



Abelia grandiflora 'Kaleidoscope'

Abelia (Code: 6770)

The variegated leaves emerge vellow with light green centers. White tubular flowers bloom in fall. A stunning addition to any garden. Plant in full sun for best foliage color. (2-3' x 3-4') Zn6. PP16988 Propagation Prohibited.

Aconitum septentrionale 'Ivorine'

Aconitum paniculatum 'Roseum'

Monkshood (Code: 4809)

Elegant spikes of palest pink hooded flowers climb tall stalks. Bright green, glossy foliage adds handsome contrast. Excellent late summer bloomer for cut arrangements. (36" x 24") Zn4.











Grassy evergreen leaves with bright yellow stripes glimmer in the landscape. A graceful choice for moist soil or water's edge. (12" x 12") Zn6.















Acorus gramineus 'Ogon'

Sweet Flag (Code: 4254)

The tufting, golden, evergreen foliage makes a striking border or accent plant. It even tolerates standing water. A 'Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 12")

















Amelanchier alnifolia

Saskatoon Serviceberry (Code: 8240)

This native North American deciduous shrub features an abundance of white flowers in spring, turning to small edible fruits that taste something like a blueberry. The leaves turn crimson-red in fall. Wonderful for attracting wildlife!�� (12-20' x 8-12') Zn3.



Amsonia 'Blue Ice'

Blue Star Flower (Code: 6680)

Blue star-like flowers appear in spring for a longer period than the species. This compact form is very vigorous and turns brilliant yellow in fall. (12-15" x 24") Zn5.





Amelanchier alnifolia 'Smokey'

Saskatoon, Serviceberry (Code: 7465)

This multi-stemmed deciduous shrub has an upright spreading habit and smooth silver-gray bark. The dark green oval leaves turn bright yellow in the fall. Stunning clusters of white flowers appear before the leaves emerge in early spring. Blue berries are abundant in late spring and are excellent eaten fresh or for making jams and jellies. Self-pollinating. (8-12' x 8-12') Zn3.











Amsonia ciliata 'Halfway to Arkansas' Blue Star Flower (Code: 4853)

Star-like, sky-blue flowers appear in spring over feathery foliage that forms rounded, upright mounds. The yellow fall color comes a bit later than other Amsonias. (30-36" x 30-36") Zn6.





Amsonia hubrichtii

Blue Star Flower (Code: 6293)

This carefree midwest native perennial boasts graceful, willow-like leaves topped by clusters of steely-blue, star-shaped flowers. Dazzling display of fall color too! 2011 Perennial Plant Association Perennial Plant of the Year and a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (36-48" x 18") Zn4.















Andropogon gerardi 'Lord Snowdon'

Big Bluestem (Code: 4423)

Purple-hued flower spikes top striking silvery-blue blades in fall. The foliage turns an attractive soft plum after frost. (4-6' x 2') Zn4.





Anemone x hybrida 'Honorine Jobert' Japanese Anemone (Code: 5804)

Sparkling single white flowers dance atop very long stems in fall. A beautiful perennial, perfect for cutting, it adds a bright touch to the late-season garden. (4' x 3') Zn6.





Anemone x hybrida 'Kriemhilde'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 5803)

Pink, semi-double flowers dazzle in the late season garden. It also makes a gorgeous cut flower bouquet and the foliage provides excellent fall color. (48" x 24") Zn5.





Anemone x hybrida 'Lady Gilmore'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 7002)

An outstanding cultivar renowned for its large 4" semi-double, rosy-pink blossoms. This fall bloomer brings loads of color to the garden. (30-36' \times 2-4') Zn5.

















Anemone x hybrida 'Margarete'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 2087)

Deep purple-pink, double flowers have showy yellow stamens and bloom in fall. The stalks can reach 2-3' tall. (24-36" x 24-30") Zn5.











Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Professor Anton Kippenburg'

Aster (Code: 2192)

Soft lavender-blue, semi-double flowers add color to the late summer garden. A butterfly favorite and nice for cut bouquets. (18" x 14") Zn3.





Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Wood's Pink'

Wood's Aster (Code: 6284)

This compact Aster has dark green foliage with excellent resistance to mildew and rust. Beautiful pink flowers have yellow centers and bloom profusely in fall. (12-15" x 16")






Aster lateriflorus (Symphyotrichum lateriflorum var. lateriflorum)'Prince'

Calico Aster (Code: 6384)

Tiny, rosy-eyed white daisies top dense deep purple foliage. An absolutely stunning combination! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (2' x 2') Zn4.





New England Aster (Code: 5513)

This classic, compact cultivar is loaded with gorgeous, rich deep purple blossoms in fall. The blossoms make excellent long lasting cut flowers. (12-18" x 18-24") Zn4.





Aster oblongifolius (Symphyotrichum oblongifolium) 'October Skies'

Aster (Code: 3901)

Blue daisy-like flowers appear mid-fall above stronggrowing, low-mounding foliage. It is quite tough and adaptable, tolerating drought and poor soils. (15-18" x 18-24") Zn4.





Aster x frikartii 'Monch'

Frikart's Aster (Code: 2205)

Lovely large, single, lavender-blue flowers bloom for an extraordinarily long time - from summer through fall. This "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest makes an excellent cut flower too! (2' x 2') Zn5.





Anemone x hybrida 'Pamina'

Japanese Anemone (Code: 2088)

Deep rose-colored, semi-double flowers rise above elegant foliage in late summer and fall. Excellent for cut flowers and easy to grow. (24-36" x 24") Zn5.











Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Wood's Blue'

Wood's Aster (Code: 5905)

Profuse cool blue, starry daisies cover this compact and disease-resistant selection with dark green foliage. Excellent choice for late season color in the mixed border. (10-16" x 20") Zn3.





Aster dumosus (Symphytotrichum dumosus var. dumosus) 'Wood's Purple'

Wood's Aster (Code: 6927)

Profuse royal purple, starry daisies cover this compact and disease-resistant selection with dark green foliage. A superior selection for late season color in the mixed border. (10-16" x 18") Zn3.



Aster novae-angliae 'Alma Potschke'

New England Aster (Code: 2106)

This tall cultivar is excellent for the back of the border. Clusters of bright rose-pink flowers grace this garden gem, from August to October. Excellent for cut flower arrangements. (4' x 4') Zn4.





Aster oblongifolius (Symphyotrichum oblongifolium) 'Dream of

Aster (Code: 4232)

A superb high plains native known for its vigorous, low-spreading habit and amazing fall display of fragrant light pink flowers with burnt orange centers. It spreads to form a dense carpet of flowers and grows in almost any





Aster pringlei 'Monte Cassino'

Aster (Code: 2185)

Clouds of tiny white asters are borne in natural bouquets. Bright green, needle-like foliage adds visual interest. This drought-tolerant aster is also an excellent cut flower. (3' x 3') Zn4.





Aster x lateriflorus (Symphyotrichum lateriflorum var. lateriflorum) 'Coombe Fishacre'

Aster (Code: 5554)

This graceful fall bloomer has soft lilac daisies that develop nice rosy central buttons as they age. It's an excellent choice as a filler or weaver in the border. A cultivar of A. lateriflorus, it is extremely mildew resistant! (36" x 18") Zn5.







Bergenia 'Abendglocken'

Elephant Ears (Code: 5097)

This clump form has large glossy, leathery evergreen foliage which turns a beautiful maroon color in fall and winter. Flower spikes are a rich magenta. (14" x 14") Zn3.








Bergenia 'Abendglut'

Elephant Ears (Code: 5629)

This improved form has lovely deep-magenta, semi-double bells lining upright red stems, March to May. The evergreen foliage adds substance to the border and turns maroon in winter. An excellent selection! (18" x 12") Zn3.





Best known for its ruby-red winter foliage, this Bergenia has deep rose-pink flowers in spring. It's useful as a groundcover or as an accent in containers. (14" x 12") Zn4. PP7344, COPF Propagation Prohibited.











Bergenia 'Glockenturm'

Elephant Ears (Code: 5098)

Sturdy evergreen leaves turn purple-maroon in winter. Deep magenta flowers appear in spring, then sporadically through summer & fall. A wonderful textural accent for the late season garden. (18" x 18") Zn3.





Bergenia 'Morgenrote'

Elephant Ear (Code: 5099)

Short racemes of deep carmine flowers top crinkled deep green leaves. This pretty rebloomer has very attractive burgundy fall and winter foliage. (18" x 12") Zn3.





