



#### Acanthus mollis

Bear's Breeches (Code: 2002)

Dramatic architectural plant with large tropical-looking, deep green, glossy leaves. Stunning purple and white spikes make a striking display in August. It will tolerate nearly any kind of soil. (3-5' x 3-4') Zn6.





Yarrow (Code: 2010)

Clusters of sulfur-yellow flowers top soft gray foliage most of the summer. This wonderful evergreen selection is a long time favorite with designers. (24" x 16") Zn4.





Achillea millefolium 'Appleblossom'

Yarrow (Code: 5113)

Bright lilac-pink flowers fade to pastel pink on this long-blooming and easy to grow garden favorite. It makes an excellent cut flower. (2' x 2') Zn3.





#### Achillea millefolium 'Lilac Beauty'

Yarrow (Code: 4565)

Lovely lilac pink flowers appear all summer. The flowers become lighter as they age, creating a multicolored effect that is very pleasing to the eye. It's perfect for the middle of the border. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn3.





Achillea millefolium 'Paprika'

Yarrow (Code: 2021)

Clusters of bright scarlet flowers with yellow centers fade beautifully to salmon-rose. Drought tolerant, easy to grow and good for bouquets. Long-blooming when deadheaded. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn3.





Achillea millefolium 'Summerwine'

Yarrow (Code: 4871)

Stunning wine-red flowers glow over feathery green foliage in early summer. It's perfect for sunny locations. (24-28" x 24") Zn3.





Achillea ptarmica 'Angel's Breath'

Yarrow (Code: 2025)

Masses of 1/2" wide, pure white, double flowers appear in early summer and fade to ivory. The deep green, "ferny" foliage is extremely drought tolerant. (16" x 24") Zn4.





#### Acanthus spinosus

Bear's Breeches (Code: 6203)

Striking mauve and gray-white flower spikes top showy deep green spiny leaves. An excellent accent plant. (4' x 2') Zn6.





Achillea 'Walter Funcke'

Yarrow (Code: 7483)

Brick-red flowers gradually fade to numerous lighter shades of orange-red. Silvery, drought tolerant foliage is the perfect foil for the long blooming flowers. (24" x 24")





Achillea millefolium 'Fireland'

Yarrow (Code: 6423)


Drought tolerant perennial featuring orange-red flowers with prominent golden centers. The flowers fade to salmon pink, then tawny gold, creating a fiery effect. (20" x 24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Oertel's Rose'

Yarrow (Code: 6795)

Bright orchid-pink blossoms slowly fade to nearly white. Hardy, drought tolerant and easy to grow. Showy all





Achillea millefolium 'Salmon Beauty'

Yarrow (Code: 2024)

Large, flat clusters of tiny blooms open in hues of deep salmon which brighten to soft pink. This drought tolerant and easy to grow selection also makes a great cut flower! (24-30" x 18-30") Zn3.





Achillea millefolium 'Terra Cotta'

Yarrow (Code: 6146)

Masses of dark salmon flowers mature to russet hues; the color of red clay! The fine feathery foliage is evergreen, easy to grow, and drought tolerant. (24-30" x 24-30") Zn3.





Aconitum henryi 'Spark's Variety'

Monkshood (Code: 5233)

Tall and dramatic dark purple-blue spikes have deeply-cut leaves. Makes an impact in the mixed border. Does not require staking. Stunning late-season color for partly shaded areas of the border. (3-5' x 2') Zn4.







Aconitum paniculatum 'Roseum'

Monkshood (Code: 4809)

Elegant spikes of palest pink hooded flowers climb tall stalks. Bright green, glossy foliage adds handsome contrast. Excellent late summer bloomer for cut arrangements. (36" x 24") Zn4.











Cobalt-blue globe-like umbels appear on 2' stalks above strap-like leaves in summer. An excellent choice for adding an exotic touch to containers or the garden. (24" x 12-24") Zn8.











Agapanthus africanus 'Peter Pan'

Lily of the Nile (Code: 3110)

Violet-blue flowers in stunning large round umbels display high above narrow, bright green, strappy leaves in summer. It prefers a hot spot with good drainage. (3' x 2')









Agastache 'Cotton Candy'

Hyssop (Code: 6625)

Light pink flower spikes bloom from midsummer to fall! Compact habit, drought tolerant and very attractive to hummingbirds. Requires good drainage. (18-24" x 18") Zn6. PP20991, PVR Propagation Prohibited.















