



#### Abelia grandiflora 'Francis Mason'

Glossy Abelia (Code: 4070)

Bright golden-yellow-green foliage along red stems brings a sophisticated edge to the garden. Fragrant light pink flowers bloom late spring to fall. (5' x 5') Zn6.











#### Abutilon pictum 'Thompsonii Yellow'

Variegated Abutilon (Code: 4658)

Light yellow pendulous flowers bloom all season. Green foliage is marvelously variegated with yellow and cream. A showy plant that's excellent for containers. (24-36" x 18-24") Zn9.











#### Acanthus 'Whitewater'

Variegated Bear's Breech (Code: 7318)

Boldly-variegated leaves are splashed with white on this vigorous form. 4-5' tall flower spikes of pink and cream appear mid-summer. Heat and humidity tolerant (24-36" x 24-36") Zn6. PPAF, PVR Propagation Prohibited





#### Acanthus spinosus

Bear's Breeches (Code: 6203)

Striking mauve and gray-white flower spikes top showy deep green spiny leaves. An excellent accent plant. (4' x 2') Zn6.







#### Acorus gramineus 'Ogon'

Sweet Flag (Code: 4254)

The tufting, golden, evergreen foliage makes a striking border or accent plant. It even tolerates standing water. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 12")



















#### Agave 'Silver Surfer'

Century Plant (Code: 7277)

Dramatic, rigid, silvery-blue succulent leaves grow into a 5' tall speciman plant! This architectural plant makes an exotic focal point in the garden or use in containers. (5' x 6-9') Zn8.











#### Agave montana 'Baccarat'

Mountain Agave (Code: 7282)

This Agave features broad, blue-green evergreen leaves with beautiful silver markings on the back of the leaf, reminiscent of crystal etching. Perfect for desert rock gardens. (24-36" x 24-36") Zn7.













#### Abelia grandiflora 'Kaleidoscope'

Abelia (Code: 6770)

The variegated leaves emerge yellow with light green centers. White tubular flowers bloom in fall. A stunning addition to any garden. Plant in full sun for best foliage color. (2-3' x 3-4') Zn6. PP16988 Propagation Prohibited.













Abutilon pictum 'Thompsonii'

Variegated Flowering Maple (Code: 6863)

Brilliant gold and green-splashed leaves nicely offset salmon-hued flowers flushed with orange. This stunning container specimen is worth moving indoors during winter.  $(3-5' \times 2-3')$  Zn9.





Bear's Breeches (Code: 2002)

Dramatic architectural plant with large tropical-looking, deep green, glossy leaves. Stunning purple and white spikes make a striking display in August. It will tolerate nearly any kind of soil. (3-5' x 3-4') Zn6.





Striped Sweet Flag (Code: 4326)

Grassy evergreen leaves with bright yellow stripes glimmer in the landscape. A graceful choice for moist soil or water's edge. (12" x 12") Zn6.

















#### Aegopodium podagraria 'Variegatum'

Bishop's Weed (Code: 2040)

This vigorous, carefree groundcover has attractive cream and green-variegated leaves. It looks best when grown in partial shade in moist soil, but it will tolerate almost any growing condition. (6-10" x 12") Zn3.















Hardy Century Plant (Code: 7279)

The name reflects the fantastic shape of the glossy evergreen leaves which are concave and heavily toothed. It forms a large clump that commands attention. (24" x 36-48") Zn7.





Agave ovatifolia 'Frosty Blue'

Agave (Code: 7627)

One of the largest cold hardy Agaves, it can eventually grow up to 6 feet tall by 6 feet wide. The rounded rosette of short wide gray leaves are distinctively cupped with small teeth along their margins and a 1- inch long dark gray terminal spine. (6-8' x 4-6') Zn7.







Agave parryi

Parry's Agave (Code: 6301)

Striking blue-green, sword-like succulent evergreen leaves have long spines. This classic desert garden plant is perfect as a dramatic focal point in the garden or as a container plant. (30-36" x 36-40") Zn7.











Agave parryi ssp. huachucensis

Huachuca Agave (Code: 7284)

This Agave forms very attractive rosettes of glaucous blue-gray, wedge-shaped evergreen leaves. Perfect for xeriscaping or for containers. (24" x 24") Zn7.











