fraicheur'

Rock Cress (Code: 4069)

Rose-pink flowers cover gray-green foliage in April. This rock garden plant prefers well-drained soil and moderate temperatures. (3-4" x 12") Zn3.



Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Vancouver Jade'

Kinnikinnick (Code: 6383)

Small pink flowers in spring turn into scarlet-red fruit in summer and fall. This drought tolerant, glossy-leaved, evergreen groundcover is deservedly popular. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.

Aubrieta 'Dr. Mules Variegata'

Rock Cress (Code: 2107)

This wonderful perennial has violet-purple flowers in spring that brightly contrast creeping cream and green-variegated foliage. (4" x 12") Zn4.



Aubrieta 'Red Flowering Variegated'

Rock Cress (Code: 2108)

Variegated cream and green foliage has a trailing habit perfect for the rock garden or edge of the border. Red flowers appear in early spring. (4-8" x 10-16") Zn4.



Aubrieta x cultorum Large Flowered Mix

Rock Cress (Code: 2243)

Varying shades of purple, plum, and violet grace this early blooming rockery favorite. Cascades down walls and sunny hillsides beautifully. Shear after flowering to keep compact. (5" x 18") Zn4.



Bacopa (Sutera) 'Great Blue'

Bacopa (Code: 5213)

Long-blooming garden favorite with small blue starry flowers and carpet-like growth habit. Unbeatable accent for mixed containers, baskets or as a groundcover. (2-6" x 12") Zn9.



Bacopa (Sutera) 'Lavender Scent'

Bacopa (Code: 5295)

Masses of dainty lavender flowers cover this trailing charmer all season long. Excellent cascading from hanging baskets, container combos, or as a groundcover. (2-6" x 12") Zn9.



Calamintha cretica

Calamint (Code: 6484)

A groundcover that has wide, fuzzy gray-green leaves and light pink/mauve flowers that bloom in mid-summer. Before it flowers it is sometimes confused with Dittany of Crete. (3-5" x 18-24") Zn6.

Million Bells Mini Petunia (Code: 7780)

The original Million Bells and still the best seller! This compact, low grower has fine foliage and 1&C, trumpet-shaped orange and yellow striped blooms that open nonstop until hard frost without need of deadheading. A Hummingbird favorite! (6-10" x 7-8") Zn9.



Aubrieta 'Dr. Mules'

Rock Cress (Code: 2235)

Stunning blue-violet flowers smother a carpet of foliage in spring. This old-time variety is perfect for the alpine garden or tumbling over rock walls. (5" x 18") Zn4.



Aubrieta x cultorum 'Rokey's Purple'

Rock Cress (Code: 2241)

A profusion of true purple blooms cover this low-growing perennial. A very long and repeat bloomer, it is ideal for the rockery or border's edge. (3-6" x 24") Zn3.



Azorella trifurcata 'Nana' (Bolax glebaria 'Nana')

Cushion Plant (Code: 5456)

Small, tough, rigid leaves grow tightly together, forming a textured mound. An unusual and wonderful, evergreen spreader, great for spilling around rocks or edging paths. (12" x 6") Zn3.

Bacopa (Code: 5214)

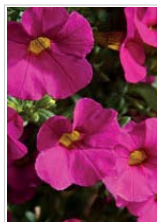

Bacopa (Code: 7540)

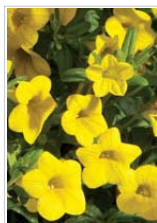

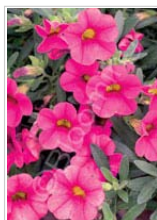

Mini Petunia (Code: 7571)

Pretty pink flowers with a dark center bloom nonstop! This heat tolerant trailing form is perfect for spilling out of baskets & mixed containers. (4" x 18-24") Zn9.



Campanula 'Birch Hybrid'

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2280)

Spectacular 1" bell-shaped violet flowers cover this perennial for many months. It vigorously spreads to form a small groundcover. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (6" x 10") Zn5.



Campanula carpatica 'Samantha'

Carpathian Bell Flower (Code: 3610)

Beautiful blue-violet, upward-facing flowers are very fragrant. This little charmer re-blooms nicely with a little deadheading. A great addition to any garden or container. (3-5" x 14") Zn5. PPAF Propagation Prohibited



Campanula cochleariifolia 'Bavarian Blue'

Carpathian Bellflower (Code: 2307)

A profusion of blue, thimble-shaped flowers sparkle all summer over this neat, mat-forming foliage. Ideal for edging, rockery, or containers. Prefers good drainage. (4" x 12") Zn3.



Campanula poscharskyana

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2306)

A lovely, vigorous perennial with blue starry flowers that bloom for months. Drought tolerant and very adaptable, it's a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (6-9" x 14") Zn4.



Campanula punctata 'Cherry Bells'

Bellflower (Code: 6527)

Full bells of cherry-pink, neatly edged in white, dangle along the stems of this spreading cottage garden favorite. The flowers are wonderful for summer bouquets! (20-30" x 24") Zn4.



Carex dolichostachya 'Kaga nishiki'

Gold Fountain Sedge (Code: 4805)

Fine green leaves have a gold stripe along each edge. Low and fountain-like, this sedge works well in drifts, as a formal border or specimen. Tolerant of many conditions and exposures. (12" x 24") Zn5.



Calibrachoa Mini Famous½ 'Double Lemon'

Mini-Petunia (Code: 7587)

Gorgeous, double lemon flowers bloom nonstop! This heat tolerant trailing form is perfect for spilling out of baskets & mixed containers. (4" x 18-24") Zn9.



Campanula carpatica 'Deep Blue Clips'

Carpathian Bell Flower (Code: 5965)

Stunning large, deep blue flowers cover this alpine garden classic in summer. An attractive compact habit makes it ideal for the front of the mixed border. (6" x 8-12") Zn4.



Campanula carpatica 'White Clips'

Carpathian Bellflower (Code: 2284)

Sparkling white, large cup-shaped flowers cover a tidy foliage clump. It makes an excellent rock garden plant, edging or groundcover. (3-4" x 12") Zn4.



Campanula portenschlagiana

Bellflower (Code: 5476)

This vigorous evergreen creeper bears large clusters of open, violet-blue, bell-shaped flowers that bloom for months. Drought tolerant, it's a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. It will re-seed and naturalize to form a small colony. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Campanula poscharskyana 'Blue Gown'

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2254)

Star-like true-blue flowers are larger than the species and cover this low-growing variety for many months. Excellent in rock gardens or spilling over walls and container edges. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn3.



Campanula x pulloides 'Jelly Bells'

Bellflower (Code: 4587)

Large, deep violet-blue nodding bells bloom over a bright green mat of foliage in spring. A vigorous and attractive low growing perennial, it often reblooms. (8-12" x 12-15") Zn5. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Carex morrowii 'Ice Dance'

Variegated Sedge (Code: 6653)

Dark green leaves with white edges form arching mounds of evergreen foliage. It will spread to form a groundcover that's easy to control. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn5.



Prostrate or vining growth habit



Ceanothus 'Centennial'

California Lilac (Code: 6670)

This low-growing, spreading, evergreen shrub has dark blue flowers in spring. A native cultivar of the Pacific coast, it is tolerant of summer heat and drought. (8-12" x 72") Zn7.



Ceanothus griseus var. horizontalis 'Diamond Heights'

California Lilac (Code: 6833)

Gorgeous lime-green foliage has dark pine-green detail down the spine of each leaf. Lovely bright blue flowers appear in spring. Great for mild coastal gardens, it prefers partial shade when grown in hot locations. (8-12" x 24-36") Zn8.



Ceratostigma plumbaginoides

Plumbago (Code: 2370)

Electric-blue flowers provide a dramatic contrast with the garnet- red autumn foliage. This wonderful groundcover is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! It breaks dormancy late in the spring, but it's worth the wait. (8-12" x 24") Zn6.



Chamaemelum nobile 'Flore Pleno'

Double-Flowered Roman Chamomile (Code: 8044)

Aromatic white, double, flowering herb makes a long-blooming groundcover. Mow while flowers are fresh to maintain as a lawn. Blooms can be used for teas. (2-8" x 18-24") Zn4.



Cistus salviifolius 'Prostratus'

Prostrate Rockrose (Code: 7065)

White flowers with yellow centers cover sage-like evergreen leaves in spring. The low spreading habit makes it a great shrub for use as a groundcover. It tolerates poor soil, dry banks and maritime conditions. (10-18" x 72") Zn7.



