



Abelia grandiflora 'Francis Mason'

Glossy Abelia (Code: 4070)

Bright golden-yellow-green foliage along red stems brings a sophisticated edge to the garden. Fragrant light pink flowers bloom late spring to fall. (5' x 5') Zn6.











Abutilon 'Souvenir de Bonn'

Flowering Maple (Code: 3206)

This charming selection of flowering maple has gorgeous green and cream-variegated leaves and apricot, bell-shaped flowers. It has a vigorous upright habit and can be easily trained as a patio tree. It can be overwintered indoors. (8-10' x 6-8') Zn9.









Agonis flexuosa 'Jervis Bay After Dark'

Peppermint Tree (Willow Myrtle) (Code: 4890)

Brilliant scarlet colored, willow-like leaves appear in spring and darken to deep burgundy. Small fragrant white flowers with burgundy centers appear in clusters from spring into early summer. (18' x 10-12') Zn9. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.









Amelanchier alnifolia 'Smokey'

Saskatoon, Serviceberry (Code: 7465)

This multi-stemmed deciduous shrub has an upright spreading habit and smooth silver-gray bark. The dark green oval leaves turn bright yellow in the fall. Stunning clusters of white flowers appear before the leaves emerge in early spring. Blue berries are abundant in late spring and are excellent eaten fresh or for making jams and jellies. Self-pollinating. (8-12' x 8-12') Zn3.











Azara microphylla

Boxleaf Azara, Chinchin (Code: 6477)

This small tree has dark, glossy evergreen foliage similar to boxwood. Tiny yellow flowers scented of white chocolate appear in late winter, followed by tiny blood-red fruit. It prefers well-drained soil. (15' x 6') Zn7.















Brugmansia x candida 'Miner's Claim'

Angel's Trumpet (Code: 3958)

Showy leaves are light green with creamy-white edges. Large creamy-pink, trumpet flowers hang from branches mid-to-late summer. From Keith Miner. (5-7' x 5-7') Zn9. PP15747 Propagation Prohibited.





Callicarpa dichotoma 'Early Amethyst'

Beautyberry (Code: 6119)

Clusters of stunning purple berries line bare branches of this standout deciduous shrub in fall. Berries appear earlier than other varieties. Pale lavender flowers appear in summer. (3-4' x 3-4')





Abelia grandiflora 'Kaleidoscope'

Abelia (Code: 6770)

The variegated leaves emerge vellow with light green centers. White tubular flowers bloom in fall. A stunning addition to any garden. Plant in full sun for best foliage color. (2-3' x 3-4') Zn6. PP16988 Propagation Prohibited.









Abutilon x suntense 'Violetta

Abutilon (Code: 6051)

Opalescent-violet flowers shimmer against fuzzy, gray-green leaves. Great, fast-growing accent for large containers or a sheltered location. (12' x 8') Zn8.









Saskatoon Serviceberry (Code: 8240)

This native North American deciduous shrub features an abundance of white flowers in spring, turning to small edible fruits that taste something like a blueberry. The leaves turn crimson-red in fall. Wonderful for attracting wildlife!�� (12-20' x 8-12') Zn3.















Azara integrifolia 'Variegata'

Azara (Code: 4682)

Evergreen leaves have white to pale pink edges. Yellow flowers appear in late winter or early spring, followed by black fruit. (14' x 10-12') Zn8.








Brugmansia 'Charles Grimaldi'

Angel's Trumpet (Code: 7550)

An exceptionally-vigorous cultivar named after the late landscape designer, Charles Grimaldi. Large, pendulous, orange-yellow flowers have strong recurved petals and are slightly fragrant. The bold tropical foliage is stunning! (8-10' x 6-8') Zn9.



Angel's Trumpet (Code: 4076)

The brightly variegated foliage has broad white margins and soft gray-green interiors. Fragrant peach-colored, trumpet-like flowers appear in summer. Vigorous and exotic! (5' x 5') Zn9. PP14817, EU16251 Propagation Prohibited.