Agastache 'Summer Glow'

Hyssop (Code: 6627)

Pale yellow flowers with dark calyces bloom all summer. Has a narrow upright habit with bright green foliage that is drought tolerant. Requires good drainage. (18-24" x 18") Zn6. PP20980, PVR Propagation Prohibited.















#### Agastache aurantiaca 'Apricot Sunrise'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 2009)

Delicate spikes of orange sherbert-colored flowers top shrubby gray-green foliage. Excellent for attracting butterflies and hummingbirds, and perfect for the middle of the mixed border! (24-30" x 12-18") Zn6.




















Rosy sunset-coral flowers dazzle summer to frost, above aromatic foliage. Hummingbirds adore this stunning plant. Excellent for cutting and requires good drainage. (30" x 18") Zn6.

















Aconitum septentrionale 'Ivorine'

Monkshood (Code: 5818)

Lovely spires of ivory flowers on a bushy 2-3' plant. Does best in moist soil with some shade during the hottest parts of the day. (4-5" x 20") Zn5.













Agapanthus 'Storm Cloud'

Lily of the Nile (Code: 7117)

Spectacular deep blue-violet flower heads stand high above grassy green foliage, followed by decorative seed pods. A terrific container plant that overwinters well indoors in colder climates. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2-3' x 2-3') Zn7.









Agastache 'Blue Fortune'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 6204)

Long lasting, deep lilac-blue flower spikes top fragrant foliage. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! One of the hardiest and dependable Agastache. (30" x 24") 7n6

















Hyssop (Code: 6626)

Large, dark raspberry-pink flowers bloom all summer and into fall! Attractive, bright green foliage is nicely fragrant and drought tolerant. Requires good drainage. (30" x 20") Zn6. PP20371, PVR Propagation Prohibited.

















Agastache 'Summer Sky'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 4586)

Glowing violet-blue flowers with dark calyxes bloom all summer above bright green foliage. With a compact habit, it always stays tidy and upright. Good drainage is needed for best performance. (14-16" x 16-20") Zn8. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.
















Citrus-scented foliage and bright orange-red tubular flowers bloom in summer. A hummingbird magnet. (12-18" x 12-18") Zn6.















Agastache barberi 'Tutti Frutti'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 6777)

One of the showiest varieties of agastache. Masses of deep pink flowers on tall stalks make a vivid backdrop. Has a wonderful fruity aroma! (36-48" x 18") Zn6.



















#### Agastache foeniculum 'Golden Jubilee'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 2678)

New foliage emerges gold, then turns bright lime-green. Lavender-blue flowers make this a standout in the garden. Leaves release a mint scent when lightly crushed. (20" x 15") Zn5.















Agastache mexicana 'Sangria'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 4051)

From July to October clusters of arching, red-purple blooms appear whorled around stems, one stacked on top of another. It grows up to 4' tall with lemon-scented foliage. A favorite of hummingbirds. (4' x 2-3') Zn7.













Agastache mexicana Acapulco 'Orange'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 3848)

Vibrant orange, tubular flowers add incredible color all summer to mixed containers and landscape plantings. A favorite of hummingbirds. (24-30" x 18") Zn7. PP16308 Propagation Prohibited.













Agastache mexicana Acapulco 'Salmon & Pink'

Anise Hyssop (Code: 3849)

Stunning multi-colored pink and salmon-hued flowers bloom all summer and are wonderful for landscape use and in mixed containers. A favorite of hummingbirds. (24-30" x 18") Zn7. PP16023 Propagation Prohibited.















Agropyron magellanicum

Blue Wheat Grass (Code: 3261)

Clumping grass with striking metallic blue foliage. A great accent in perennial borders and containers. (12-18" x 12-18") Zn5.