Convallaria majalis 'Rosea'

Lily of the Valley (Code: 6010)

This carefree groundcover has dainty, fragrant, pink bell-shaped flowers in spring followed by tiny orange berries. (6-10" x 18-24") Zn3.



Delosperma 'Mesa Verde'™ ('Kelaidis')

Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 4275)

This vigorous, compact form blooms spring to fall in iridescent hues of salmon-pink. It is perfect for the carefree sunny border or rock garden. (2" x 18") Zn5. PP13876 Propagation Prohibited.



Ceanothus gloriosus (Pt Reyes)

Point Reyes Ceanothus (Code: 7050)

Lavender-blue flower clusters in spring top shiny evergreen foliage on a nice low-spreading shrub. It makes an excellent groundcover when planted en masse. (2' x 4') Zn7.



Cerastium tomentosum 'Silver Carpet'

Snow-in-Summer (Code: 2365)

The silvery-white mat of foliage is smothered with white flowers from April to May. Lovely as a groundcover in well drained soil. (3-6" x 18") Zn3.



Chamaemelum nobile

Roman Chamomile (Code: 8043)

Yellow-centered white daisies adorn creeping stems of evergreen foliage, making it an aromatic groundcover. Mow before seeds set to maintain as a lawn. Also used as a medicinal tea or yellow dye. (2-8" x 18-24") Zn4.



Chamaemelum nobile 'Treneague'

Roman Chamomile (Code: 3786)

Dense green foliage on this non-flowering chamomile makes a nice lawn, path or carpeting around garden seats. Aromatic when walked upon. (2-8" x 18-24") Zn4.



Convallaria majalis

Lily of the Valley (Code: 2420)

Clusters of extremely-fragrant, dainty white bell-shaped flowers adorn this old-fashioned favorite in spring. It spreads freely to form a low maintenance groundcover under deciduous trees. (6-10" x 24-36") Zn3.



Convolvulus mauritanicus

Morning Glory (Code: 2425)

Soft lavender-blue flowers appear all season above gray-green foliage. This low growing, dump-forming perennial is excellent in hanging baskets, planters or the border edge. (6-12" x 24") Zn7.



Delosperma 'Oberg'

Ice Plant (Code: 6274)

A profusion of small daisy-like flowers first open pink then fade to white, producing a bicolor effect in summer. The low growing mat of succulent gray-green leaves is very drought tolerant. (1-2" x 6-12") Zn7.



Prostrate or vining growth habit



Delosperma 'Table Mountain' ('John Proffitt')

Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 4954)

Fast spreading groundcover with thick succulent leaves topped by small, fuchsia colored, daisy-like blooms all summer. (2-3" x 12-16") Zn5.



Delosperma congestum 'Gold Nugget'

Ice Plant (Code: 3903)

Low-growing succulent leaves with bright gold, daisy-like flowers bloom in summer. This is a great plant for dry soils and rock gardens. (1-2" x 12") Zn5.



Delosperma floribundum 'Starburst'

Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 7373)

Succulent foliage has shimmering bright pink flowers with eye-catching white centers. It blooms June through fall and does best in full sun and well-drained soil. (2-4" x 12") Zn6.



Delosperma nubigenum 'Basutoland'

Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 3904)

From the higher elevations in Africa, this hardy Delosperma has thick fleshy leaves and brilliant yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. Very drought tolerant, it forms a low growing evergreen mat of foliage. (1-3" x 6") Zn5.



Dianthus gratianopolitanus 'Bath's Pink'

Cheddar Pink (Code: 5252)

Soft pink, single, fringed flowers bloom profusely in spring. Tough, heat tolerant, gray-green, evergreen foliage is attractive even when not in flower. This is the best Dianthus for groundcover. (6-8" x 24-30") Zn3.



Dianthus plumarius 'Mrs. Sinkins'

Cottage Pink (Code: 5432)

This old-fashioned favorite displays fragrant, blowsy, double, white blooms. The low-growing mat of grassy foliage is topped by numerous blooms in May and June. A classic! (10' x 1') Zn6.



Epimedium grandiflorum 'Lilafee'

Bishop's Hat (Code: 6302)

Dainty, long-spurred lavender-violet flowers adorn this woodland charmer. Spring foliage emerges in dramatic bronzy-lavender, matures to green, and then turns to vivid shades of red in fall. (15" x 18") Zn5.



Delosperma basuticum

White-eyed Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 4339)

Glossy bright yellow flowers with white centers cover congested mats of succulent foliage in summer. This is an excellent choice for the rock garden. (1" x 8") Zn6.



Delosperma cooperi

Cooper's Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 2459)

Vivid magenta daisies cover succulent evergreen foliage, July to September. It requires sharply drained soil to avoid damage from prolonged wet winters. (2-4" x 18") Zn6.



Delosperma nubigenum

Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 2460)

Succulent, bright green foliage has red tints in the fall. Single, yellow daisy-like flowers appear late spring and early summer. This is an excellent low growing evergreen for the rock garden. (1-2" x 32-36") Zn5.



Dendranthema weyrichii 'White Bomb'

Garden Mum (Code: 2409)

Large, lustrous white daisies smother this beautiful low-growing evergreen groundcover in fall. It's excellent for rock gardens. (8" x 24") Zn3.



Dianthus gratianopolitanus 'Tiny Rubies'

Cheddar Pinks (Code: 2514)

Tiny old-fashioned, double, jewel pink flowers bloom in profusion. Low grassy-green foliage makes a great front border accent plant. (2-6" x 10") Zn3.



Dichondra argentea 'Silver Falls'

Kidneyweed (Code: 4959)

This low-growing, spreading plant is very heat and drought tolerant with silver, heart-shaped leaves. It can be used as a groundcover or in a hanging basket. (2-4" x 48") Zn9.



Epimedium pinnatum 'Colchicum'

Bishop's Hat (Code: 5956)

Bright yellow flowers are backed by reddish spurs on 12" stems. Spreading foliage is dark green, thick and evergreen. (12" x 18") Zn5.



Prostrate or vining growth habit



Epimedium pubigerum

Bishop's Hat (Code: 7486)

This drought-tolerant species forms compact mounds of green foliage that remains through most of the winter. Red-tinted buds open to coral-blushed cream flowers in spring. An excellent groundcover under trees. (10-18" x 18") Zn5.



Epimedium x rubrum

Bishop's Hat (Code: 7342)

Deep reddish-pink and white, 1/2" flowers float on wiry stems above red-rimmed new foliage in spring. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 15") Zn5.



Epimedium x youngianum 'Niveum'

Bishop's Hat (Code: 6671)

Clusters of pure white 3/4" flowers top copper-hued new leaves May to June. The compact habit makes it an excellent deciduous groundcover under trees when planted in groups. Good fall color. (6-10" x 18") Zn5.



Erigeron x moerheimii

Santa Barbara Daisy (Code: 4042)

Soft pink daisies smother this trailing, airy plant. Seldom out of bloom, it is useful as a small scale groundcover, trailing over walls or in containers. (4" x 12-24") Zn7.



Erysimum kotschyianum 'Orange Flame'

Creeping Alpine Wallflower (Code: 2638)

Lovely, warm orange flowers adorn this prostrate alpine charmer. Adds bright color to the rockery garden or mixed border. (6" x 12") Zn6.



Fatshedera lizei 'Aureo Maculata'

Tree Ivy, Bush Ivy (Code: 6019)

A variegated cross between Fatsia japonica and Hedera helix. This evergreen shrub/vine has large leaves splashed freely with gold. Excellent for brightening deep shade, but it can also take sun. It can be staked or pruned as desired. (6-8' x 6') Zn7.



Fragaria chiloensis

Beach Strawberry (Code: 5005)

This NW native, glossy-leaved, prostrate strawberry makes an excellent evergreen groundcover that is tolerant of many different conditions. Simple white flowers in spring are followed by edible red berries. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Epimedium x perralchicum 'Frohnleiten'

Bishop's Hat (Code: 5955)

Red mottled foliage is topped by sprays of dainty butter-yellow flowers in spring and spreads 6-8" a year. A charming evergreen addition to the woodland garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 16") Zn5.



Epimedium x versicolor 'Sulphureum'

Bishop's Hat (Code: 5169)

Bright green, semi-evergreen, heart-shaped leaves are speckled red and brown. Airy scapes of soft yellow flowers appear in spring. Tolerant of dry, shaded locations, it's an excellent choice under trees. (4-12" x 12-24") Zn5.



Erigeron karvinskianus 'Profusion'

Santa Barbara Daisy (Code: 2612)

Small white daisies mature to pink and are borne in "profusion" on this charming, long-blooming perennial. (10" x 16") Zn7.