Agave schidigera 'Black Widow'

Agave (Code: 7288)

Rigid, dark green succulent leaves have silver marking and edges with curly fibers. The compact symmetrical growth habit makes it useful in the rock garden or in containers. (12" x 18") Zn8.











Agonis flexuosa 'Jervis Bay After Dark'

Peppermint Tree (Willow Myrtle) (Code: 4890)

Brilliant scarlet colored, willow-like leaves appear in spring and darken to deep burgundy. Small fragrant white flowers with burgundy centers appear in clusters from spring into early summer. (18' x 10-12') Zn9. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.









## Ajuga 'Chocolate Chip'

Bugleweed (Code: 4468)

Bright blue flower spikes top miniature chocolate colored foliage in spring. This marvelously-dense, vigorous, spreading groundcover is excellent in containers or rock gardens. (3" x 18") Zn4.

















Ajuga reptans 'Blueberry Muffin'

Carpet Bugle (Code: 7393)

Blueberry-blue blooms on 8" spikes shine above smallleaved foliage in spring. Faster and stronger growing than A. 'Chocolate Chip', this vigorous groundcover is weather resistant as well. (5-6" x 24-30") Zn4. PPAF,PVR Propagation Prohibited



#### Ajuga reptans 'Catlin's Giant'

Bugleweed (Code: 5166)

Unusual large-growing Ajuga with dramatic thick foliage and tall blue flower spikes. The leaves grow even larger with rich soil. It's stunning planted en masse, as border edging, or over bulbs. (9" x 36") Zn3.















Agave parryi 'J.C. Raulston'

Parry's Agave (Code: 7285)

This Agave forms symmetrical rosettes of blue-gray wedge-shaped evergreen leaves. Slow to form offsets, it is a good choice where space is small, or for use in containers. (24" x 24-36") Zn7.











#### Agave parryi ssp. truncata

Silver Agave (Code: 7286)

Blue-gray succulent leaves form a marvelous symmetrical rosette. Each rounded evergreen leaf terminates with a dark pointed spike. A classic and favorite among Agave collectors. (18" x 18") Zn7.





Hedgehog Agave (Code: 6305)

Symmetrical, spherical rosettes consist of hard curved, narrow leaves with a pronounced terminal spike. Makes an excellent container plant. (24-36" x 36-40") Zn10.









Agropyron magellanicum

Blue Wheat Grass (Code: 3261)

Clumping grass with striking metallic blue foliage. A great accent in perennial borders and containers. (12-18" x 12-18") Zn5.





## Ajuga reptans 'Black Scallop'

Bugleweed (Code: 3940)

Very attractive jet-black scalloped leaves are covered with deep violet-blue flower spikes in spring. The foliage color intensifies in cold and full sun. (3-6" x 30-36") Zn3. PP15815 Propagation Prohibited.















Ajuga reptans 'Burgundy Glow'

Bugleweed (Code: 2032)

In spring, blue flower spikes rise above a colorful low mat of burgundy-rose, white and green-variegated foliage. An eye-catching selection! (6" x 24") Zn6.













Ajuga reptans 'Sparkler'

Bugleweed (Code: 7436)

The dark green, shiny foliage is covered in creamy-white splashes that turn pink in winter. The most vigorous, variegated Ajuga, it's awesome as an accent in containers, or as a ground-cover. Lovely blue flowers appear late spring. (3-4" x 12-18") Zn6. PPAF







Alchemilla alpina

Alpine Lady's Mantle (Code: 2042)

Tiny chartreuse flowers float above ground-hugging, glossy-green leaves. This is an excellent choice for the rockery or border edge. (6-8" x 8-12") Zn3.





Angelica pachycarpa

Glossy-Leaved Angelica (Code: 7351)

Glossy, deep green, compound leaves form a beautiful, rounded mound. Large flat umbels of creamy-white flowers appear in summer. Remove flowers before the seeds form, otherwise it may behave as a biennial. (3' x 3') Zn5





Arabis caucasica 'Variegata'

Rock Cress (Code: 5356)

Striking emerald and cream, felted evergreen leaves are topped with pure white flowers in spring. The late season foliage is very attractive. A collector's plant. (8" x 24") Zn3.





Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Vancouver Jade'

Kinnikinnick (Code: 6383)

Small pink flowers in spring turn into scarlet-red fruit in summer and fall. This drought tolerant, glossy-leaved, evergreen groundcover is deservedly popular. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.







Artemisia 'Huntington'

Wormwood (Code: 2157)

Silvery gray, finely-cut foliage adorns this bushy plant. Excellent for either containers or flower beds and borders. An excellent perennial for areas with poor, dry soil. (30-42" x 30") Zn3.





Dark green, nearly-black, foliage has a red-tinted reverse. Sprays of pearly-white flowers appear in early summer. (48" x 24-36") Zn3.





Artemisia pycnocephala 'David's Choice'

Wormwood (Code: 2167)

Delicate silver foliage forms attractive soft mounds. This beautiful dwarf evergreen selection makes an excellent addition to the rock garden. (12" x 24-36") Zn7.





Alchemilla mollis 'Auslese'

Lady's Mantle (Code: 2045)

A restrained habit makes this cultivar more desirable than the species. It has the same lovely fuzzy gray-green leaves and chartreuse flowers. The leaves sparkle after a spring rain! (7-16" x 12-24") Zn3.





Antirrhinum 'Bronze Dragon'

Snapdragon (Code: 4907)

Bicolor flowers are purple and white, and bloom continuously in moderate temperatures. Vibrant dark bronze foliage is resistant to rust. (15-18" x 12") Zn9.





Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Massachusetts'

Kinnikinnick, Bearberry (Code: 5674)

This popular native evergreen groundcover is very cold and drought tolerant. Small pink flowers bloom in early spring and are followed by bright red berries in fall. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.



Arrhenatherum elatius bulbosum 'Variegatum'

Bulbous Oat Grass (Code: 2153)

Short, bright white and green-striped foliage is topped by pure white seedheads in summer. It makes a nice spreading groundcover where temperatures are moderate. (12" x 24-36") Zn5.





Artemisia 'Powis Castle'

Wormwood (Code: 2159)

Soft, sturdy, gray leaves form a mound of finely-divided foliage. A wonderful textural accent for the garden. It can also be used as small evergreen hedge. (24-36" x 24-36") Zn6.





Artemisia ludoviciana 'Valerie Finnis'

Wormwood (Code: 2166)

Broad, jagged silvery-white foliage provides a foil for bright or dark colored companion plants in the border. Native to the Pacific Northwest. (30" x 30") Zn5.












Artemisia schmidtiana 'Silver Mound'

Wormwood (Code: 2162)

Attractive fern-like, silvery foliage has a clumping habit that is perfect as a rock garden plant or for edging. A great companion for geraniums or roses. (12-16" x 24") Zn3.









Arum italicum


Italian Arum (Code: 2136)

Glossy-green, spear-shaped leaves are marbled with silver and appear in late winter. Flowers are not showy, but are followed by upright stalks of bright orange-red berries in summer. The foliage may go dormant in summer. (12" x 24-36") Zn7.









Calico Aster (Code: 6384)

Tiny, rosy-eyed white daisies top dense deep purple foliage. An absolutely stunning combination! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (2' x 2') Zn4.





Tatting Fern (Code: 7688)

This distinctive fern has deep green fronds that resemble necklaces. Delicate looking, but adaptable as any lady fern. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-18" x 12-18") Zn3.













Athyrium niponicum 'Pictum'

Japanese Painted Fern (Code: 6968)

Silvery-gray, metallic-appearing fronds have garnet veins extending to the tips. Long-lived and reliable in moist, humus-rich soil. 2004 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year and a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12-18" x 18-24") Zn3.















Rock Cress (Code: 2108)

Variegated cream and green foliage has a trailing habit perfect for the rock garden or edge of the border. Red flowers appear in early spring. (4-8" x 10-16") Zn4.













Boxleaf Azara, Chinchin (Code: 6477)

This small tree has dark, glossy evergreen foliage similar to boxwood. Tiny yellow flowers scented of white chocolate appear in late winter, followed by tiny blood-red fruit. It prefers well-drained soil. (15' x 6') Zn7.















Baumea rubiginosa

Golden Sword (Code: 6995)

Fabulous foliage! Upright, leathery leaves are striped green and gold, making it an excellent vertical accent. Needs full to part sun and moisture. Excellent for containers and pond edges. (18" x 10") Zn7.