Alcea 'Indian Springs'

Hollyhock (Code: 2061)

Various single and semi-double flowers in shades of yellow, carmine, pink, cream or burgundy line tall stalks. An outstanding color mix. (6-8' x 2') Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Chater's Double Apricot'

Hollyhock (Code: 5234)

Beautiful, double, apricot-colored flowers on tall stalks grace this old-fashioned garden favorite. Excellent for cut flowers. (6" x 24") Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Chater's Double Purple'

Hollyhock (Code: 2063)

Excellent old-fashioned garden favorite. Lovely purple-red, double flowers crown tall stalks. (6' x 2') Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Chater's Double Red'

Hollyhock (Code: 2056)

Beautiful double, bright red flowers on tall stalks grace this old-fashioned garden favorite. (6' x 2') Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Chater's Double Salmon Pink'

Hollyhock (Code: 2055)

A great old-fashioned garden favorite! The tall green stalks gracefully hold beautiful double, salmon-pink flowers. (6' x 2') Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Chater's Double White'

Hollyhock (Code: 2057)

Beautiful double, sparkling-white flowers on tall stalks grace this old-fashioned garden favorite. (6' x 2') Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Chater's Double Yellow'

Hollyhock (Code: 2058)

Beautiful double, sunny yellow flowers on tall sturdy stalks, grace this old-fashioned garden favorite. Excellent for cut flowers. (6' x 2') Zn3.





Alcea rosea 'Nigra'

Hollyhock (Code: 2052)

Beautiful single, black-purple blooms on tall stalks grace this old-fashioned garden favorite. Excellent for cut flowers. (6' x 2') Zn3.





Allium senescens 'Glaucum'

Ornamental Onion (Code: 5084)

Soft lavender-pink, ball-shaped flowers top interesting curly blue foliage. Lovely and long-blooming, it is great for rock gardens. (6" x 12") Zn3.











### Andropogon gerardi 'Lord Snowdon'

Big Bluestem (Code: 4423)

Purple-hued flower spikes top striking silvery-blue blades in fall. The foliage turns an attractive soft plum after frost. (4-6' x 2') Zn4.





### Anemone hupehensis 'Prince Henry'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 2089)

Charming semi-double, rose-red flowers on wiry stems adorn this old-fashioned garden favorite. It adds a bright touch of color to the fall garden. (24" x 18") Zn5.













Anemone tomentosa 'Robustissima'

Grape Leaf Anemone (Code: 2097)

Soft-pink flowers 3" across bloom profusely on long stems in late summer and fall. This robust grower is the hardiest fall-blooming anemone. (3-4' x 3') Zn4.









Anemone x hybrida 'Alba'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 2094)

This pristine Japanese anemone boasts single, slightly cupped, white flowers atop tall, wiry-stemmed sprays. (3-5' x 2') Zn4.









Anemone x hybrida 'Bodnant Burgundy'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 7502)

Rose-burgundy flowers shine in late summer and fall. The individual blooms have numerous narrow petals surrounding a yellow center. (3-4' x 3') Zn5.









Anemone x hybrida 'Honorine Jobert'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 5804)

Sparkling single white flowers dance atop very long stems in fall. A beautiful perennial, perfect for cutting, it adds a bright touch to the late-season garden. (4' x 3') Zn6.













Anemone x hybrida 'Kriemhilde'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 5803)

Pink, semi-double flowers dazzle in the late season garden. It also makes a gorgeous cut flower bouquet and the foliage provides excellent fall color. (48" x 24") Zn5.











Anemone x hybrida 'Lady Gilmore'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 7002)

An outstanding cultivar renowned for its large 4" semi-double, rosy-pink blossoms. This fall bloomer brings loads of color to the garden. (30-36' x 2-4') Zn5.











Anemone x hybrida 'Margarete'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 2087)

Deep purple-pink, double flowers have showy yellow stamens and bloom in fall. The stalks can reach 2-3' tall. (24-36" x 24-30") Zn5.







Anemone x hybrida 'Pamina'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 2088)

Deep rose-colored, semi-double flowers rise above elegant foliage in late summer and fall. Excellent for cut flowers and easy to grow. (24-36" x 24") Zn5.













#### Anemone x hybrida 'Praecox'

Antirrhinum 'Bronze Dragon'

Snapdragon (Code: 4907)

Windflower (Code: 7335)

This early blooming, deep pink windflower produces masses of blossoms throughout fall. It prefers part shade and moist conditions, but can tolerate full sun if there is ample moisture. (3' x 3') Zn5.