Bergenia 'Pink Dragonfly'

Elephant Ear (Code: 4073)

This Bergenia forms a low clump of tidy narrow green leaves, that develop rich plum-red tones in the winter. Taller stems of bell-shaped pink flowers rise above the shiny foliage in mid spring. (12-15" x 15") Zn3.



Bergenia 'Silberlicht'

Elephant Ear (Code: 5100)

Delicate white flowers age to pink and appear above large medium-green foliage. This vigorous grower exhibits nice red-tinted fall and winter color and is great for mass





Bergenia 'Ruby Elf'

Dwarf Elephant Ears (Code: 5901)

A lovely dwarf, compact plant with succulent green summer leaves that turn burgundy-red in winter. Pretty clusters of ruby-red bells display on 10" stems in spring. A great addition to the semi-shade border and wonderful for mixed containers. (12" x 12") Zn3.



This unusual bergenia has round, olive green leaves, edged in burgundy. White blooms with pink calyxes appear in early spring. (12" x 12-16") Zn3.





Elephant Ears (Code: 4820)













Bergenia cordifolia 'Winterglut'

Elephant Ears (Code: 2390)

Showy magenta-red flowers bloom in spring and periodically in fall. Large, rounded evergreen foliage turns glowing burgundy in fall and winter and is excellent for mass planting. (12-15" x 18") Zn3.













Bergenia hybrida 'Baby Doll'

Elephant Ears (Code: 6006)

Delicate pink flowers age to a deeper pink in spring. The foliage is smaller than most varieties of bergenia, reaching a mere 10" tall. An excellent evergreen accent. (12-24" x 18-24") Zn3.
















Bergenia purpurascens

Elephant Ears (Code: 2267)

Reddish-purple flowers in spring enhance deep-green leaves that have a reddish hue to their undersides. This easy to grow evergreen turns burgundy in winter and early spring. (15" x 24") Zn3.





Bouteloua gracilis 'Blonde Ambition'

Blue Gramma, Mosquito Grass (Code: 7804)

The brush-like flowers rise up out of the blue-green foliage in mid-summer and are suspended horizontally for months on stiff, weather-resistant stems. The flowers turn chartreuse by fall and then mature to long-lasting blonde seed heads. Larger-growing than the native Blue Gramma. (24-36" x 24-36") Zn4. PPAF



Calamagrostis arundinacea brachytricha

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 2278)

Upright fluffy flower spikes emerge briefly in early summer in Oregon, then bloom again in fall. A graceful and arching grass that grows well in moist locations. (3-4' x 3') Zn5.























Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Avalanche'

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 5999)

Medium-sized clumps showcase dramatically-striped foliage. Airy, rose-tinged plumes take on warm golden hues later in the season. (3-5' x 3-5') Zn5.











Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Overdam'

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 6007)

Arching, green and white-striped leaves are topped by upright bronze flower spikes that gradually fade to buff. The foliage takes on a green-to-red tinge in the fall. (3' x 2') Zn5.















Ceanothus Tuxedo

California Lilac (Code: 7043)

The dark bronze-purple foliage is a real breakthrough in breeding! This distinctive evergreen shrub has an open, upright habit that responds well to pruning. Lavender-blue flowers appear in abundance in late summer and fall. (6-8' x 6-8') Zn8. PPAF



Ceratostigma plumbaginoides

Plumbago (Code: 2370)

Electric-blue flowers provide a dramatic contrast with the garnet- red autumn foliage. This wonderful groundcover is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! It breaks dormancy late in the spring, but it's worth the wait. (8-12" x 24") Zn6.















Ceratostigma willmottianum 'My Love' Plumbago (Code: 3735)

Low-growing sub-shrub has stunning golden-yellow foliage that contrasts dramatically with deep cobalt-blue flowers, from late summer through fall. (18" x 18") Zn7. PP19269 Propagation Prohibited.









Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire'

Bloodtwig Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6972)

Unbelievable color for the winter landscape with stems in flickering shades of yellow, orange and red. It makes an impressive mass planting. Useful in cut and dried flower arrangements. $(5-10' \times 5')$ Zn4.

