Erysimum 'Sunlight'

Wallflower (Code: 2642)

Sweetly-scented, sunny-yellow flowers grace this mounding perennial. An excellent low-growing accent; perfect for the rock garden. (6" x 18") Zn6.



Erysimum perovskianum 'Gold Rush'

Wallflower (Code: 4960)

An extremely fragrant variety with large yellow flower spikes in spring. This uniform, compact plant is an ideal choice for the rock garden. (6" x 10") Zn6.



Fragaria 'Lipstick'

Strawberry (Code: 6270)

Beautiful deep rose flowers top this glossy-leaved evergreen groundcover, in late spring to early summer. (4" x 24") Zn2.



Fragaria vesca

Woodland Strawberry (Code: 7270)

North American native deciduous woodland groundcover with 3 leaflets and white flowers in spring followed by small, sweet strawberries in summer. (2-4" x 18-24") Zn3.

Galium odoratum

Sweet Woodruff (Code: 8263)

Dainty white flowers bloom in profusion in spring above whorled foliage. It makes a superb low growing, spreading groundcover for shade. (2-4" x 24-36") Zn4.



Gaultheria shallon

Salal (Code: 6347)

Pacific Northwest evergreen groundcover or low spreading shrub that tolerates dry shade to full sun. Urn-shaped white flowers appear in spring and produce dark purple edible berries. Salal leaves are often used by florists. (18-30" x 24-36") Zn6.



Geranium cinereum 'Purple Pillow'

Grayleaf Geranium (Code: 3932)

Cup-shaped flowers are reddish-plum in color and accented by darker plum veins and central eye. It blooms all summer long at moderate temperatures. The low-growing, gray-green, deeply-lobed foliage is perfect in the rock garden. (2-4" x 12-16") Zn5. PP12829 Propagation Prohibited.



Geranium macrorrhizum 'Ingwerson's Variety'

Bigroot Hardy Geranium (Code: 5728)

Light pink flowers appear in late spring. Lush aromatic, spreading foliage will form a groundcover. This variety is drought and shade tolerant, making it a good evergreen choice for under trees. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn3.



Geranium sanguineum 'Lancastriense' ('Striatum')

Bloody Cranesbill (Code: 2716)

Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Biokovo'

Cranesbill, Hardy Geranium (Code: 2700)

Glossy, deep green leaves are topped by blush-pink flowers in late spring. This semi-evergreen groundcover is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 18") Zn4.



Gaultheria procumbens

Wintergreen (Code: 2690)

Elegant, North American native, evergreen groundcover for moist, well-drained, shaded areas. Tiny white bell-shaped flowers in spring produce red berries in fall with the taste of wintergreen. (2-3" x 24") Zn3.



Geranium cinereum 'Lawrence Flatman'

Grayleaf Geranium (Code: 2694)

Magenta-veined, dark lavender flowers top small, divided, wedge-shaped leaves in spring and summer. An excellent choice for the rock garden, it is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (10" x 18") Zn5.



Geranium macrorrhizum 'Album'

Bigroot Geranium (Code: 5697)

Clusters of scented white flowers rise above spreading, deer resistant, evergreen foliage that grows to form a groundcover. 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (15" x 20") Zn4.



Geranium macrorrhizum 'Variegatum'

Bigroot Geranium (Code: 4329)

Beautiful dusty gray-green, aromatic leaves are boldly splashed with cream, pale yellow and magenta. Vivid deep rose flowers are set off beautifully against foliage colors. Choice! 2009 "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn4.



Geranium sanguineum 'Max Frei'

Bloody Cranesbill (Code: 5808)

This lovely dwarf cultivar has a spreading habit and large rosy-magenta flowers that bloom from May to August. (4-6" x 12") Zn4.



Geranium sanguineum x procurrens 'Dilys'

Bloody Cranesbill (Code: 4823)

Soft magenta-purple flowers first appear in June and blooms sporadically until frost. Forms a large sprawling plant with good fall color. Performs best in moist soil. (3-9" x 36") Zn4.



Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Cambridge Blue'

Cranesbill, Hardy Geranium (Code: 5949)

Sun Rose (Code: 6877)

Sun Rose (Code: 5679)

Gypsophila cerastioides

Creeping Baby's Breath (Code: 2740)

Profuse, white, single flowers with violet veins, bloom on low-spreading foliage in spring. An excellent choice for rockery or edging. (2-3" x 24") Zn5.



Hebe albicans prostrata

Hebe (Code: 4187)

Low-growing, spreading form of Hebe albicans. Forms a multi-branched, bushy shrub that's evergreen and twice as wide as tall. Reddish buds become spikes of white flowers in June and July. (8-10" x 16-24") Zn7.



Helianthemum 'Belgravia Rose'

Sun Rose (Code: 3775)

Helianthemum 'Dazzler'

Sun Rose (Code: 2792)

Sun Rose (Code: 2797)

Herniaria glabra

Rupturewort (Code: 2843)

This evergreen, prostrate groundcover creates a thick mat that is excellent for banks and between pavers. The red-tinged winter foliage adds interest to any garden. (12" x 12") Zn4.

Chameleon Plant (Code: 2896)

Sweet Potato Vine (Code: 6241)

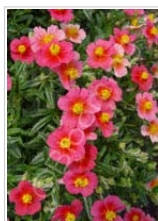

Sun Rose (Code: 2810)

Single, rose-pink flowers top soft silvery foliage. This drought tolerant, fast growing perennial makes an attractive evergreen groundcover when planted in groups. (12" x 18") Zn4.



Helianthemum nummularium 'Ben Ledi'

Sun Rose (Code: 5649)

Single, vibrant rose flowers have a deeper flush to their centers. This carefree, glossy-leaved perennial is evergreen and drought tolerant! (12" x 18") Zn4.



Helianthemum x 'Peach'

Sun Rose (Code: 2799)

Soft peach-hued flowers on wiry stems are held above green, glossy, evergreen foliage. This drought tolerant, fast growing perennial nicely accentuates the front of the border. (12" x 18") Zn4.



Helichrysum petiolare 'Limelight'

Licorice Plant (Code: 4371)

Herniaria glabra 'Sea Foam'

Striped Rupturewort (Code: 4242)

Striking heart shaped purple-black leaves with a matte finish will add rich texture and contrast to any container or border. A compact yet bushy variety. (12-14" x 30-46") Zn10.



Ipomoea batatas 'Desana'® Bronze'

Sweet Potato Vine (Code: 7787)

Heart-shaped bronze leaves have shorter internodes than other Ipomoea cultivars, giving a more compact growth habit. Excellent for planters and baskets. (8-12" x 24-36") Zn10.

Ipomoea batatas 'Desana® Lime'

Sweet Potato Vine (Code: 7788)

Heart-shaped chartreuse leaves have shorter internodes than other Ipomoea cultivars, giving a more compact growth habit. Excellent for planters and baskets. (8-12" x 24-36") Zn10.



Ipomoea batatas 'Sweet Georgia Red Heart'

Sweet Potato Vine (Code: 7577)

Red-purple heart-shaped leaves spread vigorously on the ground to create a temporary groundcover. It also is commonly used to trail out of containers and baskets. (4-6" x 24-36") Zn10.



Lamium 'Lemon Frost'

Deadnettle (Code: 7593)

Deep lavender-pink flowers top chartreuse, heart-shaped leaves in late spring and summer. It creates a bold contrast in shady areas where bright color is often needed.

(6-8" x 12-18") Zn4. PP20723



Lamium maculatum 'Elizabeth de Haas'

Deadnettle (Code: 5582)

The green leaves have silvery markings in the midrib. Dark lavender-pink flowers appear in summer. It's beautiful when trailing from pots or as a groundcover for shade. (6" x 24") Zn4.



Lamium maculatum 'Gold Nuggets'

Deadnettle (Code: 4567)

Each brilliant gold and green leaf has a striking blaze of white in the center. Pink flowers add further appeal in late spring. This triple colored confection creates drama spilling out of mixed containers or in the landscape. (3-4" x 12") Zn4.



Lamium maculatum 'Red Nancy'

Deadnettle (Code: 4768)

Silver leaves with narrow green edges nicely contrast deep rose-pink flowers late spring and summer. It makes a wonderful groundcover for shady spots. (6" x 18") Zn4.



Laurentia fluiatilis

Blue Star Creeper (Code: 3007)

This popular groundcover is covered with tiny blue, star-shaped flowers May to September. It handles foot traffic well and is excellent between pavers or as a lawn substitute. (12" x 16") Zn5.