Bicolor flowers are purple and white, and bloom

continuously in moderate temperatures. Vibrant dark

bronze foliage is resistant to rust. (15-18" x 12") Zn9.



### Anethum graveolens

Dill (Code: 8330)

Aromatic leaves and seeds are used in pickles, vinegars, sauces, salads and seafood recipes. Large, flattened umbels of yellow flowers appear midsummer. Butterflies love it. Annual. (3-4' x 1') Zn10.













Aquilegia 'Biedermeier'

Columbine (Code: 2118)

Compact grower with spurred flowers in a bright mix of colors including carmine, lilac, blue, pink and cream. A great spring bloomer for front of the border or rock garden. (8-12" x 12") Zn4.













### Aquilegia 'Winky Purple-White'

Columbine (Code: 4715)

Short-spurred, upward facing, purple sepals with white petals appear in spring. It may rebloom if spent flowers are removed. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn4.









Aquilegia alpina

Alpine Columbine (Code: 2128)

Sturdy deep azure-blue flowers grace this tight dignified plant. A wonderful, delicate accent for the border, rockery, or woodland. (18-24" x 20") Zn5













### Aquilegia canadensis 'Little Lanterns'

Columbine (Code: 4234)

This dwarf columbine has flowers with long bright red spurs and yellow corollas. Adored by hummingbirds, it is a native cultivar of the eastern U.S. (8" x 8") Zn3.











### Aquilegia chrysantha 'Yellow Queen'

Columbine (Code: 2129)

Masses of fragrant, long-spurred, sunny-yellow flowers adorn ferny foliage. This heavy bloomer is an excellent choice for dappled shade. It prefers well-drained soil. (2-3' x 2') Zn3.













Aquilegia flabellata 'Blue Angel'

Columbine (Code: 6909)

Bright violet-blue flowers with sparkling-white centers grace this compact charmer. A wonderful early spring bloomer for containers or the rockery. (10" x 12") Zn3.













Aguilegia skinnerii 'Teguila Sunrise'

Columbine (Code: 7447)

Orange and yellow, long-spurred blossoms make a wild and wonderful garden display late spring through summer. (18-28" x 12-18") Zn5.









Aquilegia vulgaris 'Clementine Blue'


Columbine (Code: 4053)

This compact form has double, spurless, blue flowers in late spring. The divided, blue-green leaves resemble clover. A Fleuroselect Winner. (12-18" x 12") Zn3.











Aquilegia vulgaris 'Clementine Dark Purple'

Columbine (Code: 4713)

Upward-facing dark purple, double, spurless flowers resemble clematis and blooms from late spring to early summer. Compact form. (12-18" x 12-18") Zn4.













Aquilegia vulgaris 'Clementine Red'

Columbine (Code: 4060)

Compact form with double, spurless, fuchsia-red flowers in late spring. Divided, blue-green leaves resemble clover. A Fleuroselect Winner. (12-18" x 15") Zn3.







Aquilegia vulgaris 'Clementine Salmon Rose'

Columbine (Code: 4061)

Compact form with double, spurless, salmon-rose flowers in late spring and early summer. Divided, blue-green leaves resemble clover. A Fleuroselect Winner.







### Aguilegia vulgaris 'Clementine White'

Columbine (Code: 4064)

Compact form with double, spurless, white flowers in late spring and early summer. Divided blue-green leaves resemble clover. A Fleuroselect Winner. (12-18" x 12-18")





Aquilegia vulgaris 'Leprechaun Gold'

Columbine (Code: 3737)

Striking gold and green marbled foliage brightens the perennial border all season. Beautiful granny bonnet violet-purple flowers appear in spring. A "must have" for any garden. (24" x 18") Zn4.













#### Aquilegia vulgaris 'Nora Barlow'

Granny's Bonnets Columbine (Code: 5089)

Unique perennial with fully double flowers that resemble small Dahlias. Reddish-pink sepals with white and green margins make a charming display in late spring. (18-24" x 16-24") Zn3.











Aquilegia vulgaris 'Ruby Port'

Columbine (Code: 5780)

Gorgeous, double, dark ruby-red flowers top long stems that are perfect for bouquets. A wonderful perennial accent for shaded woodland gardens. (36" x 18") Zn3.