Cornus sericea 'Hedgerow's Gold'

Redosier Dogwood (Code: 6858)

Bright golden-yellow and green-variegated leaves contrast vividly against deep red stems. Eye-catching every season of the year. This Northwest native cultivar is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-10' x 5') Zn4.



















Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Karl Foerster'

Feather Reed Grass (Code: 5160)

Upright soft green leaves are topped by tall, vertical, rose-colored plumes that mature to a golden-wheat color. This 2001 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5' x 2') Zn4.

















This small evergreen shrub has bushy, upright branches covered with white flowers from August until January. Flowering branches make a wonderful addition to garlands and wreaths. Prefers cool summers and moist, but well-drained acidic soil. (8-18" x 8-14") Zn5. PP20530



Ceratostigma griffithii

Plumbago (Code: 2372)

This small sub-shrub has clusters of brilliant blue flowers from late summer into fall when the leaves turn burgundy red. The blooms appear on new wood. Cut back in spring to encourage blooming. (24" x 18") Zn7.



Ceratostigma willmottianum Chinese Plumbago (Code: 3964)

Deep gentian-blue flowers with white eyes appear on this sub-shrub from late summer to fall. Blue-green leaves turn vivid crimson in fall, creating a striking contrast. (24-30" x 30-36") Zn7.





Cornus alba 'Elegantissima'

Tatarian Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6474)

Reddish-purple winter stems and white-margined green leaves make this plant perfect for year-round interest in the garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6-9' x 4-6') Zn4.



Cornus sericea 'Cardinal' Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 4906)

The vibrant stem color changes from coral in fall to a deep cherry-red in winter. It is truly an outstanding and choice cultivar for the winter landscape. (8-10' x 6') Zn4.













Cortaderia selloana 'Icalma'

Blue Pampas Grass (Code: 5576)

This wonderful garden-sized pampas grass grows only 3-4' tall and blooms in late summer above blue-green foliage. The feathery white plumes make great fresh or dried cut flowers. (3-4' x 3-4') Zn7.

















Cotinus coggygria 'Golden Spirit'

Epimedium x youngianum 'Niveum'

Smoke Tree (Code: 2207)

This large shrub has brilliant gold leaves when grown in full sun. Unusual lavender-pink flowers bloom in late spring and look like puffs of smoke by summer. In fall, the foliage turns vivid colors of glowing coral, orange & red. (6-10' x 6-8') Zn5. PP13082 Propagation Prohibited.




Cyclamen hederifolium

Hardy Cyclamen (Code: 7580)

Delightful pink flowers with reflexed petals appear in fall. The low-growing, green leaves have silver markings in winter. In late spring and summer the plant goes dormant, but reappears in fall. Do not water in summer and plant so the corms are only 1/2" below the soil surface. (2-4" x 12-15") Zn5.





Euphorbia griffithii 'Fire Charm'

Spurge (Code: 4100)

Bright red-orange bracts top red stems in spring. Green and burnt-orange summer leaves turn to vivid orange and red for an extended fall show of color. (2' x 3') Zn5.







Euphorbia x martinii

Martin's Spurge (Code: 5383)

Bishop's Hat (Code: 6671)






Chartreuse bracts with red pistils appear from May to

Euphorbia x martinii 'Red Martin'

Spurge (Code: 3310)



This sport of Euphorbia x martinii has a deeper burgundy-red cast to stems and leaves. Chartreuse flower-like bracts have red centers. A pleasing, rounded growth habit makes this form a great addition to any garden. (18-24" x 24-30") Zn6.







Euphorbia x martinii 'Rudolph'

Spurge (Code: 4203)

Vivid red bracts bring to mind Rudolph's famous nose, making it a marvelous addition to the winter garden. Yellow-green flowers with red centers appear in spring. (24-30" x 24-30") Zn6. PP17257 Propagation Prohibited.

Beautiful dusty gray-green, aromatic leaves are boldly splashed with cream, pale yellow and magenta. Vivid

Geranium 'Brookside'

Meadow Cranesbill (Code: 6915)

Eye-catching blooms of rich sapphire-blue, with lighter centers, grace this stunning Cranesbill over a long season. It has a nice mounding habit, staying attractive all summer. One of the best blues! (12-18" x 36") Zn5. PPAF Propagation Prohibited





Geranium sanguineum x procurrens 'Dilys'

Bloody Cranesbill (Code: 4823)

Soft magenta-purple flowers first appear in June and blooms sporadically until frost. Forms a large sprawling plant with good fall color. Performs best in moist soil. (3-9" x 36") Zn4.