Ipomoea batatas 'Margarita'

Sweet Potato Vine (Code: 6242)

Jasminum officinale 'Fiona Sunrise'

Jasmine (Code: 4675)

Lamium maculatum 'Anne Greenaway'

Deadnettle (Code: 4690)

Showy lavender flowers grace dramatic gold, green, and silver foliage. It makes a wonderful groundcover for shady spots. (6" x 24") Zn3.



Lamium maculatum 'Ghost'

Deadnettle (Code: 7662)

Standing about 1 foot tall, the all-silver leaves create a billowy cloud of silver in the garden. The leaves are twice as big as most Lamium. Clusters of large, bright orchid-purple flowers top the dump of silver foliage from late spring through early summer. The contrast of flowers and foliage stops people in their tracks! Lamium maculatum 'Pink Pewter'

Deadnettle (Code: 3001)

Deadnettle (Code: 3002)

Silvery leaves with a narrow green edge are topped by white flowers in spring and summer. A beautiful selection for containers or hanging baskets, it brightens up shady gardens. (6" x 18") Zn4.



Leptinella squalida

Brass Buttons (Code: 2450)

Small, bronze-green, feathery foliage is great between stepping stones. This very tight, low-growing evergreen groundcover is exceptional! (1" x 24") Zn6.

Brass Buttons (Code: 4562)

Liriope muscari 'Big Blue'

Lilyturf (Code: 3046)

Spreading, grass-like foliage is topped by grape hyacinth-like flower spikes in late summer. It makes an excellent evergreen groundcover. (8-10" x 18") Zn6.



Liriope spicata 'Silver Dragon'

Lilyturf (Code: 4747)

Long, grass-like green leaves are striped with ivory. Light lavender flowers in late summer are followed by black berries in fall. (18-24" x 12") Zn5.



Lonicera japonica 'Aureo-reticulata'

Goldnet Honeysuckle Vine (Code: 5642)

Prominent bright yellow veining on the fresh green, rounded leaves make this vine appear incandescent. Fragrant light yellow flowers add appeal. (20' x 4-6') Zn5.



Lysimachia congestiflora 'Persian Carpet'

Loosestrife (Code: 3815)

This groundcover forms a carpet of small dark green leaves with bold red veining on a semi-evergreen plant. Golden flowers appear late spring. A Darrell Probst introduction. (4" x 24-36") Zn6. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Lysimachia nummularia

Creeping Jenny (Code: 3085)

Ruffled, round green leaves and bright yellow flowers adorn this trailing plant. Great for hanging baskets, containers or groundcover. It prefers moist soil. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Mahonia repens

Creeping Oregon Grape (Code: 6963)

Compound evergreen leaves look similar to holly. It forms a low-spreading groundcover with fragrant, small, yellow flowers that bloom from mid spring to early summer at the branch tips. This NW native is an excellent choice for dry shade. (12" x 30-36") Zn5.



Lindernia grandiflora

Blue Moneywort (Code: 4259)

Sparkling violet-blue flowers with white star-like centers top a spreading mat of tiny dark green, heart-shaped leaves. (2-3" x 24") Zn7.



Liriope muscari 'Silvery Sunproof'

Lilyturf (Code: 6603)

Leaves are green and white-striped in filtered sun, more green and yellow in shade. Lilac flower spikes appear late in the season. Spreads to form a low maintenance groundcover. (12-18" x 30-36") Zn6.



Lobelia Techno® Heat Electric Blue

Lobelia (Code: 7633)

Techno® Blue is covered with intense, cobalt blue flowers all season. Its semi-trailing, mounding habit has improved heat tolerance. A great addition to containers and hanging baskets. (6-8" x 18-36") Zn10.



Lonicera periclymenum 'Peaches and Cream'

Honeysuckle (Code: 7797)

Fragrant, summer-blooming vine makes a gorgeous display of creamy yellow and soft pink flowers. Attracts hummingbirds. Evergreen in mild climates. (5-6' x 1.5-2.5') Zn4. PPAF



Lysimachia congestiflora 'Persian Chocolate'

Loosestrife (Code: 3877)

Striking chocolate-hued leaves and bright yellow spring flowers make this low-spreading form a fantastic groundcover! The semi-evergreen foliage is vigorous but not invasive. (4" x 24-36") Zn6. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Lysimachia nummularia 'Aurea'

Creeping Jenny (Code: 3084)

Brilliant golden leaves and bright yellow flowers adorn this trailing plant. Great for hanging baskets, containers or as a groundcover. It prefers moist soil. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Mazus radicans 'Albiflorus'

Swamp Musk (Code: 5346)

This groundcover forms a dense, flat carpet of bright green. White flowers with a creamy-yellow throat, give brightness and color in spring and summer. (2-4" x 24-36") Zn5.

Mazus reptans

Creeping Mazus (Code: 5523)

Lavender flowers speckled with yellow top a bright green foliage mat. An excellent accent for the rockery, between pavers, or borders. Spreads quickly. (2" x 24") Zn5.



Mentha requienii

Corsican Mint (Code: 8122)

Tiny bright green leaves tightly hug the ground, and bear light foot traffic well. Leaves emit a fresh, minty fragrance when crushed, making it perfect between pavers. (Restricted in some areas) (12" x 12") Zn6.



Nierembergia repens

Cup Flower (Code: 3145)

This wonderful groundcover has 2" wide, showy white cups above mat-forming bright green leaves. (2" x 16") Zn7.



Ophiopogon japonicus 'Pam Harper'

Mondo Grass (Code: 5496)

Shining gold and green-striped variegation brightens shady beds. Light lavender flowers appear in summer. It forms a striking groundcover when planted en masse. (9" x 12-18") Zn7.



Origanum vulgare 'Aureum'

Golden Marjoram (Code: 5496)

Beautiful crinkled golden foliage is a nice color contrast for the rockery or garden edge. It has a mild oregano flavor that will enhance food when used fresh or dried. (4" x 16") Zn6.



Origanum vulgare 'Humile'

Dwarf Greek Oregano (Code: 8140)

Creeping stems form a mat of evergreen foliage on this flowering groundcover. The leaves have a pungent aroma and flavor, and can be used fresh or dried. (2" x 16") Zn5.



Origanum vulgare 'Variegata'

Tricolored Marjoram (Code: 8102)

Beautiful prostrate marjoram has variegated leaves splashed with green, gold and cream. Excellent for contrast in the border or herb garden. Use fresh or dried leaves for flavoring food. (5" x 18") Zn6.



Mentha pulegium

Dwarf Pennyroyal (Code: 8150)

Fresh green foliage forms a dense, weed-proof mat. Highly recommended as a groundcover in large, shady areas where mowing is difficult. It is also a natural mosquito and flea repellent. (Restricted in some areas) (6-12" x 18") Zn7.



Muehlenbeckia axillaris

Creeping Wire Vine (Code: 6848)

Low-growing New Zealand native has dark wiry stems that contort, curl and bend. Small attractive green leaflets and fruit is a translucent white with black seeds. Great for topiary. (4-10" x 12-18") Zn3.



Ophiopogon japonicus 'Nanus'

Dwarf Mondo Grass (Code: 5078)

Dark forest-green, grass-like foliage forms a low-growing, spreading groundcover. Light lavender flowers in summer become navy-blue berries in fall. Great for underplanting or edging. (5" x 18") Zn7.



Ophiopogon planiscapus 'Ebony Knight'

Black Mondo Grass (Code: 4429)

Eye-catching, strap-like leaves of an almost black hue lend subtle sophistication to the perennial garden. Palest purple-white flowers appear in summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 12") Zn6.



Origanum vulgare 'Dr. Letswaart'

Golden Oregano (Code: 8136)

Beautiful golden foliage adds great color contrast to the garden. Nice mild flavor makes it good for culinary use, fresh or dried. (3-4" x 18") Zn5.



Origanum vulgare 'Nana'

Dwarf Marjoram (Code: 8101)

Dark green compact mounds produce a layer of pink flowers. Flavorful leaves can be picked fresh or dried for culinary use. (6-12" x 12-24") Zn5.



Origanum vulgare 'Variegatum'

Variegated Oregano (Code: 4170)

Spreading green leaves are streaked with creamy-ivory. The foliage is equally beautiful in the herb garden or mixed border. (6-10" x 24") Zn6.

Origanum x majoricum

Hardy Marjoram (Code: 5638)

This excellent culinary marjoram is truly a hardy perennial. White flowers that appear in summer add to its appeal. (16" x 18") Zn5.