Calluna vulgaris 'Lady in White'

Heather (Code: 7796)

This small evergreen shrub has bushy, upright branches covered with white flowers from August until January. Flowering branches make a wonderful addition to garlands and wreaths. Prefers cool summers and moist, but well-drained acidic soil. (8-18" x 8-14") Zn5. PP20530




















Caryopteris incana 'Sunshine Blue'™

Bluebeard (Code: 3262)

Bright golden foliage is accented by stunning deep blue flowers, late summer through fall. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3' x 3') Zn6. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.











Caryopteris x clandonensis 'Dark Knight'

Bluebeard (Code: 2349)

Compact and showy deciduous shrub with profuse clusters of the deepest blue flowers late in the season. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (2-3' x 2-3') Zn5.

Deep blue flowers bloom profusely on top of glossy green foliage

in late summer. This compact plant is a real butterfly magnet!

Ceanothus 'Centennial'

California Lilac (Code: 6670)

This low-growing, spreading, evergreen shrub has dark blue flowers in spring. A native cultivar of the Pacific coast, it is tolerant of summer heat and drought. (8-12" x 72") Zn7.













Ceanothus 'Dark Star'

California Lilac (Code: 6748)

A beautiful evergreen shrub with very nice, small and slightly cupped deep green leaves. Cobalt-blue flowers completely cover the foliage in late spring. (6' x 8-12') Zn7.











Ceanothus 'Italian Skies'

California Lilac (Code: 3743)

This stunning evergreen shrub has a dense mounding habit with small dark green leaves. Luminous deep blue flowers cover the shrub in spring. Award of Merit, RHS 1984. (6-8' x 6-10') Zn7.















Ceanothus 'Joyce Coulter'

California Lilac (Code: 6745)

Sky-blue fragrant flowers, held in 3-5" spike-like clusters, cover this evergreen shrub in spring. With a low-growing, spreading habit, it makes a good groundcover or low hedge. (30-36' x 4-8') Zn7.













Ceanothus 'Julia Phelps'

California Lilac (Code: 2116)

This large, mounding, evergreen shrub puts on a spectacular display of indigo-blue flowers in spring. This drought tolerant and deer resistant shrub has remained popular for over 50 years. (5-8' x 6-9') Zn7.















Ceanothus 'Victoria'

California Lilac (Code: 6712)

Masses of vivid dark blue flowers appear mid-spring. It grows into a lovely medium sized shrub with glossy evergreen leaves. Tough and trouble-free, it is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-6' x 6') Zn7.













Ceanothus griseus var. horizontalis 'Diamond Heights' California Lilac (Code: 6833)

Gorgeous lime-green foliage has dark pine-green detail down the spine of each leaf. Lovely bright blue flowers appear in spring. Great for mild coastal gardens, it prefers partial shade when grown in hot locations. (8-12" x 24-36") Zn8.













Ceanothus gloriosus (Pt Reyes)

Point Reyes Ceanothus (Code: 7050)

Lavender-blue flower clusters in spring top shiny evergreen foliage on a nice low-spreading shrub. It makes an excellent groundcover when planted en masse. (2' x 4') Zn7.
























Ceanothus impressus 'Vandenberg'

California Lilac (Code: 6907)

Very small crinkled, deep green leaves set this unusual compact selection apart. Bright blue flowers appear in late spring. An unusual and choice evergreen shrub for the garden. (3-5' x 4-8') Zn7.













Ceanothus Tuxedo

California Lilac (Code: 7043)

The dark bronze-purple foliage is a real breakthrough in breeding! This distinctive evergreen shrub has an open, upright habit that responds well to pruning. Lavender-blue flowers appear in abundance in late summer and fall. (6-8' x 6-8') Zn8. **PPAF**

















Ceratostigma griffithii

Plumbago (Code: 2372)

This small sub-shrub has clusters of brilliant blue flowers from late summer into fall when the leaves turn burgundy red. The blooms appear on new wood. Cut back in spring to encourage blooming. (24" x 18") Zn7.









Choisya arizonica 'Aztec Pearl'

Mexican Orange Blossom (Code: 6906)

Blush-hued buds open to fragrant white flowers in late spring. Glossy deep green leaves are finely cut. This is a knockout compact evergreen shrub! It prefers full sun in well-drained soil; protect from cold winds. (3-4' x 4') Zn7.











Cistus 'Blanche'

Rockrose (Code: 4706)

Fragrant, large white blossoms with large yellow centers bloom in late spring and early summer. Medium-sized evergreen shrub with bright green, wavy-edged leaves. Drought tolerant. (4-5' x 4-5') Zn7.