#### Aquilegia vulgaris 'Winky Blue-White'

Columbine (Code: 4714)

Flowers are short-spurred, upward facing, and have violet-blue sepals with white petals in spring. It may rebloom if spent flowers are removed. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn4.





Artemisia lactiflora 'Guizhou'

White Mugwort (Code: 5907)







Dark green, nearly-black, foliage has a red-tinted reverse.



Aquilegia vulgaris 'Winky Double Dark Blue-White'

Columbine (Code: 4892)

Double violet-blue flowers with white tips are shortspurred and upward facing. It blooms in spring and will repeat bloom if spent flowers are removed.









Aruncus 'Misty Lace'

Goatsbeard (Code: 3850)

Dainty, creamy-white flower panicles top fern-like, green leaves and red stems. The clump-forming foliage has an upright habit, but is more compact than the species. (30" x 24") Zn3. PP15798 Propagation Prohibited.





Aruncus dioicus

Goatsbeard (Code: 2171)

(48" x 24-36") Zn3.

The large billowing white plumes that appear in summer resemble an oversized astilbe. It makes a bold and stunning shade accent! Circumboreal to North America, Europe and Asia. (6' x 4') Zn4.





#### Asclepias tuberosa 'Gay Butterflies'

Butterfly Weed (Code: 2176)

The bright yellow, orange and red flowers are a magnet for butterflies. This meadow wildflower requires somewhat dry, well-drained soil and a sunny location.�� (24" x 18-24") Zn4.







Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Professor Anton Kippenburg'

Aster (Code: 2192)

Soft lavender-blue, semi-double flowers add color to the late summer garden. A butterfly favorite and nice for cut bouquets. (18" x 14") Zn3.



Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Wood's Blue'

Wood's Aster (Code: 5905)

Profuse cool blue, starry daisies cover this compact and disease-resistant selection with dark green foliage. Excellent choice for late season color in the mixed border. (10-16" x 20") Zn3.



### Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Wood's Pink' Wood's Aster (Code: 6284)

This compact Aster has dark green foliage with excellent resistance to mildew and rust. Beautiful pink flowers have yellow centers and bloom profusely in fall. (12-15" x 16") Zn3.



Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Wood's Purple'

Wood's Aster (Code: 6927)

Profuse royal purple, starry daisies cover this compact and disease-resistant selection with dark green foliage. A superior selection for late season color in the mixed border. (10-16" x 18") Zn3.



Aster lateriflorus (Symphyotrichum lateriflorum var. lateriflorum)'Prince'

Calico Aster (Code: 6384)



Tiny, rosy-eyed white daisies top dense deep purple foliage. An absolutely stunning combination! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (2' x 2') Zn4.



Aster novae-angliae 'Hella Lacy' New England Aster (Code: 5374)

Aster (Code: 4232)



### Aster pringlei 'Monte Cassino'

Aster (Code: 2185)

Clouds of tiny white asters are borne in natural bouquets. Bright green, needle-like foliage adds visual interest. This drought-tolerant aster is also an excellent cut flower. (3' x 3') Zn4.





Lovely large, single, lavender-blue flowers bloom for an extraordinarily long time - from summer through fall. This "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest makes an excellent cut flower too! (2' x 2') Zn5.





Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus)'Alice Haslam'

Bushy Aster (Code: 2179)


Deep rose-hued, double flowers grace this cute and compact aster in late summer. Perfect for the front of the border, it prefers a sunny spot with moist soil. (10-16" x 20") Zn3.



New England Aster (Code: 2106)

This tall cultivar is excellent for the back of the border. Clusters of bright rose-pink flowers grace this garden gem, from August to October. Excellent for cut flower arrangements. (4' x 4') Zn4.





New England Aster (Code: 5513)

This classic, compact cultivar is loaded with gorgeous, rich deep purple blossoms in fall. The blossoms make excellent long lasting cut flowers. (12-18" x 18-24") Zn4.

Aster x lateriflorus (Symphyotrichum lateriflorum var. lateriflorum) 'Coombe Fishacre'

Aster (Code: 5554)

This graceful fall bloomer has soft lilac daisies that develop nice rosy central buttons as they age. It's an excellent choice as a filler or weaver in the border. A cultivar of A. lateriflorus, it is extremely mildew resistant! (36" x 18") Zn5.