Asarum caudatum

Wild Ginger (Code: 5167)

Northwest native perennial with evergreen heart-shaped leaves that slowly grow to form a groundcover. It grows best in moist, but well drained soils in open woodlands. (4-5" x 18-24") Zn4.









Astilbe 'Delft Lace'

False Spirea (Code: 7438)

The foliage is a deep blue-green with a unique silver overlay. It flowers in midsummer with clusters of deep salmon pink buds that open to a soft warm pink. (24-36" x 18-24") Zn3. pp19839













#### Athyrium filix-femina x niponicum 'Branford Rambler'

Running Lady Fern (Code: 4963)

This vigorous, spreading deciduous groundcover fern has purplish-red stems and short green fronds. Dependable and adaptable in shady locations, but never invasive. (18-24" x 24-36") Zn4.














This wonderful perennial has violet-purple flowers in spring that brightly contrast creeping cream and greenvariegated foliage. (4" x 12") Zn4.















Azara integrifolia 'Variegata'

Azara (Code: 4682)

Evergreen leaves have white to pale pink edges. Yellow flowers appear in late winter or early spring, followed by black fruit. (14' x 10-12') Zn8.








Horehound (Code: 2257)

This excellent drought resistant sub shrub is a great foliage accent! Quilted chartreuse leaves add wonderful texture to the garden. Tiny pale green flowers are not showy, appearing from mid to late summer. (16" x 24") Zn8.









This clump form has large glossy, leathery evergreen foliage which turns a beautiful maroon color in fall and winter. Flower spikes are a rich magenta. (14" x 14") Zn3.






















Bergenia 'Abendglut'

Elephant Ears (Code: 5629)

This improved form has lovely deep-magenta, semi-double bells lining upright red stems, March to May. The evergreen foliage adds substance to the border and turns maroon in winter. An excellent selection! (18" x 12") Zn3















Elephant Ears (Code: 5098)

Sturdy evergreen leaves turn purple-maroon in winter. Deep magenta flowers appear in spring, then sporadically through summer & fall. A wonderful textural accent for the late season garden. (18" x 18") Zn3.















Bergenia 'Pink Dragonfly'

Elephant Ear (Code: 4073)

This Bergenia forms a low clump of tidy narrow green leaves, that develop rich plum-red tones in the winter. Taller stems of bell-shaped pink flowers rise above the shiny foliage in mid spring. (12-15" x 15") Zn3.













Bergenia 'Silberlicht'

Elephant Ear (Code: 5100)

Delicate white flowers age to pink and appear above large medium-green foliage. This vigorous grower exhibits nice red-tinted fall and winter color and is great for mass planting. (18" x 24") Zn3.













Showy magenta-red flowers bloom in spring and periodically in fall. Large, rounded evergreen foliage turns glowing burgundy in fall and winter and is excellent for mass planting. (12-15" x 18") Zn3.

















Bergenia purpurascens

Elephant Ears (Code: 2267)

Reddish-purple flowers in spring enhance deep-green leaves that have a reddish hue to their undersides. This easy to grow evergreen turns burgundy in winter and early spring. (15" x 24") Zn3.















Brugmansia x candida 'Miner's Claim'

Angel's Trumpet (Code: 3958)

Showy leaves are light green with creamy-white edges. Large creamy-pink, trumpet flowers hang from branches mid-to-late summer. From Keith Miner. (5-7' x 5-7') Zn9. PP15747 Propagation Prohibited.





Bergenia 'Bressingham Ruby'

Elephant Ears (Code: 3648)

Best known for its ruby-red winter foliage, this Bergenia has deep rose-pink flowers in spring. It's useful as a groundcover or as an accent in containers. (14" x 12") Zn4. PP7344, COPF Propagation Prohibited.





Bergenia 'Morgenrote'

Elephant Ear (Code: 5099)

Short racemes of deep carmine flowers top crinkled deep green leaves. This pretty rebloomer has very attractive burgundy fall and winter foliage. (18" x 12") Zn3.





Dwarf Elephant Ears (Code: 5901)

A lovely dwarf, compact plant with succulent green summer leaves that turn burgundy-red in winter. Pretty clusters of ruby-red bells display on 10" stems in spring. A great addition to the semi-shade border and wonderful for mixed containers. (12" x 12") Zn3.