Cistus 'Silver Pink'

Rockrose (Code: 4192)

Lovely pale salmon-pink flowers cover this small, rather open bush in late spring and early summer. The evergreen leaves have grayish undersides. It tolerates poor soil, dry slopes and maritime conditions. (2' x 2') Zn8.













Cistus salviifolius 'Prostratus'

Prostrate Rockrose (Code: 7065)

White flowers with yellow centers cover sage-like evergreen leaves in spring. The low spreading habit makes it a great shrub for use as a groundcover. It tolerates poor soil, dry banks and maritime conditions. (10-18" x 72") Zn7.













Ceanothus thyrsiflorus

Blueblossom, California Lilac (Code: 6866)

Clusters of dark blue flowers in spring top this robust evergreen shrub with glossy leaves. Native to California and southern Oregon. (8-12' x 8-12') Zn7.









Ceanothus x pallidus 'Marie Simon'

California Lilac (Code: 3745)

Rose-pink flower buds open to 3-5" pink panicles, blooming for several weeks in summer. This deciduous, bushy shrub has showy, contrasting red stems. (5' x 5') Zn7.













Ceratostigma willmottianum Chinese Plumbago (Code: 3964)

Deep gentian-blue flowers with white eyes appear on this sub-shrub from late summer to fall. Blue-green leaves turn vivid crimson in fall, creating a striking contrast. (24-30" x 30-36") Zn7.









This striking foliage plant features brilliant goldenyellow leaves and citrus-scented white blossoms, late winter to early spring. Protect from cold winds. (4' x 4') Zn7.













Cistus 'Elma'

Rockrose (Code: 5618)

Very large, white single flowers top lustrous dark green foliage in early summer. A wonderful, drought-tolerant evergreen selection with an upright habit. (4-5' x 4-5') Zn7.











Cistus incanus 'Creticus'

Rock Rose (Code: 7063)

This evergreen shrub has wavy silver foliage highlighted by rose-pink flowers in early summer. Great for the rockery, it is an excellent droughttolerant selection. (36" x 30") Zn8.











Cistus x corbariensis

White Rockrose (Code: 5680)

Deep green foliage sets off red buds in spring, followed by pure white flowers. One of the hardiest Cistus cultivars, this evergreen shrub tolerates poor soil and maritime conditions. A 'Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (18-30" x 48") Zn7.





















Cistus x pulverulentus 'Sunset'

Rockrose (Code: 6804)

Large flowers of deep rose-pink top silvery-gray leaves from early to mid summer. This dense, low spreading evergreen shrub is quite drought tolerant. (2' x 3-5') Zn7.







Cistus x skanbergii

Pink Rockrose (Code: 7064)

This tough and graceful dwarf, evergreen shrub features soft pink flowers in late spring. Highly recommended, it tolerates poor soil, dry banks and maritime conditions. (2-3' x 3-4') Zn8.

Silverbush (Code: 2423)

Coprosma 'Middlemore' New

Mirror Plant (Code: 7702)

A versatile evergreen shrub with small glossy green leaves. Excellent in containers where a dark green color is desired. Likes full sun, will tolerate light frost and coastal conditions. (3' x 3')











Coprosma 'Pina Colada' New

Mirror Plant (Code: 7703)

Glossy, golden leaves turn to shades of orange when nights cool down. This tender evergreen shrub is fast-growing and deer-resistant and does best in fertile, well-drained soil. Pina Colada's shiny, colorful foliage will brighten any container. (3' x 3') Zn9.









Coprosma 'Tequila Sunrise' New

Mirror Plant (Code: 7704)

Brightly colored, jewel-like, glossy foliage emerges emerald green with a gold margin in spring, and gradually becomes marbled with brilliant orange and gold hues. In cool weather, the leaf color intensifies to brilliant orange and red jewel tones. Fantastic in containers! (3' x 3') Zn9. PP18392







Coprosma repens 'Evening Glow'

Mirror Plant (Code: 6643)

This very colorful upright-growing shrub has striking variegated foliage with irregular yellow patches. The glossy evergreen foliage turns bright orange-red in late summer-to-fall and remains so until new growth in spring. The flowers are inconspicuous. (4-5' x 3-4') Zn9.