Astilbe 'Delft Lace'

False Spirea (Code: 7438)

The foliage is a deep blue-green with a unique silver overlay. It flowers in midsummer with clusters of deep salmon pink buds that open to a soft warm pink. (24-36" x 18-24") Zn3. pp19839











Astilbe chinensis 'Pumila

False Spirea (Code: 2222)

Astilbe thunbergii 'Betsy Cuperus'

False Spirea (Code: 5265)

Fountain-like, arching, light pink panicles top fresh green foliage. This tall Astilbe is very effective as a focal point when grown in moist shade. (40" x 24") Zn3.





Gracefully-weeping, deep dusty rose plumes add an air of elegance for moist, shade. The pretty plumes make gorgeous cut flowers. (30" x 20") Zn3.






Astilbe thunbergii 'Professor Van der Wielen'

Garden Sage (Code: 5857)

Fuzzy leaves provide a backdrop for arching, boysenberrycolored flowers in summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (18" x 18") Zn4.













Salvia x pratensis 'Rose Rhapsody'

Meadow Sage (Code: 4025)

Long stems of hooded pink flower spikes appear above mounds of green wrinkled leaves in early summer. It will bloom again when spent flowers are removed. (18-20" x 24") Zn4.















Burnet (Code: 4738)

Superb dwarf form of this cucumber-flavored perennial. Small burgundy-red spires top foot long stems in summer over a compact, mounding plant. Great for use in smaller borders or herb garden. (18" x 10") Zn4.











# Saxifraga stolonifera 'Maroon Beauty'

Strawberry Geranium (Code: 4879)

Showy rounded, reddish-green leaves with silver veins. Airy sprays of white flowers appear in early summer. It will politely colonize to make a beautiful groundcover. (12-18" x 15") Zn6.











Rockfoil (Code: 3435)

Airy clouds of pale rosy flowers make this plant a perennial favorite. Large, robust, spatheolate leaves add interest. (1" x 18") Zn7.





Scabiosa atropurpurea 'Chat Noir'

Pincushion Flower (Code: 4454)

Very large, fragrant, double, dark red flowers bloom all season. It makes excellent cut flowers. (30-36" x 18-24") Zn10.





### Salvia roemeriana 'Hot Trumpets'

Cedar Sage (Code: 5000)

Tubular crimson flowers bloom all summer on a low-growing perennial with heart-shaped, aromatic leaves. A very attractive Salvia for the front of the border. (12-15" x 12-16") Zn8.











Salvia x pratensis 'Eveline'

Garden Sage (Code: 3892)

Tall, upright spikes have large bicolor flowers of light and dark pink hues. The bushy habit works well near the front of the border or in containers. (15-24" x 18-24") Zn4. PP14905 Propagation Prohibited.















Arching, wiry stems hold nodding pink bottlebrush spikes above elegant, lacy leaflets in summer. This tough and long-lived perennial prefers moist sites. (30" x 24") Zn4.





### Sanguisorba tenuifolia 'Pink Elephant'

Burnet (Code: 4677)

Tall, thin stems are topped by long, deep pink, cylindrical flowers in summer. The leaves have a neat fern-like appearance. (4' x 2') Zn4.









#### Saxifraga x urbium 'Aurea-punctata'

Rockfoil (Code: 3437)

Airy clouds of delicate tiny white flowers on red stems top rosettes of green and gold-splashed leaves. It makes a bright accent for shady locations. (1' x 1') Zn7.











Scabiosa atropurpurea 'Beaujolais Bonnet'

Pincushion Flower (Code: 7693)

Rich burgundy flowers with contrasting paler outer petals and white stamens appear for months on long wiry stems, perfect for cut flowers. Ideal for attracting butterflies to your borders or containers. (20-24" x 18-24")






Scabiosa columbaria 'Butterfly Blue'

Pincushion Flower (Code: 5914)

Loads of lavender-blue flowers bloom spring through fall on this compact plant. A rewarding garden performer, it was the Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year for 2000. (18" x 18") Zn5.