Bergenia agavifolia

Elephant Ears (Code: 4820)

This unusual bergenia has round, olive green leaves, edged in burgundy. White blooms with pink calyxes appear in early spring. (12" x 12-16") Zn3.













Bergenia hybrida 'Baby Doll'

Elephant Ears (Code: 6006)

Delicate pink flowers age to a deeper pink in spring. The foliage is smaller than most varieties of bergenia, reaching a mere 10" tall. An excellent evergreen accent. (12-24" x 18-24") Zn3.



Brugmansia 'Charles Grimaldi'

Angel's Trumpet (Code: 7550)

An exceptionally-vigorous cultivar named after the late landscape designer, Charles Grimaldi. Large, pendulous, orange-yellow flowers have strong recurved petals and are slightly fragrant. The bold tropical foliage is stunning! (8-10' x 6-8') Zn9.




Brugmansia x cubensis 'Snowbank'

Angel's Trumpet (Code: 4076)

The brightly variegated foliage has broad white margins and soft gray-green interiors. Fragrant peach-colored, trumpet-like flowers appear in summer. Vigorous and exotic! (5' x 5') Zn9. PP14817, EU16251 Propagation Prohibited.









Brunnera macrophylla

Siberian Bugloss (Code: 5101)

Small azure-blue flowers (reminiscent of forget-me-nots) rise above attractive heart-shaped foliage. Able to tolerate full shade, it makes an excellent groundcover when planted en masse. (18" x 18") Zn3.









Brunnera macrophylla 'Jack Frost'

Siberian Bugloss (Code: 7389)

The leaves have frosty-silver overlay and light green veining. Tiny clusters of pretty forget-me-not flowers appear in spring. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest that is perfect for the woodland garden! (12-15" x 15") Zn3. PP13859 Propagation Prohibited.











Brunnera macrophylla 'Variegata'

Siberian Bugloss (Code: 4294)

Large heart-shaped leaves have bold white margins. Bright blue, forget-me-not flowers appear in early spring. This is a good deer-resistant alternative to Hosta! (12-18" x 18") Zn3.











Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Overdam'

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 6007)

Arching, green and white-striped leaves are topped by upright bronze flower spikes that gradually fade to buff. The foliage takes on a green-to-red tinge in the fall. (3' x 2') Zn5.















Calluna vulgaris 'Lady in White'

Heather (Code: 7796)

This small evergreen shrub has bushy, upright branches covered with white flowers from August until January. Flowering branches make a wonderful addition to garlands and wreaths. Prefers cool summers and moist, but well-drained acidic soil. (8-18" x 8-14") Zn5. PP20530

















Canna 'Australia'

Canna Lily (Code: 6938)

Brilliant orange-red flowers appear in summer above large, smooth, satiny burgundy-red foliage. This Canna is wonderful for creating a flamboyant, tropical look by the sunny edge of a pond. It is also excellent as a container centerpiece! (3-5' x 2') Zn7.







#### Canna 'Intrique'

Canna Lily (Code: 6234)

Narrow, pointed, purple-gray foliage makes a stunning accent plant. 7' tall clumps produce small bright orange-red flowers in late summer. It provides that tropical touch wherever sun and moisture is plentiful. (5-7' x 3-4') Zn7.











Brunnera macrophylla 'Hadspen Cream'

Siberian Bugloss (Code: 4617)

Heart-shaped leaves have a somewhat fuzzy texture and narrow, irregular variegation. Sprays of blue forgetme-not flowers emerge in early spring. A sweet addition the woodland garden or grow in light shade. (12"  $\times$  18") Zn3.







### Brunnera macrophylla 'Looking Glass'

Siberian Bugloss (Code: 3896)

This sport of Brunnera 'Jack Frost' has even larger, more-silvery leaves. With a mounding habit, it really brightens shady areas. Blue forget-me-not flowers appear in spring. (18" x 15") Zn3. PP17829 Propagation Prohibited.









Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Avalanche'

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 5999)

Medium-sized clumps showcase dramatically-striped foliage. Airy, rose-tinged plumes take on warm golden hues later in the season. (3-5' x 3-5') Zn5.