Coprosma repens 'Pink Splendor'

Mirror Plant (Code: 6644)

This beautiful dense, mounding shrub has variegated leaves with green centers, surrounded by creamy peach-pink-to-yellow margins. The glossy evergreen leaves develop a rosy-pink glow in cooler temperatures. The flowers are inconspicuous. (6-8' x 4-5')









Cornus alba 'Elegantissima'

Tatarian Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6474)

Reddish-purple winter stems and white-margined green leaves make this plant perfect for year-round interest in the garden. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6-9' x 4-6') Zn4.















Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire'

Bloodtwig Dogwood, Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 6972)

Unbelievable color for the winter landscape with stems in flickering shades of yellow, orange and red. It makes an impressive mass planting. Useful in cut and dried flower arrangements. (5-10' x 5') Zn4.

















Cornus sericea 'Cardinal'

Redtwig Dogwood (Code: 4906)

The vibrant stem color changes from coral in fall to a deep cherry-red in winter. It is truly an outstanding and choice cultivar for the winter landscape. (8-10' x 6') Zn4.













Cornus sericea 'Hedgerow's Gold'

Redosier Dogwood (Code: 6858)

Bright golden-yellow and green-variegated leaves contrast vividly against deep red stems. Eye-catching every season of the year. This Northwest native cultivar is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4-10' x 5') Zn4.




















Cotinus coggygria 'Daydream' New

Smoke Tree (Code: 7466)

One of the best selections with green foliage because it's such a heavy bloomer. The pink flowers are very full and fluffy. Has a more compact habit than other varieties. (8-10' x 8-10') Zn5.









Cotinus coggygria 'Golden Spirit'

Smoke Tree (Code: 2207)

This large shrub has brilliant gold leaves when grown in full sun. Unusual lavender-pink flowers bloom in late spring and look like puffs of smoke by summer. In fall, the foliage turns vivid colors of glowing coral, orange & red. (6-10' x 6-8') Zn5. PP13082 Propagation Prohibited.





Fuchsia 'Alice Hoffman'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 4179)

Rose-pink sepals and white corollas bloom most of the season. It has an upright form with bronzy-green foliage. (24" x 24") Zn8.

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5348)

Fatshedera lizei 'Aureo Maculata'


Fuchsia 'Chillerton Beauty'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5384)

Lovely 2" pendulous flowers with pink sepals and deep violet corollas, show from early summer until hard frost. The flowers are very attractive to hummingbirds and the gray-green foliage adds further interest. (3' x 3') Zn8.

Fuchsia 'Erecta'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 2663)

Charming pale pink and white flowers sit upright, like tiny cups & saucers, on the branches of this small herbaceous shrub. Long-blooming and easy to grow, it's a hummingbird favorite! (3' x 2') Zn7.







Fuchsia 'Galadriel'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5614)

This vigorous upright shrub has blossoms that have white sepals covering a single red corolla. This magical bicolor floral display starts in late spring and continues to frost. (3-4' x 2-3') Zn8.







Fuchsia 'Little Giant'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5347)

Deep red and magenta flowers smother this small, upright shrub from early summer to hard frost. This plant beckons hummingbirds from far and wide. (3' x 2') Zn7.









Fuchsia 'Neon Tricolor'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5866)

Unique tubular blossoms are hot pink at the base, with white sepals that have lime green tips, and a bright orange corolla! The blooms appear summer to frost. A hummingbird magnet! (4-5' x 3-4') Zn7.







Fuchsia 'Prince of Orange'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 4183)

Flowers have light salmon-hued sepals and orange-red corollas. With upright-growth, it is a hummingbird magnet! (24" x 24") Zn8.






Fuchsia 'Queen Esther'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5122)

Fuchsia 'White Knight's Pearl'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 2230)

This wonderful upright free-flowering bush has small, but numerous pendulous flowers with carmine sepals and mauvepurple corollas. (2' x 2') Zn7.

This hardy, upright Fuchsia has blossoms that are a light

pearly-pink with darker pink corollas, and blooms early summer





Fuchsia 'Wessex Belle'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 4184)

Light green and yellow-variegated leaves have large pendulous flowers with pink sepals and white corollas. Showy even when not in flower! (18-30" x 24-30") Zn8.