Geranium sylvaticum 'Amy Doncaster'

Geranium macrorrhizum 'Variegatum'

Bigroot Geranium (Code: 4329)

Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn4.

Wood Cranesbill (Code: 4824)

Very deep blue flowers with white eyes bloom in clusters above fresh green foliage. It forms an attractive, broad dump. (24-28" x 24") Zn4.



Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Biokovo'

Cranesbill, Hardy Geranium (Code: 2700)

Glossy, deep green leaves are topped by blush-pink flowers in late spring. This semi-evergreen groundcover is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 18") Zn4.











Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Cambridge Blue'

Cranesbill, Hardy Geranium (Code: 5949)

Single lavender-pink flowers top deep green, lobed leaves in late spring. This restrained and well-behaved cultivar makes a fantastic semi-evergreen groundcover when planted en masse. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 18") Zn4.



Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Karmina' Hardy Geranium (Code: 6343)

Masses of raspberry-pink flowers blanket this low and spreading, semi-evergreen variety in late spring. Great for creating a groundcover in either full sun or part shade! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 18")






















Hebe 'La Favourite'

Hebe (Code: 4597)

This lovely evergreen shrub has an upright habit with large rounded, dark green foliage. Clear purple flowers appear in summer and fall. (3' x 3') Zn8.





Hebe 'Purple Shamrock'

Hebe (Code: 4265)

Narrow variegated foliage is lime-green overlaid with purple on beautiful purple stems. The leaves flush with purple in winter. Short purple flower spikes accent the foliage in summer. (2' x 2') Zn8.





Hebe 'Silver Dollar'

Hebe (Code: 3752)

Small evergreen shrublet with blue-green foliage edged in creamy-white with a faint violet-pink margin. The pink coloring intensifies in cold weather. Pale mauve flowers appear in summer. (18" x 24") Zn7.





Helleborus foetidus Gold Bullion

Hellebore (Code: 4318)

This outstanding evergreen foliage plant has lemon-gold new growth that later changes to chartreuse, with red staining on the stems. The late winter flowers are greenish-yellow. Light shade prevents sunburned leaves in hot climates. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn5.





Helleborus niger 'HGC Josef Lemper'

Christmas Rose (Code: 7611)

This improved form of Helleborus niger was selected for its upright habit and longer flowering period. Large white flowers appear from October through February in mild climates. In cold climates, flowers appear in early spring. One of the Helleborus Gold Collection (HGC). Requires well-drained soils. (8-10" x 12-18") Zn3. PP15615






Helleborus x hybridus 'Mardi Gras Pink'

Lenten Rose (Code: 3539)

Exquisite nodding pink flowers shine above large, leathery, evergreen leaves. Provides color and substance to the winter garden. From Charles Price. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. 2005 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. (18-24" x 24-30") Zn4.





Lenten Rose (Code: 3591)

Exquisite nodding white flowers shine above large leathery, evergreen leaves. Blooms appear in late winter to early spring. From Charles Price. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. 2005 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. (18-24" x 24-30") Zn4.





Hebe 'Prince'

Hebe (Code: 4197)

Purple-hued new foliage ages to dark green, forming an upright evergreen shrub. Royal purple flower spikes appear late spring to early summer and again in fall. (4' x 2') Zn8.





Hebe 'Red Edge'

Hebe (Code: 6903)

Pretty lilac-to-white flowers cover this small evergreen shrub from midsummer on. Tiny blue-green leaves are edged with rosy-red borders that deepen in color during winter. One of the hardiest Hebes, it makes a wonderful container accent. (18" x 24") Zn7.



Hebe x 'Champion'

Hebe (Code: 7042)

Bred from H. 'Autumn Glory', this cultivar features improved hardiness and disease resistance! Violet-blue flowers bloom in summer and in fall. Small, glossy dark evergreen foliage appears on purple stems. (15-20" x 16-24") Zn7. PP14866 Propagation Prohibited.