Calamintha grandiflora 'Variegata'

Calamint (Code: 6390)

Rose-pink flowers appear in midsummer on aromatic, speckled, variegated foliage. (15-18" x 18-24") Zn5.





Campanula garganica 'Dickson's Gold'

Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 5937)

Starry lavender-blue flowers top brilliant golden foliage. An eye-catching, compact charmer, it brightens partial shade even when not in flower. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 6-12") Zn5.













Canna 'Bengal Tiger' (syn. 'Pretoria')

Canna Lily (Code: 6393)

Flamboyant yellow and green-striped foliage is topped by brilliant orange flowers, midsummer until frost. Plant in groups by the sunny edge of a pond for a bold, tropical effect! (6" x 12-24") Zn7.









#### Carex buchananii 'Viridis'

Leather Leaf Sedge (Code: 5655)

This graceful, finely-textured, evergreen grass forms an upright clump of curly-topped light green leaves. It makes a striking accent for the perennial border or container. (18-24" x 18") Zn7.















Carex comans 'Milk Chocolate'

New Zealand Hairy Sedge (Code: 4236)

Delicious milk chocolate-colored, evergreen grass with long thin blades that curve gracefully outward. Similar to C. 'Frosted Curls' but with a rich brownish-red hue.















Carex flacca

Blue Sedge (Code: 3734)

Evergreen chalky-blue blades spread to form a groundcover that will tolerate shade. Blue flowers on blue stems appear in early summer. (15" x 15") Zn4.



















Carex flagellifera

Weeping Brown Sedge (Code: 2281)

This graceful and finely-textured grass has arching mounds of orange-bronze foliage. It makes a nice contrast with silver foliage and brightly colored flowers. (18" x 24")

















Carex morrowii 'Ice Dance'

Variegated Sedge (Code: 6653)

Dark green leaves with white edges form arching mounds of evergreen foliage. It will spread to form a groundcover that's easy to control. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn5.





Carex muskingumensis 'Ice Fountains'

Palm Leaf Sedge (Code: 6190)

Slender blades have distinct white interiors. The white variegation gradually turns to pale green by midsummer. It spreads slowly to form a small colony in moist soils. (28" x 18") Zn3.

















### Carex nigra 'Variegata'

Variegated Sedge (Code: 6297)

Light green blades to 12" are softly edged in yellow. This vigorous groundcover is good for partial shade. It will also tolerate drier soils. (12" x 18") Zn5.











#### Carex phyllocephala 'Sparkler'

Sedge (Code: 4528)

Whorls of boldly variegated green and white blades will literally stop traffic. Exciting and exotic, this tough garden jewel will add a bright spot to any landscape or mixed planter. (12-18" x 12-18") Zn7.









Carex elata 'Bowle's Golden'

Golden Sedge (Code: 6285)

This incandescent, golden grass makes a gorgeous foliage accent for the mixed border or pond perimeter. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (24-36" x 24-36") Zn5.













Tufted bluish-gray, grassy foliage slowly spreads to form an evergreen groundcover. Very versatile and easy to grow. (10-18" x 12-16") Zn5.















Carex flagellifera 'Kiwi'

Sedge (Code: 4941)

A soft fountain-like evergreen with finely-textured pale green blades and yellow highlights. Perfect for containers and borders. Golden highlights appear in fall. (18" x 18") Zn7.



















Green leaves with silver-white edges form dense, creeping tufts. Pale and wispy flowers appear in late spring. An excellent evergreen groundcover among Hostas, ferns or bamboo. (18" x 42") Zn6.















Carex muskingumensis 'Oehme'

Palm Leaf Sedge (Code: 4166)

Eragrostis chloromelas

Boer lovegrass (Code: 7558)

This is a densely tufted, clump-forming, warm season grass with narrow powder-blue foliage. The 3 foot tall flowers stalks rise in late spring or early summer, opening into a buff colored haze of flowers that lasts into fall and winter. (24-36" x 24-30") Zn7.













#### Eryngium amethystinium 'Sapphire Blue'

Erysimum 'Fragrant Star'

Wallflower (Code: 7614)

Spurge (Code: 4883)

Ligularia 'Britt-Marie Crawford' Bigleaf Ligularia (Code: 3646)



#### Mahonia nervosa

Cascade Oregon Grape Holly (Code: 7266)