Oxalis crassipes 'Alba'

White Wood Sorrel (Code: 3094)

Sparkling white, single flowers rise above a dumping mound of shamrock foliage. Blooms appear spring through summer. It's perfect beneath shrubs. (6-8" x 18-24") Zn6.



Oxalis oregana

Redwood Sorrel (Code: 5473)

This charming NW native shamrock features simple white flowers in spring and summer. A sweet addition for the woodland garden, it will spread to form an excellent groundcover. (7" x 30") Zn3.



Parthenocissus henryana

Silvervein Creeper (Code: 6735)

Palmately-compound leaves with silver veins turn a brilliant red in fall. Insignificant green flowers in summer are followed by dark blue berries in fall. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-20' x 8-12') Zn6.



Parthenocissus quinquefolia

Virginia Creeper (Code: 6499)

A vigorous vine to cover trellises, fences or buildings. Also a good groundcover on slopes, and to control erosion. Five-lobed leaves turn brilliant orange-to-crimson in fall. (25' x 6-10') Zn4.



Persicaria affinis 'Dimity'

Fleeceflower (Code: 5727)

A low-growing, very showy groundcover. It forms a carpet of green leathery foliage that turns bronze in the fall. Short spikes of pink flowers appear in summer. (8-12" x 8") Zn3.



Persicaria campanulata

Fleeceflower (Code: 6887)

Branching heads of tiny pink flowers appear on spikes, June to September. Deeply-veined, dark green, oval leaves have a brown felted underside. Compact and mat-forming. (12-18" x 36") Zn5.



Peucedanum ostruthium 'Daphnis'

Variegated Masterwort (Code: 7581)

Broad, gray-green leaves are edged in cream. White flowers emerge in umbels like Queen Anne's lace in June and July. It grows best in rich soil in partial shade and slowly spreads to form a groundcover that's not invasive. (10-16" x 24") Zn5.



Phlox stolonifera 'Blue Ridge'

Woodland Phlox (Code: 3298)

Dainty, pretty blue flowers grace this floriferous woodland groundcover. A charming evergreen selection for a naturalized setting. 1990 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. (6" x 12") Zn4.



Phlox stolonifera 'Home Fires'

Woodland Phlox (Code: 3302)

Masses of fragrant, deep pink flowers top low and spreading, evergreen foliage in spring. A wonderful easy to grow, floriferous variety for part shade. 1990 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. (8" x 12") Zn4.



Pratia angulata 'Treadwellii'

White Star Creeper (Code: 4375)

Large white, starry flowers top this very flat creeper. Dark green, spreading foliage forms a dense mat that is excellent between pavers. (2" x 12") Zn7.



Pratia pedunculata 'Celestial Spice'

Blue Star Creeper (Code: 4755)

Deepest violet-blue, starry flowers cover a dark green, spreading foliage mat, June to August. It takes some foot traffic and looks great between stepping stones. (3" x 12") Zn7.



Pratia pedunculata 'County Park'

Blue Star Creeper (Code: 6772)

Vivid azure-blue flowers cover a dark green, spreading mat of foliage. It's excellent used around stepping stones and pavers, or as edging. (3-4" x 12") Zn7.



Raoulia australis

Sheep Plant (Code: 3392)

Low-spreading mat of succulent silvery foliage gets a dusty gold bloom in late summer. An unusual accent for the rockery or trough garden. Sensitive to prolonged winter wet. (12" x 16") Zn6.



Prostrate or vining growth habit



Rosa 'Climbing Cecile Brunner'

Rose (Code: 6218)

Climbing form of the popular 'Sweetheart' Rose, with fragrant double, light pink flowers with repeat bloom. This vigorous and healthy climber is long-lived. (15-26' x 15') Zn5.



Rosmarinus prostratus 'Irene'

Trailing Rosemary (Code: 6344)

Beautiful trailing habit makes this a winner for draping over walls and banks. Profuse deep blue flowers appear in late winter and early spring. A choice selection! (6-12" x 30-36") Zn7. PP9124 Propagation Prohibited.



Sagina subulata

Irish Moss (Code: 2985)

The moss-like, dense green mat of foliage is occasionally covered with tiny white flowers. Excellent for use between pavers, in rockeries or as an evergreen groundcover. It needs regular moisture and good drainage. (1-2" x 12") Zn4.



Saponaria ocymoides

Soapwort (Code: 3418)

Pretty pink flowers smother this low-growing gem in early summer. The dense, spreading habit is ideal for trailing over banks, terraces, or low walls. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Saxifraga x urbium 'Aurea-punctata'

Rockfoil (Code: 3437)

Airy clouds of delicate tiny white flowers on red stems top rosettes of green and gold-splashed leaves. It makes a bright accent for shady locations. (1' x 1') Zn7.



Sedum 'Silver Moon'

Stonecrop (Code: 3462)

A NW native hybrid between *S. laxum* and *S. spathulifolium* was discovered by the late Helen Payne. Interesting chartreuse-silver, evergreen rosettes are marked with pink and red tones. (4" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum album 'Black Pearl'

White Flowering Stonecrop (Code: 6271)

The creeping bronze-purple succulent evergreen foliage holds its color well into summer. White panicles appear in summer. It can be used in containers, rock gardens, trailing over rock walls or as a groundcover. (2-3" x 12-24") Zn4.



Rosmarinus prostratus 'Haifa'

Trailing Rosemary (Code: 2681)

Dense, trailing foliage is accented by delicate pale blue flowers that appear in spring and summer. Great for hanging baskets or containers. It needs excellent drainage. (6" x 30") Zn8.



Rubus pentalobus 'Formosan Carpet'

Creeping Raspberry (Code: 5423)

This groundcover is ideal for covering large areas, to control erosion, or for trailing over walls. White flowers in summer are followed by golden berries in fall. Fast-spreading and low maintenance, it is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 12") Zn7.



Sagina subulata 'Aurea'

Scotch Moss (Code: 3463)

The moss-like, evergreen, golden mat of foliage is occasionally covered with tiny white flowers. Excellent between pavers, in rockeries and the shade garden. It needs regular moisture and good drainage. (1-2" x 12") Zn4.



Saxifraga hypnoides

Rockfoil (Code: 3429)

Lovely finely-textured mossy foliage forms a low-spreading mat. Pretty and delicate white flowers on slender stems appear in early summer. Protect from hot sun. (3" x 12") Zn6.



Saxifraga x urbium 'London Pride'

Rockfoil (Code: 3435)

Airy clouds of pale rosy flowers make this plant a perennial favorite. Large, robust, spatheolate leaves add interest. (1" x 18") Zn7.



Sedum album 'Athoum'

Stonecrop (Code: 7645)

Plump, round, evergreen leaves are much larger than the species and remain apple-green in winter. The leaves will often turn slightly red in the heat of summer when the white flowers appear. It's wonderful as a groundcover for sunny sites. (2-4" x 18-24") Zn4.



Sedum album 'Chloroticum'

Stonecrop (Code: 4581)

Miniature, pale green, evergreen leaves brighten alpine planters or rock gardens. White starry flowers bloom in summer. (1-3" x 12") Zn3.

Sedum album 'Coral Carpet'

White Flowering Stonecrop (Code: 3467)

Succulent foliage is red in cooler temperatures, turning green in summer. Lovely white flowers appear in summer. Use in the rock garden or as an evergreen groundcover. (3" x 12") Zn4.



Sedum album var. micranthum 'Orange Ice'

Stonecrop (Code: 4441)

Tiny evergreen foliage takes on orange hues in fall and winter and then turns green again in spring and summer. White flowers appear in July. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.



Sedum anacampseros

Stonecrop (Code: 3468)

This low, spreading Sedum has attractive grayish-blue, rounded leaves. Rosy-purple flowers appear in July. A great choice for the rockery. (4-6" x 12") Zn5.



Sedum caudicola 'Lidakense'

Stonecrop (Code: 5317)

Eye-catching small deep purple leaves adorn this compact succulent. Rosy-red flowers appear from late summer to fall. Perfect for the rockery, it is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4" x 12") Zn5.



Sedum cyaneum

Stonecrop (Code: 3471)

Showy rose-hued flowers adorn strikingly-beautiful, succulent blue leaves in summer. A lovely, low-growing addition to any garden. It is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3" x 16") Zn6.



Sedum divergens

Cascade Stonecrop (Code: 4391)

Chubby, shiny deep green, evergreen leaves turn bluish-red in sun and cold. It slowly spreads to form a groundcover that is great for rock gardens and rock walls. Yellow flowers appear midsummer. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.