Helleborus niger 'HGC Jacob'

Christmas Rose (Code: 7612)

Shimmering, pure white, upright flowers appear from late fall through the winter in mild climates. In cold climates, flowers bloom in early spring. The dark evergreen foliage provides a dramatic contrast to the flowers and forms a compact mound. One of the Helleborus Gold Collection (HGC). Requires well-drained soils. (8-12" x 12-15") Zn3. PP 17799





Helleborus x ballardiae 'HGC Pink Frost'

Hellebore (Code: 7613)

The flowers first open pinkish-white, then age to burgundy-red. Flowers that are blush-white, pink and burgundy in color appear all at the same time. The silvery-green leaves grow vigorously on red stems. One of the Helleborus Gold Collection (HGC) from the Heuger breeding program in Germany. (12-15" x 18-24") Zn5.





Helleborus x hybridus 'Mardi Gras Slate'

Lenten Rose (Code: 3583)

Exquisite dark blue-gray flowers shine above large leathery, evergreen leaves. Deep burgundy new growth. From Charles Price. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. 2005 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. (18-24" x 24-30") Zn4.





Rupturewort (Code: 2843)

This evergreen, prostrate groundcover creates a thick mat that is excellent for banks and between pavers. The red-tinged winter foliage adds interest to any garden. (12" x 12") Zn4.







Herniaria glabra 'Sea Foam'

Striped Rupturewort (Code: 4242)

This ground-hugging mat of foliage slowly spreads to 12" wide, with tiny green leaves edged in creamy-white. It has better heat resistance than variegated thyme, but is similar in appearance (1" x 12") Zn4. PP15989 Propagation Prohibited.















Heuchera 'Blackberry Crisp'

Coral Bells (Code: 7654)

The ruffled purple foliage has distinctly crinkled and crisped margins. It has a tight mounding habit with leaves that change from deep burgundy in the spring to deep purple-black in summer. Short white flowers in spring add to this appealing gem. (8-15" x 12-16") Zn4. PPAF, PVR







The glowing caramel-colored, evergreen foliage is also heat resistant! A vigorous grower with creamy-white flowers in early summer. It provides dramatic foliage contrast and combines well with warm color schemes. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn5. PP16560 Propagation Prohibited.

Beard Tongue (Code: 3223)

Large fiery-red flowers on tall stems bloom from mid-summer to frost above semi-evergreen foliage. (24-30" x 24") Zn7.

















Physostegia virginiana 'Miss Manners'

Obedient Plant (Code: 4402)

Charming, pure white, snapdragon-like flowers appear late summer and last through frost. New and improved variety has a non-spreading habit. (18-24" x 24") Zn3. PP12637 Propagation Prohibited.















Salix purpurea 'Nana'

Blue Willow (Code: 3400)

Dainty gray-green leaves gracefully cover this petite willow. Rich purple stems are striking in winter. It makes a great border specimen or an attractive hedge. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5-6' x 5') Zn3.















Salvia nemorosa 'Blue Hill' ('Blauhugel')

Garden Sage (Code: 5745)

Lovely periwinkle-blue flowers top numerous spikes in summer. It has an excellent compact and bushy habit. The flowers are nice for cut flower arrangements.





















Schizachyrium scoparium 'Blaze'

Little Bluestem (Code: 6852)

Bluish-green, medium to finely-textured blades form a nice-sized clump. The leaves are ablaze with reddish-hues in fall and winter. (3' x 2') Zn4.





Schizostylis coccinea 'Coral'

Crimson Lily (Code: 2077)

This outstanding perennial displays cup-shaped, coral-pink blooms above vigorous, narrow, iris-like foliage. It adds that glowing detail to any garden. (2' x 2') Zn7.





Sedum 'Autumn Delight'

Stonecrop (Code: 4862)

Succulent leaves and stems are lime-hued with dark green edges. Flowers are a nice shade of pink and turn bronze in fall. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn4. PP18398 Propagation Prohibited.





Sedum 'Postman's Pride'

Stonecrop (Code: 3826)

Small rounded, dark purple leaves have blue undertones. Tiny purple summer buds burst into blooms of rich pinkish-red, maturing to burgundy in cool fall weather. (18-24" x 24") Zn3. PP16831 Propagation Prohibited.





Tiny evergreen foliage takes on orange hues in fall and winter and then turns green again in spring and summer. White flowers appear in July. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.