Fuchsia magellanica 'Aurea'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 2673)

Bright golden leaves are decorated with small, pendulous flowers of red sepals and purple corollas. Blooms early summer until hard frost and attracts droves of hummingbirds. (4-5' x 3-4') Zn7.











Fuchsia magellanica 'Pat's Dream'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 2668)

This shrubby, hardy cultivar has bright pink sepals and purple corollas that appear early summer to frost. (3' x 3-4') Zn7.





Fuchsia magellanica 'Riccartonii'

F.'Riccartonii' is an old-fashioned, very hardy Fuchsia. Hummingbirds swarm to dark red and purple flowers from early summer until a hard frost. This is the hardiest cultivar of the magellanica species. (36" x 36-48") Zn6.







Fuchsia magellanica macrostema

Tricolored Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 2664)

This hardy cultivar has tricolored leaves of salmon, sea-green and cream. Adorned in small flowers with red sepals and purple corollas, this great hummingbird magnet blooms summer to frost. (24-26" x 24") Zn7.





Fuchsia magellanica var. molinae

Maiden's Blush Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 6169)

Perennial shrub with fresh green leaves and hundreds of small, pale lavender, pendulous flowers that bloom from July to September. It sprouts from the roots after a cold winter. (4-5' x 4')









Fuchsia magellanica var. molinae 'Sharpitor Aurea'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 6262)

Pendulous soft pink bells grace green leaves edged in creamyyellow. This eye-catching cultivar has an exceptionally graceful growth habit, semi-prostrate when young but more upright with age. (24" x 18") Zn7.





Fuchsia microphylla 'Variegated Lottie Hobby'

Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 5560)

Tiny brightly-variegated green and white leaves and small narrow crimson flowers make this dwarf Fuchsia a knockout! Provide a protected site where this diminutive beauty won't be overlooked. (12-24" x 18") Zn8.









Fuchsia regia

Vining Ladies' Eardrops (Code: 6884)

This tropical-looking plant, has shiny green leaves with bronze overtones. It can be grown as a vine on a trellis or as a lax upright shrub. The flowers have deep red sepals with a purple corolla and bloom early summer to frost. (10' x 3-6') Zn7.



Gaultheria shallon Salal (Code: 6347)

Pacific Northwest evergreen groundcover or low spreading shrub that tolerates dry shade to full sun. Urn-shaped white flowers appear in spring and produce dark purple edible berries. Salal leaves are often used by florists. (18-30" x 24-36") Zn6.





Halimiocistus sahucii Sunrose (Code: 6875)

Pure sparkling white flowers with yellow centers enhance this low-growing shrub. It needs full sun and good drainage. Drought tolerant once established. (24" x 36") Zn7.

Large white flowers have yellow eyes and a crimson spot at the base of each petal on this beautiful compact evergreen shrub. (2' x 3-4') Zn8.







Halimium lasianthum

Sunrose (Code: 6882)

Sunny yellow flowers blotched deep brown at the base of each petal enhance the dusty gray foliage of this wiry sub-shrub. Needs good drainage. (3' x 2-3') Zn7.





Hebe 'Amy'

Hebe (Code: 2754)

Rich violet flowers top glossy, evergreen leaves that turn burgundy in winter - a stunning color combination! It maintains a nice, rounded form that is excellent for containers. (3' x 3') Zn8.





Hebe 'Baby Marie'

Hebe (Code: 3724)

Tiny bright green leaf clusters on multiple branchlets form a nice rounded shrub that grows to about one foot tall. Blush lilac flowers appear late spring to early summer. (12" x 12") Zn8.





Hebe 'Blue Eyes'

Hebe (Code: 4749)

Tiny emerald leaves densely line black-purple stems on this fabulous compact Hebe. Clusters of tiny, icy-blue flowers deepen to violet. Excellent as an evergreen groundcover or rockery accent. (6-8" x 18-24") Zn7.









Hebe 'Caledonia'

Hebe (Code: 2768)

A somewhat open, evergreen shrub to 2' tall, with burgundy branches and reddish-purple new leaves. Violet flower spikes appear from July to August and often reblooms. (18" x 18") Zn7.





Hebe 'Emerald Gem'

Hebe (Code: 4615)