Sedum ewersii

Stonecrop (Code: 3474)

Pretty gray leaves with red margins are topped by pink flowers in late summer. An attractive accent for the sunny garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum hybridum 'Immergrunnen'

Stonecrop (Code: 4431)

A vigorous, semi-evergreen, green leaf form of Sedum with yellow flowers in July and again in September. Foliage turns amber in winter. (1-3" x 12-24") Zn3.



Sedum album 'Green Ice'

Stonecrop (Code: 4426)

Rich olive-green, evergreen foliage forms a low-growing mat and does not turn red in winter like others in this genus. Icy-white, star-shaped flowers appear mid-summer. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.



Sedum album var. micranthum 'Red Ice'

Stonecrop (Code: 4443)

Named for the deep red color of the tiny evergreen foliage in fall and winter. The foliage turns blue-green again in spring and summer. White flowers appear in July. (1-2" x 6-12") Zn3.



Sedum anglicum 'Love's Triangle'

Stonecrop (Code: 7700)

Mats of tiny, powder blue leaves are topped by single, pale pink bloom in late spring and early summer. An excellent plant for the rock garden, alpine trough or between stepping stones. (1-2" x 6-12") Zn3.



Sedum confusum

Stonecrop (Code: 6226)

This mounding, evergreen Sedum is bushy and compact in growth. Large, bright yellow terminal panicles 3-4" across top shiny oval, green leaves. (10-12" x 12-15") Zn8.



Sedum dasphyllum 'Major'

Stonecrop (Code: 6933)

This low-growing Sedum has pebble-like, succulent bluish-green foliage that has a purple-mauve tint. A good groundcover for hot, dry conditions. Tiny white flowers appear in early summer. (4" x 18") Zn6.



Sedum ellacombianum

Stonecrop (Code: 4392)

Light green fleshy, succulent foliage grows vigorously to form a groundcover. Lemon-yellow flowers appear in June. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3-4" x 12-24") Zn3.



Sedum hakonense 'Chocolate Ball'

Stonecrop (Code: 7462)

Needle-like, succulent foliage ranges in color from milk-chocolate brown in the spring to dazzling red in the fall. Yellow flowers appear in summer. (4-6" x 12-16") Zn7.



Sedum kamschatcicum 'The Edge'

Kamschatka Stonecrop (Code: 4455)

Light green foliage with distinct yellow margins make this plant very striking even when not in flower. Star-shaped yellow flowers appear in summer. (6" x 12") Zn4.

Sedum kamtschaticum 'Variegatum'

Kamschatka Stonecrop (Code: 3475)

This low-growing and deciduous form has glowing green and cream-variegated leaves that are occasionally tinged pink. Golden-yellow flowers emerge from red buds in summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 16") Zn4.



Sedum laxum

Stonecrop (Code: 3476)

Blue-green evergreen rosettes of 3/4" spatulate leaves are topped with light yellow flowers in late summer. An excellent NW native plant for the rockery, it should be planted more often! (4-6" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum makinoi 'Limelight'

Stonecrop (Code: 7334)

Lime-green, dime-sized leaves form a dense and spreading mat. Yellow flowers appear in summer. It grows best in filtered shade. (3" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum makinoi 'Variegata'

Stonecrop (Code: 4343)

This low-growing, mat-forming Sedum has small light green leaves with creamy-white edges. Yellow flowers appear in summer. An excellent choice for the rockery or containers. (1" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum pluricaule 'Island of Sakhalin'

Stonecrop (Code: 5802)

This slender, sprawling perennial features rosy-pink flowers. Green succulent foliage becomes tinged with red in cool weather. (3" x 12") Zn3.



Sedum reflexum 'Green Spruce'

Stonecrop (Code: 3914)

The low-growing evergreen, spruce-like, succulent foliage is perfect for a sunny rock garden. Yellow flowers appear in July. (1-3" x 18") Zn3.



Sedum rupestre 'Sea Gold'

Stonecrop (Code: 4444)

From late spring to late summer, needle-like, evergreen foliage turns chartreuse-yellow. In fall, the foliage has red tips and then in winter turns primarily green. Bright gold flowers appear in July. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.



Sedum kamtschaticum 'Weihenstephaner Gold'

Kamschatka Stonecrop (Code: 3913)

This easy to grow, spreading groundcover with semi-evergreen succulent foliage has bright yellow flowers in June. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 12-16") Zn3.



Sedum lydium

Stonecrop (Code: 3477)

Very low-growing, textural bright green mat takes on an attractive red tint in cool weather. Small white flowers appear in summer. (1" x 8") Zn3.



Sedum makinoi 'Ogon'

Stonecrop (Code: 6971)

Fabulous contrast plant with bright golden foliage, very tiny leaves, and a low, creeping habit. Greenish-yellow flowers appear in summer. It grows best in filtered shade. (2" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum oregonum

Oregon Stonecrop (Code: 3499)

Rosettes of smooth evergreen leaves are periodically tinged with pink. Yellow flowers appear in summer. Excellent spreading NW native groundcover for the rockery or container. (2-3" x 12") Zn5.



Sedum reflexum 'Blue Spruce'

Stonecrop (Code: 6932)

The blue-green spruce-like, succulent foliage is topped by bright yellow flowers in early summer. A great evergreen groundcover for hot, dry conditions, but it also thrives in part shade. (6-8" x 24") Zn3.



Sedum rupestre 'Angelina'

Stonecrop (Code: 3306)

The brilliant golden-yellow, needle-shaped, evergreen foliage is terrific for containers, beds or as a groundcover. Yellow flowers appear in summer. (4" x 12-24") Zn3.



Sedum rupestre 'Variegata'

Stonecrop (Code: 6334)

Mat-forming, blue green needle-like foliage has bright yellow growing tips. Yellow flowers appear in early summer. This evergreen, drought tolerant succulent can be used in rock gardens, borders or containers. Easy to grow in well-drained, average soil. Attractive to butterflies and is deer resistant. (4-8" x 18-24") Zn3.

Stonecrop (Code: 3920)

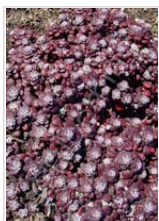

Stonecrop (Code: 3481)

Gray-green succulent leaves with red margins are topped by bright pink flowers in late summer. A stunning addition to the sunny garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 12") Zn3.



Sedum spathulifolium 'Purpureum'

Stonecrop (Code: 3485)

Eye-catching silvery-blue & reddish-purple leaves age to burgundy on this dump-forming NW native succulent. Yellow flowers appear in June. It creates a dramatic, spreading evergreen groundcover. (4" x 12-18") Zn6.



Sedum spurium 'Elizabeth' ('Red Carpet')

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 3922)

This vigorous groundcover has starry deep pink-to-red flowers in late spring and summer. The foliage is red in spring, then turns green in summer, and finally turns deep red again in fall. (3-4" x 12-24") Zn3.



Sedum spurium 'Green Mantle'

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 4351)

Large, vibrant green, succulent leaves hug the ground to form a low maintenance carpet. Crisp white summer flowers attract butterflies. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.



Sedum spurium 'Purpureteppich' ('Purple Carpet')

Purple Carpet Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 3497)

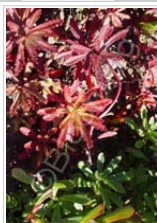

Sedum stefco

Stonecrop (Code: 4447)

Tiny evergreen succulent leaves turn scarlet-purple in winter. White flowers appear in summer. It is similar in appearance to Sedum album, but with tighter flowering and growth habit. (1-3" x 6-12") Zn3.



Sedum sichotense

Stonecrop (Code: 3921)

A rare, very small, slow-growing species with tiny, flat leaves that grow on purple stems. Clusters of yellow blossoms appear in summer. Native to eastern Ukraine. (2-3" x 6") Zn4.



Sedum spathulifolium 'Cape Blanco'

Stonecrop (Code: 3484)

Sedum spurium 'Dragon's Blood' ('Schorbuser Blut')

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 4246)

This vigorously-spreading groundcover has bronze foliage that turns deep red in cool weather. Red flowers appear in late summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (1-3" x 18-30") Zn3.



Sedum spurium 'Fuldaglut'

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 4288)

This improved form of Sedum 'Dragon's Blood' has more consistent bronze-red foliage throughout the season. Rose-red, star-like flowers appear in summer. A Great Plant Pick for the Pacific Northwest! (1-3" x 12-24") Zn3.