Scabiosa columbaria 'Harlequin Blue'

Pincushion Flower (Code: 3819)

This improved pincushion flower is more vigorous with greater quantities of bloom! Large, lacy, lavender-blue flowers appear from late spring through fall. (18" x 12-18")





Schizachyrium scoparium 'Blaze'

Little Bluestem (Code: 6852)

Crimson Lily (Code: 2077)

#### Scrophularia auriculata 'Variegata'

Variegated Figwort (Code: 5004)

Tall spikes of tiny wine-red flowers dance above bold green and creamy-white variegated foliage with a crinkly texture. It needs rich, moist soil. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2' x 2') Zn5.





Stonecrop (Code: 7032)

This Sedum forms upright grayish/blue-green foliage that contrasts dramatically with creamy-yellow flowers; a novel flower color for an upright sedum! (12-18" x 12-18") Zn3. PP16927 Propagation Prohibited.





### Sedum spectabilis 'Pink Chablis'

Stonecrop (Code: 6015)

This variegated form of Sedum 'Brilliant' has vigorous growth with an improved compact habit. Broad green succulent leaves have a clean white edge that is well displayed. Pink flowers appear in late summer from white buds. (18" x 18-24") Zn3. PP19060 Propagation Prohibited.



Lovely lavender and purple succulent foliage is topped by red-hued buds that open to creamy-white flowers in late summer. A striking and unusual variety! (12-18" x 12-18") Zn5.





#### Scabiosa columbaria nana 'Blue Note'

Pincushion Flower (Code: 5253)

This dwarf alpine plant has blue flowers that appear for many weeks in late spring & early summer. The flowers are attractive to butterflies. Perfect for the front of the border or rock garden. (5-6" x 6") Zn3.





Schizachyrium scoparium 'The Blues'

Little Bluestem (Code: 6192)

Finely-textured, silver-blue grass is topped with narrow willowy plumes in late summer. It has fantastic reddishburgundy fall color. A native cultivar from the prairies, it tolerates heat and humidity. (12" x 12") Zn4.





Schizostylis coccinea 'Red'

Crimson Lily (Code: 2080)

Sedum 'Matrona'

Stonecrop (Code: 6248)

Large flower heads of soft pink top this succulent awardwinner in summer. Gray-green leaves edged in rosy-pink mimic the tints of the flowers. Absolutely gorgeous! (24" x 18") Zn3.





Sedum spectabile 'Neon'

Stonecrop (Code: 6936)

Wild, deep rose-pink flowers appear backlit! This excitingly-vibrant color will draw you to the garden. Succulent foliage is drought tolerant and lovely. (24" x 24") Zn3.





Sedum telephium 'Munstead Dark Red'

Stonecrop (Code: 5021)

Blooms midsummer to frost with multi-toned flowers, from raspberry-red hues to deep bronze. Dusky, blue-green leaves dothe upright maroon stems. (12-18" x 18") Zn3.





Sedum x 'Thundercloud'

Stonecrop (Code: 4865)

False Mallow, Prairie Mallow (Code: 3545)

Sidalcea malviflora 'Palustre'

False Mallow (Code: 6521)














Mullein (Code: 4029)

Mullein (Code: 4482)

Verbena 'Lapis Lazuli Blue'

Verbena (Code: 5215)

Clusters of brilliant deep blue-purple flowers provide non-stop color spring until frost! It has a cascading habit that is a perfect choice for planters. (6-10" x 12") Zn7.











### Viola 'Columbine'

Violet, Pansies (Code: 4114)

Violet (Code: 5245)

Verbena 'St. Paul' ('Sissinghurst')

Verbena (Code: 3749)

Showy green foliage is covered with hot pink flowers in early spring. Perfect for retaining walls or between stepping stones. It forms a low-growing mat. (6" x 24-36") Zn7.













Viola 'Heartthrob'

Hardy Violet (Code: 4145)

Charming pure white violets feature slightly-ruffled, feathered purple edges spring through fall. A well-behaved addition to the mixed border or container planting. (6-10" x 8-12") Zn6.





Viola cornuta 'Etain'

Violet (Code: 3821)

Lovely light yellow flowers with lavender edges have a sweet fragrance. Compact and very free-flowering. It makes a great border and container plant. (4-6" x 6") Zn5.





Viola odorata 'Blue Remington'

Sweet Violet (Code: 5157)

Large blue violets appear in profusion from late winter through spring and sometimes in fall. The glossy green