Sedum cyaneum

Stonecrop (Code: 3471)


Showy rose-hued flowers adorn strikingly-beautiful, succulent blue leaves in summer. A lovely, low-growing addition to any garden. It is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3" x 16") Zn6.



Stonecrop (Code: 4431)

Sedum hybridum 'Immergrunchen'

A vigorous, semi-evergreen, green leaf form of Sedum with yellow flowers in July and again in September. Foliage turns amber in winter. (1-3" x 12-24") Zn3.





Schizachyrium scoparium 'The Blues'

Little Bluestem (Code: 6192)

Finely-textured, silver-blue grass is topped with narrow willowy plumes in late summer. It has fantastic reddishburgundy fall color. A native cultivar from the prairies, it tolerates heat and humidity. (12" x 12") Zn4.





Schizostylis coccinea 'Red'

Crimson Lily (Code: 2080)

This gorgeous perennial produces star-shaped, vibrant red flowers above narrow, iris-like foliage. (2' x 2') Zn7.





Sedum 'Matrona'

Stonecrop (Code: 6248)

Large flower heads of soft pink top this succulent awardwinner in summer. Gray-green leaves edged in rosy-pink mimic the tints of the flowers. Absolutely gorgeous! (24" x 18") Zn3.





Sedum album 'Coral Carpet'

White Flowering Stonecrop (Code: 3467)

Succulent foliage is red in cooler temperatures, turning green in summer. Lovely white flowers appear in summer. Use in the rock garden or as an evergreen groundcover. (3" x 12") Zn4.





Sedum album var. micranthum 'Red Ice'

Stonecrop (Code: 4443)

Named for the deep red color of the tiny evergreen foliage in fall and winter. The foliage turns blue-green again in spring and summer. White flowers appear in July. (1-2" x 6-12") Zn3.





Sedum ewersii

Stonecrop (Code: 3474)

Pretty gray leaves with red margins are topped by pink flowers in late summer. An attractive accent for the sunny garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3" x 12") Zn6.





Sedum kamtschaticum 'Variegatum'

Kamschatka Stonecrop (Code: 3475)

This low-growing and deciduous form has glowing green and cream-variegated leaves that are occasionally tinged pink. Golden-yellow flowers emerge from red buds in summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (8" x 16") Zn4.







Sedum laxum

Stonecrop (Code: 3476)

Blue-green evergreen rosettes of 3/4" spatulate leaves are topped with light yellow flowers in late summer. An excellent NW native plant for the rockery, it should be planted more often! (4-6" x 12") Zn6.

















Sedum lydium

Stonecrop (Code: 3477)

Very low-growing, textural bright green mat takes on an attractive red tint in cool weather. Small white flowers appear in summer. (1" x 8") Zn3.











Sedum pluricaule 'Island of Sakhalin'

Stonecrop (Code: 5802)

This slender, sprawling perennial features rosy-pink flowers. Green succulent foliage becomes tinged with red in cool weather. (3" x 12") Zn3.





Sedum rupestre 'Sea Gold'

Stonecrop (Code: 4444)

From late spring to late summer, needle-like, evergreen foliage turns chartreuse-yellow. In fall, the foliage has red tips and then in winter turns primarily green. Bright gold flowers appear in July. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.













Sedum sieboldii 'October Daphne'

Stonecrop (Code: 3481)

Gray-green succulent leaves with red margins are topped by bright pink flowers in late summer. A stunning addition to the sunny garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6" x 12") Zn3.













Sedum spathulifolium 'Carnea'

Broadleaf Stonecrop (Code: 4895)

Compact evergreen NW native succulent with silvery rosettes edged with red to vermillion. The foliage turns deep crimson in winter. Yellow, star-like flowers appear in summer.�� (4" x 12") Zn3.

















Sedum spectabile 'Autumn Fire'

Stonecrop (Code: 3459)

Large, bright rosy-pink flower heads glow from late summer into fall. Dried flower heads provide delightful winter interest. A more compact form than S. 'Autumn Joy'. (12-18" x 12") Zn3.





Sedum spectabile 'Autumn Joy' ('Herbstfreude')

Stonecrop (Code: 3487)

This border classic has flat clusters of rosy-pink flowers on upright stems that turn coppery-red with the onset of cool weather. Leave seedheads in place for winter interest. A favorite with designers for low maintenance landscapes. (18-24" x 18") Zn4.





Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 4246)

This vigorously-spreading groundcover has bronze foliage that turns deep red in cool weather. Red flowers appear in late summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (1-3" x 18-30") Zn3.











Sedum spurium 'Elizabeth' ('Red Carpet')

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 3922)

This vigorous groundcover has starry deep pink-to-red flowers in late spring and summer. The foliage is red in spring, then turns green in summer, and finally turns deep red again in fall. (3-4" x 12-24") Zn3.



Sedum spurium 'Green Mantle' Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 4351)

Large, vibrant green, succulent leaves hug the ground to form a low maintenance carpet. Crisp white summer flowers attract butterflies. (1-3" x 12-18") Zn3.







Sedum spurium 'Purpurteppich' ('Purple Carpet')

Purple Carpet Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 3497)

Succulent bronze-red foliage forms a dense evergreen mat. Dark rose flowers in summer add color and drama to this popular groundcover selection. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4" x 12-18") Zn3.









Tiny evergreen succulent leaves turn scarlet-purple in winter. White flowers appear in summer. It is similar in appearance to Sedum album, but with tighter flowering and growth habit. (1-3" x 6-12") Zn3.







Sedum spurium 'Tricolor'

Two Row Stonecrop (Code: 3500)

This incredible succulent has foliage that's variegated pink, white, gray and green. Jewel pink flowers appear in late summer. Beautiful! A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3" x 12-18") Zn4.




















Sedum telephium 'Munstead Dark Red'

Stonecrop (Code: 5021)

Blooms midsummer to frost with multi-toned flowers, from raspberry-red hues to deep bronze. Dusky, blue-green leaves clothe upright maroon stems. (12-18" x 18") Zn3.













Solidago 'Crown of Rays'

Goldenrod (Code: 6828)

Impressive late bloomer with large sprays of tiny goldenyellow flowers. Beautiful and easy to grow, it makes a great cut flower! (24" x 18") Zn4.













Solidaster x luteus 'Lemore'

Golden Aster (Code: 5707)

Hundreds of tiny lemon-yellow flowers in dense panicles cover deep green lanceolate leaves. A lovely late bloomer for cut flowers. (36" x 12-24") Zn6.













Spiraea japonica 'White Gold'

Japanese Spirea (Code: 5493)

Pure white flowers adorn gold-to-chartreuse foliage on this compact deciduous shrub. An outstanding variety offering excellent contrast. (3' x 3') Zn4. PP13609 Propagation Prohibited.













Stokesia laevis 'Honeysong Purple'

Stoke's Aster (Code: 6020)

Excellent late season color! Large royal purple, cornflower-like blooms reach up to 4" across. Contrasting white stamens add to the show! (14" x 24") Zn5.





Tiarella 'Sugar and Spice'

Foam Flower (Code: 4142)

Glossy leaves with burgundy markings appear in summer and last through winter. Pink buds open to blush-pink flowers in spring, turning white and lasting for several weeks. (8-12" x 12") Zn4. PP16738, EU20614 Propagation Prohibited.













Solanum jasminoides 'Album'

White Potato Vine (Code: 6150)

Graceful and vigorous twining vine with billowing clusters of yellow-eyed, white "shooting star" flowers. Profuse and long blooming, it needs a protected spot. (15' x 4') Zn8.













Solidago canadensis 'Baby Gold'

Goldenrod (Code: 3567)

Golden sprays of flowers in large curving panicles make this an essential garden addition for late summer color. Easy to grow. (24" x 18") Zn4.













This marvelous dwarf shrub glows with spring foliage in shades of copper, coral and rose. Vivid pink flowers bloom periodically through summer. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2' x 2') Zn4. PP9363 Propagation Prohibited.



Thymus praecox 'Coccineus' Creeping Thyme (Code: 3612)

Dainty rose-red flowers completely cover this creeping thyme in summer. The evergreen foliage turns somewhat red in winter. (2-3" x 18") Zn4.















Waldsteinia fragarioides

Barren Strawberry (Code: 3714)

Sunny-yellow flowers are scattered over strawberry-like, evergreen foliage. A tough, mat-forming groundcover that tolerates a wide variety of conditions. (4" x 10") Zn3.