Sedum spurium 'Pink Jewel'

Stonecrop (Code: 3495)

Neat, green succulent leaves form a spreading carpet and pretty pink flower clusters appear in summer. It makes a nice drought tolerant groundcover. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4" x 12-18") Zn4.



Sedum spurium 'Tricolor'

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 3500)

This incredible succulent has foliage that's variegated pink, white, gray and green. Jewel pink flowers appear in late summer. Beautiful! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3" x 12-18") Zn4.



Sedum x hybrida 'John Creech'

Stonecrop (Code: 3916)

This is one of the best Sedums for a groundcover! It forms a mat of foliage 2"-3" tall and spreads 12" or more. Pink flowers appear in June. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2-3" x 12-18") Zn3.

Selaginella 'Blue Tuffet'

Club Moss (Code: 7033)

This low growing club moss has dainty blue-green foliage. It makes an excellent filler for containers or use in shaded areas between pavers and rocks. (2-3" x 12") Zn6.



Selaginella 'Golden Tuffet'

Club Moss (Code: 7034)

This finely-textured club moss has golden new growth that appears brightest in spring, then fades to soft chartreuse by summer. It makes an excellent filler for containers or use in shaded areas between pavers and rocks. (2-3" x 12") Zn6.



Selaginella kraussiana 'Aurea'

Golden Club Moss (Code: 4555)

This finely-textured club moss forms a nice groundcover. Golden new growth appears brightest in spring, then fades to a soft chartreuse by summer. (2-3" x 12-16") Zn6.



Sidalcea malviflora 'Palustre'

False Mallow (Code: 6521)

Rosy-pink 1.5" cup-shaped flowers sparkle atop dark, scalloped foliage. Creeping stems weave through the border. This rare form makes a very pretty groundcover. (4-10" x 12-24") Zn6.



Silene uniflora 'Druett's Variegated'

Alpine Campion (Code: 6452)

Distinctive cream and silver-variegated, glaucous leaves, are topped by white blooms in summer. The evergreen foliage is tinged pink in cool weather. (2" x 12") Zn3.



Solanum crispum 'Glasnevin'

Potato Bush (Code: 6692)

Clusters of yellow-eyed, purple "shooting star" flowers adorn this attractive shrub throughout summer. It needs winter protection in colder areas. (10' x 9') Zn7.



Soleirolia soleirolia

Baby Tears (Code: 3563)

Tiny bright green leaves and white flowers make this an excellent groundcover. Use between pavers and in shady areas. Tender, but it often comes back from the roots. (1" x 12") Zn8.



Stachys b. 'Countess Helen von Stein Zeppelin'

Lamb's Ear (Code: 5717)

Felted silver, evergreen leaves resist rot more than many in this group and have distinct veining. Leaves are longer and broader than the species. It rarely blooms. (12" x 18-24") Zn4.



Stachys byzantina 'Primrose Heron'

Lamb's Ear (Code: 5716)

Large, soft, chartreuse foliage is delightful in spring. The foliage later fades to silver. It adds a wonderful touch of color to the garden year-round. (12" x 18") Zn4.



Stachys byzantina 'Silky Fleece'

Lamb's Ear (Code: 3672)

A dwarf form of lamb's ear, it forms a soft dense evergreen mat that will carpet well-drained soils. Short spikes of tiny plum-colored flowers appear in summer. (4-10" x 12-18") Zn4.



Stachys byzantina 'Silver Carpet'

Lamb's Ear (Code: 3573)

Fuzzy, silvery, evergreen leaves are invaluable for providing nice foliage contrast in the mixed border. This variety rarely blooms, but has a nice low & spreading habit. (8" x 24") Zn4.



Thymus 'Gold Transparent'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3603)

Shimmering gold and green foliage grows low and fast for a sun-loving, hardy, evergreen groundcover. Lilac blooms appear late summer. (3" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus doerfleri 'Bressingham'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 5943)

A carpet of fuzzy gray-green, evergreen leaves and soft pink flowers makes it a dainty accent for the rockery, between pavers, or at borders edge. Best in full sun with good drainage. (4" x 18") Zn4.



Thymus herba-barona

Caraway Thyme (Code: 8245)

Dark green leaves have a delightful caraway scent and flavor. Good in culinary dishes; especially stir fry and meat. It's ideal for the rock garden. (4" x 16") Zn6.

Thymus longicaulis

Creeping Thyme (Code: 7716)

This spreading evergreen carpet of foliage has pink flowers in summer. Small pine scented leaves can be used to flavor meats. (3-5" x 18-24") Zn5.



Thymus praecox 'Albus'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3614)

Starry white flowers top tiny bright green leaves. It forms a fragrant, tightly-matted groundcover underfoot; perfect along pathways or between pavers. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Coccineus'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3612)

Dainty rose-red flowers completely cover this creeping thyme in summer. The evergreen foliage turns somewhat red in winter. (2-3" x 18") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Hartington Silver'

Silver Creeping Thyme (Code: 4709)

Creeping English thyme with beautiful, aromatic, tiny green leaves edged in gold. It makes an excellent mat-forming, evergreen groundcover or use between pavers. (2-3" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Minus'

Miniature Creeping Thyme (Code: 3615)

Tiny, overlapping, gray-green, evergreen leaves form a low mat. Small pink flowers appear midsummer. Nice for planting between pavers. (1" x 10") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Nutmeg'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 8256)

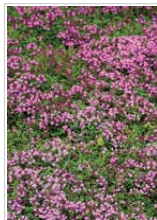
A profusion of deep purple-carmine blooms cover this tight, deep green, evergreen groundcover in summer. It is drought tolerant and sun loving. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Pink Chintz'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3609)

Thymus praecox 'Reiter's Red'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 4449)

Rich olive-green, evergreen foliage grows thick and tough, making it an ideal groundcover or alternative for grass. Lavender-pink flowers add to its appeal mid-summer. (2-3" x 18") Zn5.



Thymus pseudolanuginosus

Woolly Thyme (Code: 3606)

Soft, completely prostrate, silvery-green, evergreen foliage has pink flowers in summer. It handles foot traffic well and is excellent for use between pavers. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus pulegioides 'Foxley'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 4448)

Mounds of soft, shiny, cream & green-variegated evergreen foliage contrasts nicely with dark pink blooms in summer. Perfect in rockeries, along paths or the herb garden. (8" x 12") Zn7.



Thymus thracicus 'Lavender'

Lavender-Scented Thyme (Code: 5461)

Wonderful needle-leaved culinary thyme has a rich fragrance similar to lavender. It can also be used as a drought tolerant, evergreen groundcover. (10" x 18") Zn5.



Thymus vulgaris 'Dot Wells'

French Thyme (Code: 3759)

An upright grower ideal for the culinary garden. Pale pink flowers bloom from summer to fall over the very fragrant foliage. (6-12" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus vulgaris 'English Wedgewood'

French Thyme (Code: 5412)

This lovely mound-forming, evergreen thyme has good flavor and is excellent for the culinary herb garden. Pink flowers appear in early summer. (9" x 14") Zn6.

French Thyme (Code: 5460)

Thymus vulgaris 'Orange Balsam'

Orange Thyme (Code: 5531)

Wonderful orange fragrance and flavor! Small gray, evergreen leaves are topped by the tiniest, palest lavender flowers. It's both ornamental and edible. (12" x 18") Zn5.



Thymus vulgaris 'Silver Posie'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 6860)

This beautiful thyme features fragrant deep green, evergreen leaves, each edged with a wide silvery-white margin. New growth appears with a nice rosy tinge. (6-10" x 18-24") Zn6.



Thymus x 'Pink Ripple'

Pink Ripple Thyme (Code: 5430)

Light green, lemon-scented foliage creates a spreading evergreen carpet topped by pink flowers in summer. An excellent choice for pathways, between pavers, or in the rockery. (6" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Archer's Gold'

Lemon Thyme (Code: 3602)

Creeping thyme with brilliant golden, evergreen foliage that is especially bright in winter and spring. Excellent between pavers or spilling around stones. (2' x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Argenteus'

Silver Variegated Lemon Thyme (Code: 8253)

Glossy ivory and gray-green foliage adds interest to the rockery. This slow-growing variety has an excellent lemon flavor. (8" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Aureus'

Gold Variegated Thyme (Code: 8251)

Small evergreen thyme with bright gold and gray-green foliage. Wonderful strong lemon flavor combines well with many chicken or fish dishes. Perfect in containers. (8" x 12") Zn6.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Doone Valley'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 5173)

Green foliage has irregular golden patches, which become red-tinted in winter. Fragrant lavender flowers appear from August through September. (4" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Lemon Frost'

Lemon Thyme (Code: 4160)

This excellent selection exudes the sweet and pure fragrance of lemons when walked upon. Profuse white flowers provide the "frost" in June and July. An excellent choice for an evergreen groundcover or between pavers. (4" x 12") Zn6.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Lime Gold'

Thyme (Code: 7779)

Creeping evergreen lime-gold foliage has a citrus fragrance. Pink flowers appear in summer. Excellent when used between flagstone or in the rock garden. (2-4" x 12-18") Zn5.

Lime Thyme (Code: 3761)

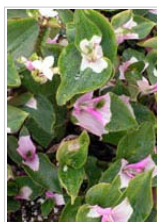
Bright chartreuse leaves brighten up any garden. It has a lovely citrus scent and pink flowers. A nice plant to border pathways or as an evergreen groundcover. (4" x 12-16") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Spicy Orange'

Citrus-Scented Thyme (Code: 6896)

This prostrate, needle-leaved thyme makes an excellent evergreen groundcover. Releasing a refreshing scent of oranges when crushed, it is perfect between pavers. (4" x 24") Zn5.



Tradescantia 'Blushing Bride'

Spiderwort (Code: 4579)

This trailing perennial is excellent for containers with leaves that are variegated pink, fading to white. The foliage color is best in winter and spring. Cut back often to encourage colorful new growth. Pink flowers appear in summer. (3-4" x 48") Zn8.

Dwarf Valerian (Code: 4358)

Very aromatic oval leaves form a thick carpet, covered with fragrant pink flowers in spring. This alpine plant quickly-spreads in sun or partial shade. (4" x 12") Zn4.



Verbena 'Homestead Purple'

Verbena (Code: 5227)

Rich dark purple flowers appear all summer long and are very attractive to butterflies! The dark green spreading foliage is mildew resistant. It's very vigorous and trouble-free. (8-16" x 24-36") Zn7.

Verbena 'Lapis Lazuli Blue'

Verbena (Code: 5215)

Clusters of brilliant deep blue-purple flowers provide non-stop color spring until frost! It has a cascading habit that is a perfect choice for planters. (6-10" x 12") Zn7.



Verbena 'Veralena Cherry'

Verbena (Code: 7584)

Cherry-red flowers bloom all summer long! The trailing foliage is excellent spilling out of containers or it can be used as a summer groundcover. (6-10" x 24-36") Zn7.



Veronica 'Reavis' ('Crystal River')

Speedwell (Code: 6666)

This evergreen groundcover form is both heat tolerant and vigorous. It grows rapidly and covers the garden with small, true blue flowers in mid-spring. (2-3" x 18-36") Zn4.



Veronica liwanensis

Turkish Speedwell (Code: 3671)

Clusters of bright blue flowers top tiny, round, glossy, evergreen leaves in summer. An excellent prostrate Veronica well suited to gardens in the Rocky Mountains and west coast. (1-3" x 24") Zn5.



Veronica peduncularis 'Georgia Blue'

Speedwell (Code: 6082)

This low-spreading, evergreen mound is smothered by round blue flowers with white eyes. This repeat bloomer is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6" x 18") Zn4.



Veronica repens

Speedwell (Code: 4425)

Dainty flowers of palest blue last all spring. It forms a deep green, spreading evergreen mat. An excellent lawn substitute; it fills in fast and suppresses weeds. (1" x 18") Zn5.



Vinca minor 'Bowie's Variety'

Periwinkle (Code: 3790)

Large, deep periwinkle-blue flowers top shiny green foliage in spring. This attractive, trouble-free, spreading evergreen groundcover can handle a variety of soils and conditions. (4-6" x 18-24") Zn4.



Verbena 'St. Paul' ('Sissinghurst')

Verbena (Code: 3749)

Showy green foliage is covered with hot pink flowers in early spring. Perfect for retaining walls or between stepping stones. It forms a low-growing mat. (6" x 24-36") Zn7.



Verbena peruviana 'Red'

Verbena (Code: 4031)

Bright red flowers bloom in profusion all summer on this spreading groundcover. Vigorous and beautiful cascading over rocks or slopes in the garden. (3-6" x 12-18") Zn7.



Veronica 'Waterperry Blue'

Speedwell (Code: 7370)

Profuse sky-blue flowers bloom all spring and summer on this low-growing creeper. An excellent evergreen groundcover, the foliage turns purple in winter for added interest. (4" x 18") Zn5.



Veronica montana 'Corrine Tremaine'

Speedwell (Code: 6742)

Beautiful low-growing groundcover with creamy-white and green-variegated leaves and tiny lilac flowers. Excellent selection for rockery or edge of the border. (3" x 12") Zn3.



Veronica prostrata 'Aztec Gold'

Speedwell (Code: 4041)

Bright gold, spreading mat of foliage forms a groundcover with 6" violet spikes in the spring. The foliage will turn chartreuse in partial shade. (4-6" x 12") Zn3. PP13354, EU13144 Propagation Prohibited.



Veronica repens 'Sunshine'

Speedwell (Code: 4756)

Tiny yellow leaves form an incredible golden carpet similar in habit to baby tears. Dainty ice-blue flowers appear in June. It makes an excellent groundcover. (1" x 18") Zn5.



Vinca minor 'Illumination'

Periwinkle (Code: 7364)

In spring, periwinkle-blue flowers provide bold contrast to brilliant gold leaves edged in green. Use it as trailing foliage in mixed containers or as an evergreen groundcover. (4" x 18") Zn4. PP12132 Propagation Prohibited.

Vinca minor 'Ralph Shugert'

Periwinkle (Code: 6455)

Dark green foliage is edged with distinctive cream margins that set off bright blue flowers in spring. This is a marvelous evergreen groundcover. (4-6" x 18-24") Zn4. PP6960 Propagation Prohibited.



Viola 'Heartthrob'

Hardy Violet (Code: 4145)

Heart-shaped leaves with bronze-purple markings appear in spring. Creates a nice groundcover when planted en masse. (4-8" x 12") Zn5. PP19996 Propagation Prohibited.



Viola 'Molly Sanderson'

Violet (Code: 5246)

Unique velvety black flowers with vivid yellow centers make this cultivar stand out in any garden or container. Blooms from late winter through spring. (6" x 12") Zn6.



Viola 'Rebecca'

Viola (Code: 4878)

Charming pure white violets feature slightly-ruffled, feathered purple edges spring through fall. A well-behaved addition to the mixed border or container planting. (6-10" x 8-12") Zn6.



Viola cornuta 'Etain'

Violet (Code: 3821)

Lovely light yellow flowers with lavender edges have a sweet fragrance. Compact and very free-flowering. It makes a great border and container plant. (4-6" x 6") Zn5.



Viola obliqua 'Royal Robe'

Marsh Violet (Code: 3702)

Remarkably-fragrant, dark purple flowers cover this charming perennial violet in early spring. A good choice for underplanting shrubs or massing in drifts. The blooms are edible. (6-8" x 12") Zn4.



Viola odorata 'Rosina'

Sweet Violet (Code: 4248)

Dusky pink, sweetly-fragrant flowers bloom in early spring over heart-shaped leaves. It prefers moist conditions. (2-4" x 6") Zn5.



Viola 'Columbine'

Violet, Pansies (Code: 4114)

Delicately tie-dyed violet and white miniature pansies are lightly fragrant with nice stems for cutting. A wonderful long-blooming and low maintenance selection. (4-6" x 12") Zn6.



Viola 'Irish Molly'

Violet (Code: 5245)

An absolutely stunning old-fashioned cottage garden favorite! Petals are maroon-brown overlaid with a shimmer of iridescent bronze and yellow shining through on lower petals. (6" x 12") Zn6.



Viola 'Purple Showers'

Violet (Code: 4432)

Deep purple flowers bloom continuously May through July, above deep green, glossy foliage. It often blooms again in fall. (6" x 18") Zn4.



Viola cornuta 'Bowl's Black'

Viola (Code: 6458)

Deepest midnight-blue, nearly-black, velvety violets grace this heavy-blooming, compact plant. Beautiful as it is unusual. (6-9" x 12") Zn6.



Viola labradorica

Labrador Violet (Code: 3706)

Dainty violet-blue flowers grace purple foliage May to June. It spreads to form an attractive groundcover. A great foil for many plants. (12" x 12") Zn2.



Viola odorata 'Blue Remington'

Sweet Violet (Code: 5157)

Large blue violets appear in profusion from late winter through spring and sometimes in fall. The glossy green foliage is neat and trouble-free. (6" x 15") Zn5.
